The sailors decided they should draw straws to find out who was the cause of the storm. So they drew straws and guess who got the short straw? Jonah!

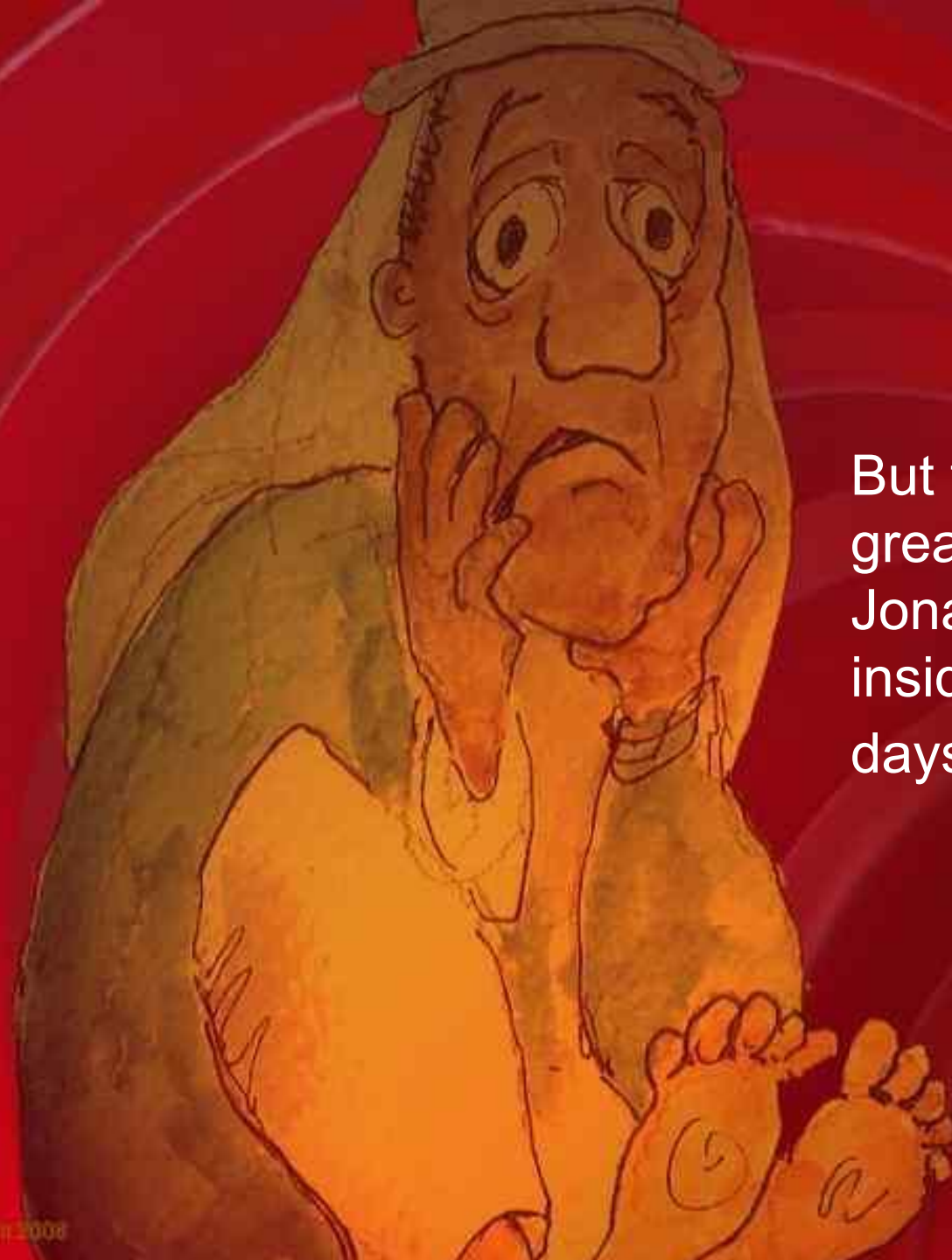
The sailors asked Jonah, “What should we do to you to stop this storm?”

spit Jonah out onto the beach.

