New York

New York City is the largest metropolitan center in the USA. It is famous for the Statue of Liberty, Empire State building, United Nations, museums, Broadway theaters, Times Square etc.





New York City is located on the eastern coast of the United States about 1000 miles north of Florida and 200 miles South of Boston. It is situated at the mouth of the Hudson River, and is divided into 5 districts called boroughs. The “Big Apple” is the largest city in the USA with over 7 million residents.

Statue of Liberty



The Statue of Liberty stands on a small island in the middle of the New York City harbor. It was a gift of international friendship from the people of France in commemoration of the USA centennial anniversary in 1876. The 151-foot (46-meters) tall monument stands atop a granite pedestal above the walls of a star shaped abutment.



Manhattan and Central Park

MANHATTAN BOROUGH, THE BUSINESS AND COMMERCIAL CENTER OF NEW YORK CITY, IS SITUATED ON A LARGE ISLAND IN THE MIDDLE OF THE HUDSON RIVER.

New York City and especially Manhattan Island are renowned for their concentration of high-rise buildings, commonly known as “the skyscrapers”. Today, there are more than 5,000 high-rise buildings.

Empire State Building



THE EMPIRE STATE BUILDING AT 102 FLOORS WAS ONCE THE WORLD'S HIGHEST SKYSCRAPER. THIS CLASSIC ART DECO STRUCTURE LOCATED ON FIFTH AVENUE AT 34TH STREET, WAS BUILT IN 1931 AND IS 1454 FEET (443 METERS) TALL. THE OBSERVATORY IS ON THE 102ND FLOOR. ADMISSION COSTS \$18.00.

Rockefeller Center



The complex of Buildings known as Rockefeller Center is located on Fifth Avenue at 50th Street. It contains the National Broadcast Systems television studios, a large entertainment venue known as Radio City Music Hall, an outdoor ice skating rink, and a collection of shops and restaurants. At the top of 30 Rockefeller Plaza, 70 floors above Manhattan, is an observation deck known as “the Top of the Rock”.
