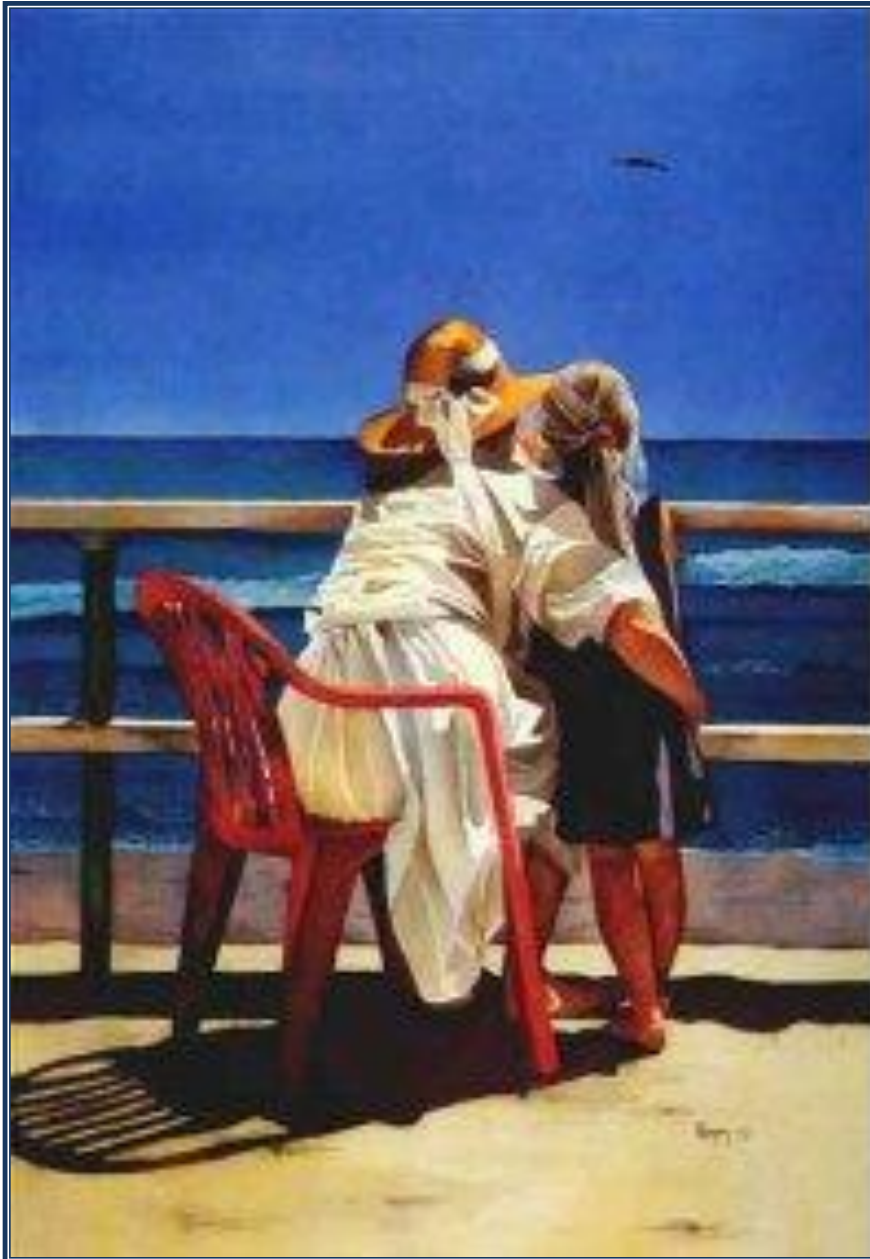

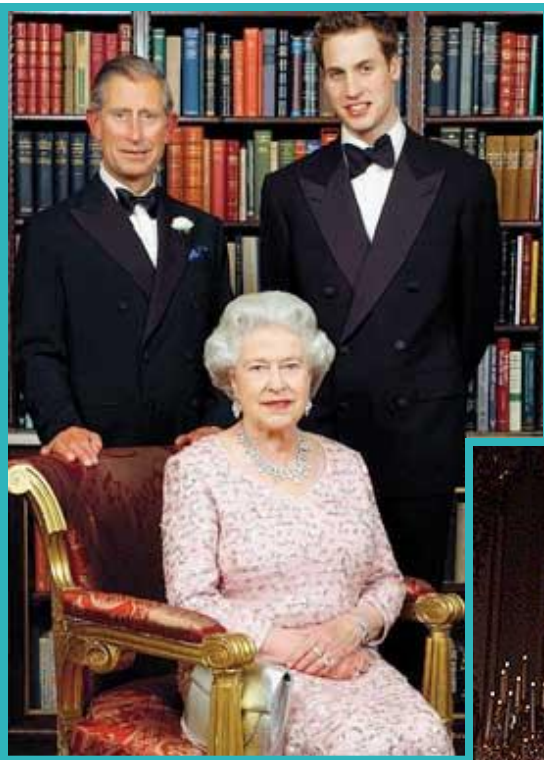


The British Royal family is headed by Queen Elizabeth.

Mother Tereza

The Catholic nun, the foundress of the Award of mercy, was engaged in service to the poor and the sick.

In 1979 mother Tereza has been awarded the World Nobel Prize.



She was considered to be sacred during her lifetime.

At the age of twelve, she felt strongly the call of God.

She knew she had to be a missionary to spread the love of Christ.

On October 7, 1950, Mother Teresa received permission from the Holy See to start her own order, "The Missionaries of Charity", whose primary task was to love and care for those persons nobody was prepared to look after.

In 1965 the Society became an International Religious Family by a decree of Pope Pius VI. They provide effective help to the poorest of the poor in a number of countries in Asia, Africa, and Latin America, and they undertake relief work in the wake of natural catastrophes such as floods, epidemics, and famine, and for refugees. They take care of the shut-ins, alcoholics, homeless, and AIDS sufferers.





Mother Teresa's work has been recognised and acclaimed throughout the world and she has received a number of awards and distinctions, including the Pope John XXIII Peace Prize (1971) and the Nehru Prize for her promotion of international peace and understanding (1972).

She also received the Balzan Prize (1979) and the Templeton and Magsaysay awards.