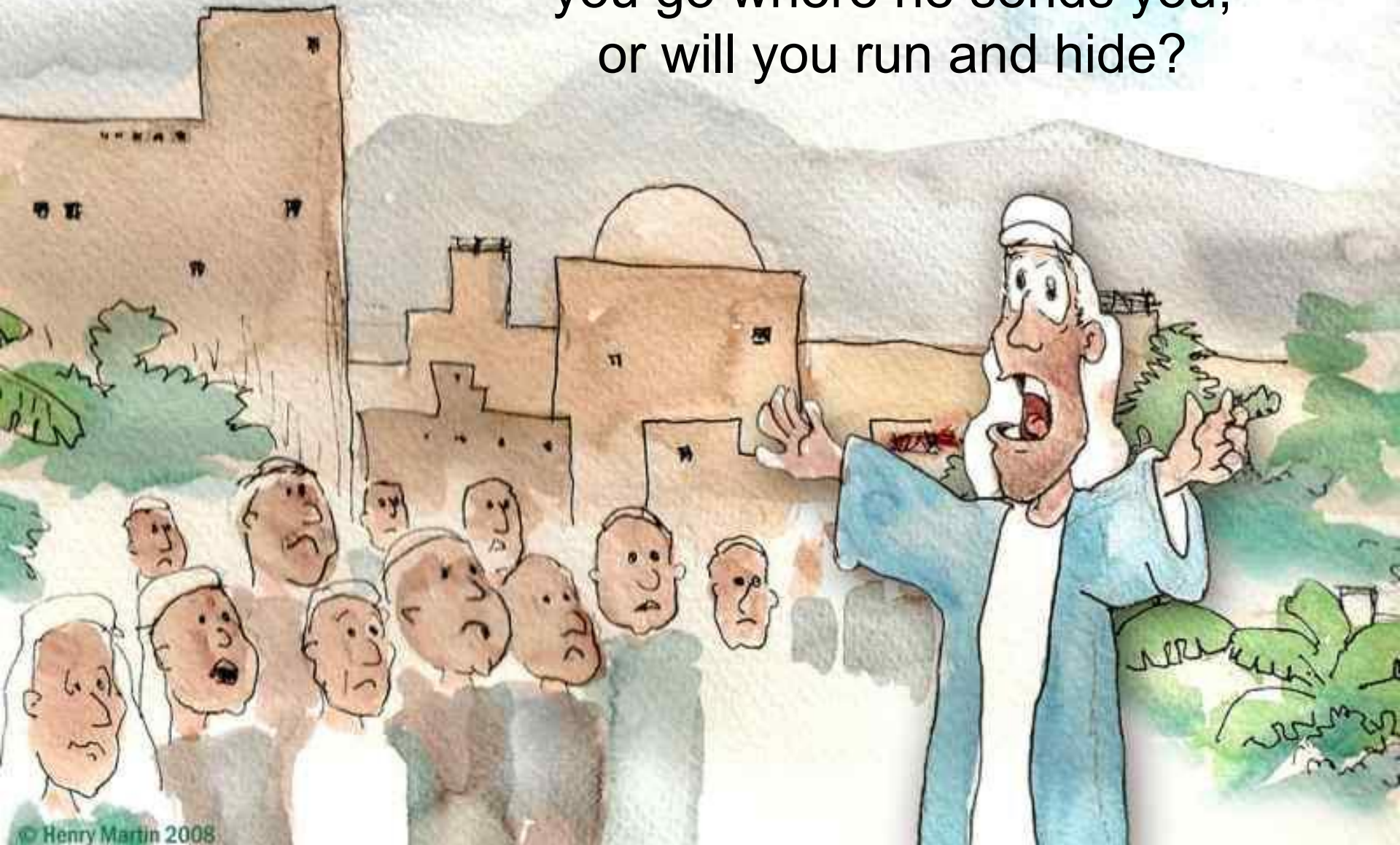
SPLAT!
