and endless seashores.



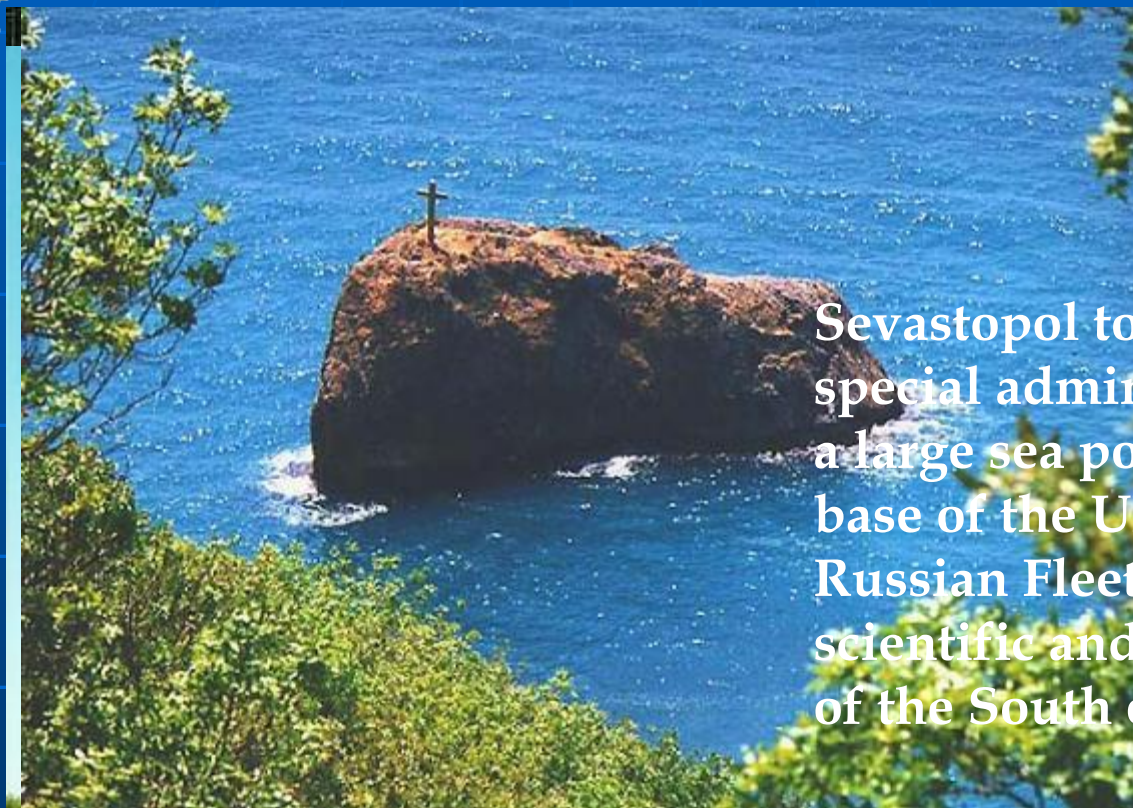
# The Swallow's Nest

The Swallow's Nest is the "Swallow's Nest" emblem of the property. It was built in 1912 by the architect Antoni Gaudí, a member of the Catalan Modernisme movement. The building is a masterpiece of organic architecture, designed to blend with the natural environment. It is built on a cliffside overlooking the sea, and its design is inspired by the shape of a swallow's nest. The building is made of limestone and is known for its intricate details and its unique location. The design is so fragile that it survived a heavy earthquake in 1927.
