Word or Phrase	Meaning	
unless	'except if' or 'if not'	
in case	'because s/he/it/etc might'	
as/so long as	'if' or 'only if'	
provided (that)	'if' or 'only if'

(=except if I get delayed/if I don't get delayed)			
Let's take our willies in case it's muddy (=			
because it might be muddy)			
As long as I'm happy, my parents don't care			
what job I do.
