= become healthy and normal again

hurry up

=do things faster



If you don't hurry up, we'll miss the train.

lock up

= put in a room and lock the door



We locked up the dog in the car
/ for the night.

The guard locked the criminal up in the cell.

to seal up packages of food

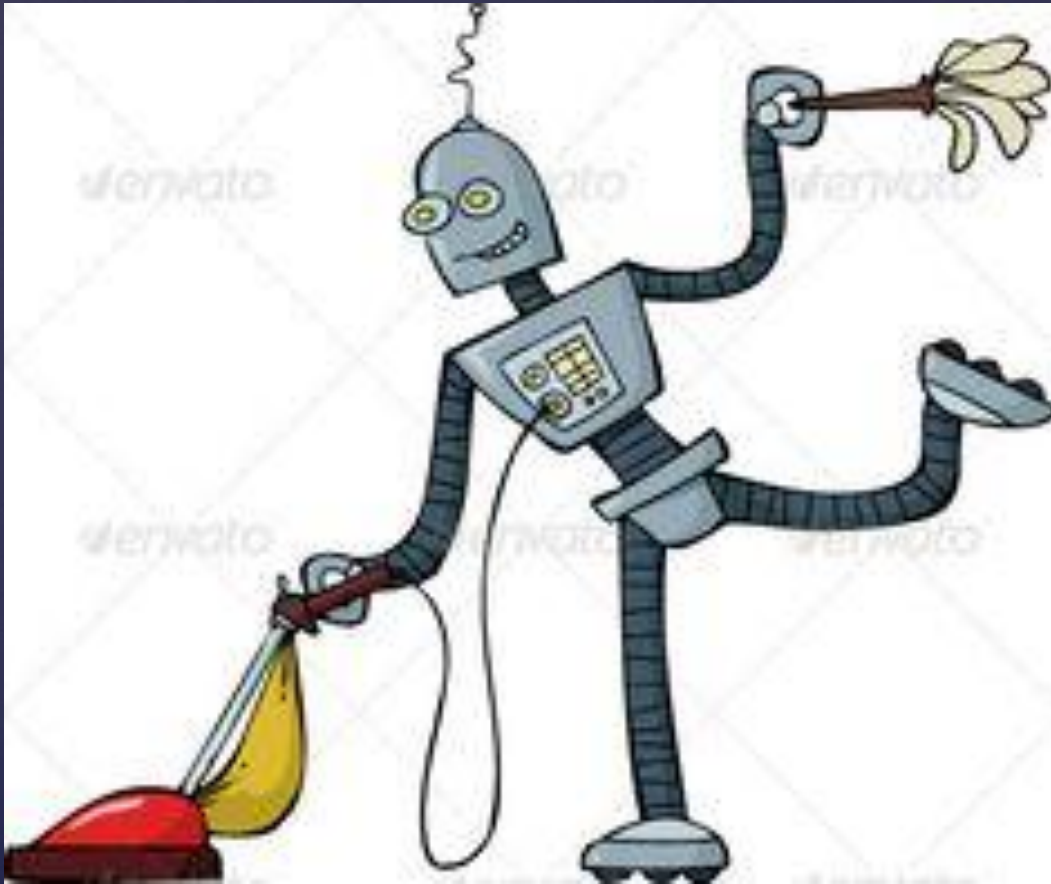
