



The cost of studies in the university is rather high. Students have to pay for using libraries and laboratories, as for taking exams.




The university is a collection of <u>35</u> colleges: *two* for women only, the *rest* are for man and


















Cambridge is the second oldest university in Britain. It was opened in 1284.
