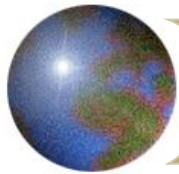
Map of England

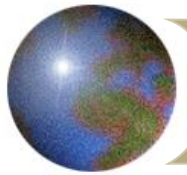

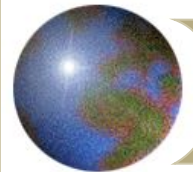
- ❖ Famous authors - Beatrix Potter, Roald Dahl and J.K. Rowling

- ❖ The Beatles - famous singing group who became popular in the 1960s





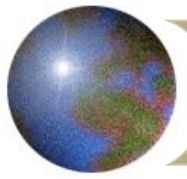
What English Kids Do

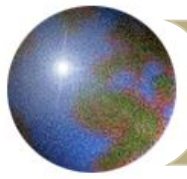

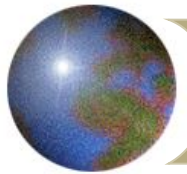

- England has a royal family and some of the most interesting customs in England center around the royal events.

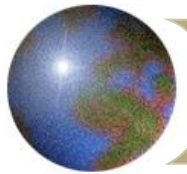

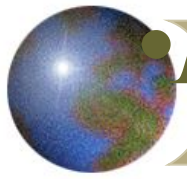

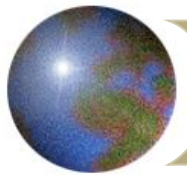
