Official and non-official symbols of the U.S.



The bald eagle

(lat. *Haliaeetus leucocephalus*) is one of the main symbols of the United States. It is a large bird of hawk family that lives in North America.



Flower symbol for the U.S. - rose.

- The law, which declares a symbol of the United States rose says:

Americans have always loved the flowers with which God decorates our land. More than any other flower, we are holding the rose as a symbol of life, love, devotion, beauty and eternity. To say about the love between a man and a woman, love for humanity and God, love of country, Americans who speak the language of the heart, say it with a rose.



- We ... always cultivated roses in our gardens. Our first president, George Washington, grew roses, and one he even named after his mother. White House prouds of the most beautiful rose garden. We grow roses in all our fifty states. We find roses throughout our art, music and literature. We decorate our celebrations and parades with roses ...
- The American people have a special place in their hearts for roses. Let us continue to cherish them, in honor of the love and devotion they represent, and give them to those whom we love as God has given them to us.
- Symbolically, the fortieth President of the United States, Ronald Reagan signed a resolution enshrining rose for an official floral emblem of the United States in the White House Rose Garden.

Flowers roses - the symbol of the State of New York, and the wild rose - a symbol of Iowa and North Dakota.



Christmas tree symbol of the United States

- April 28, 1926 thirtieth U.S. President Calvin Coolidge named the official Christmas tree of the U.S. General Grant sequoia.



- General Grant sequoia age - about 1650 years.
Dimensions of tree:
- Tree height - 81.5 m
- The circumference of the tree (girth) at ground level - 32.8 meters
- The circumference of the tree (girth) at a height of 1.4 meters - 8.8 meters
- The circumference of the tree (girth) at a height of 18 meters - 5 meters
- The circumference of the tree (girth) at a height of 55 meters - 3.9 meters
- Estimated volume of tree trunk - 1320 m³
- Sequoia General Grant was named in 1867 in honor of Ulysses S. Grant, U.S. Army General and the eighteenth President of the United States.

- **"In God we trust"** was adopted as the official motto of the United States in 1956 as an alternative or replacement to the unofficial motto of *E pluribus unum*, adopted when the Great Seal of the United States was created and adopted in 1782.

- The phrase appears to have originated in "The Star-Spangled Banner", written during the War of 1812. The fourth stanza includes the phrase, "And this be our motto: 'In God is our Trust.'" According to Ted Alexander, Chief Historian at Antietam National Battlefield, the contracted "In God We Trust" was first used by the 125th Pennsylvania Infantry as a battle cry on September 17, 1862, during the Battle of Antietam of the American Civil War.
