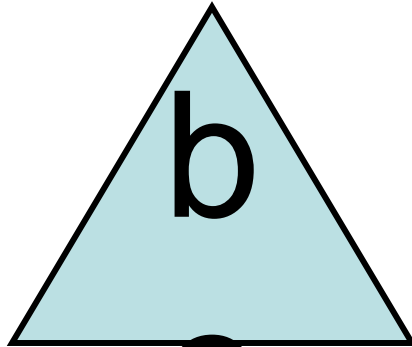
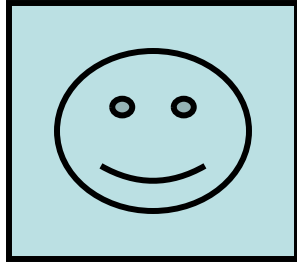
Present Simple
