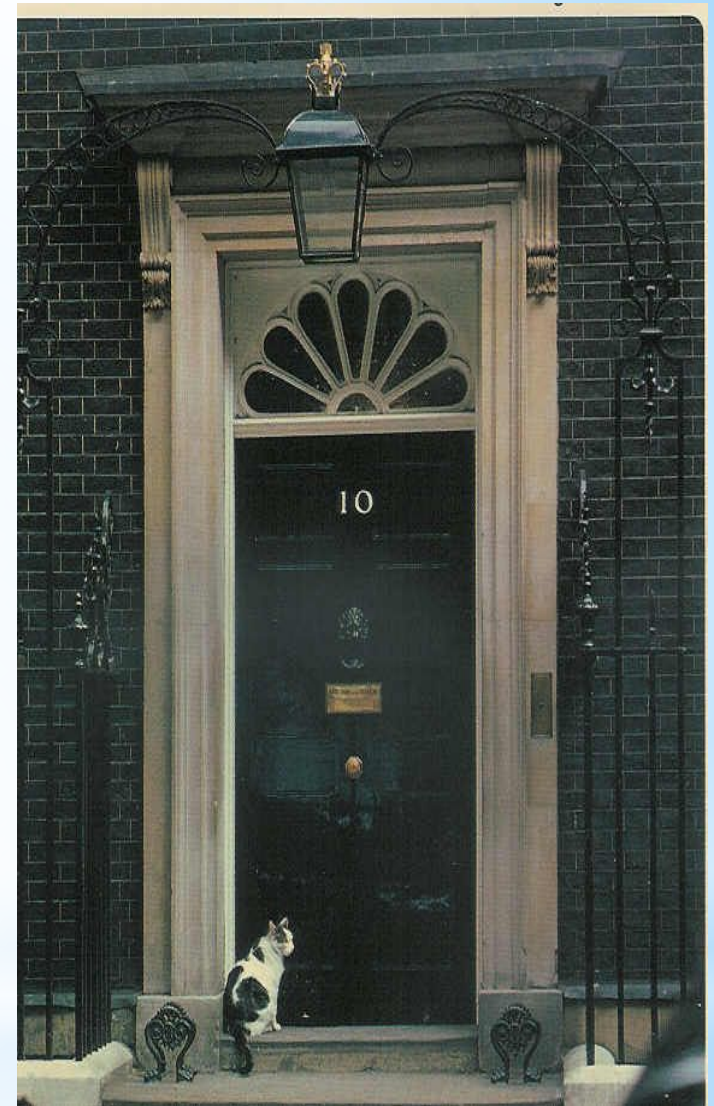




# \* Houses of Parliament

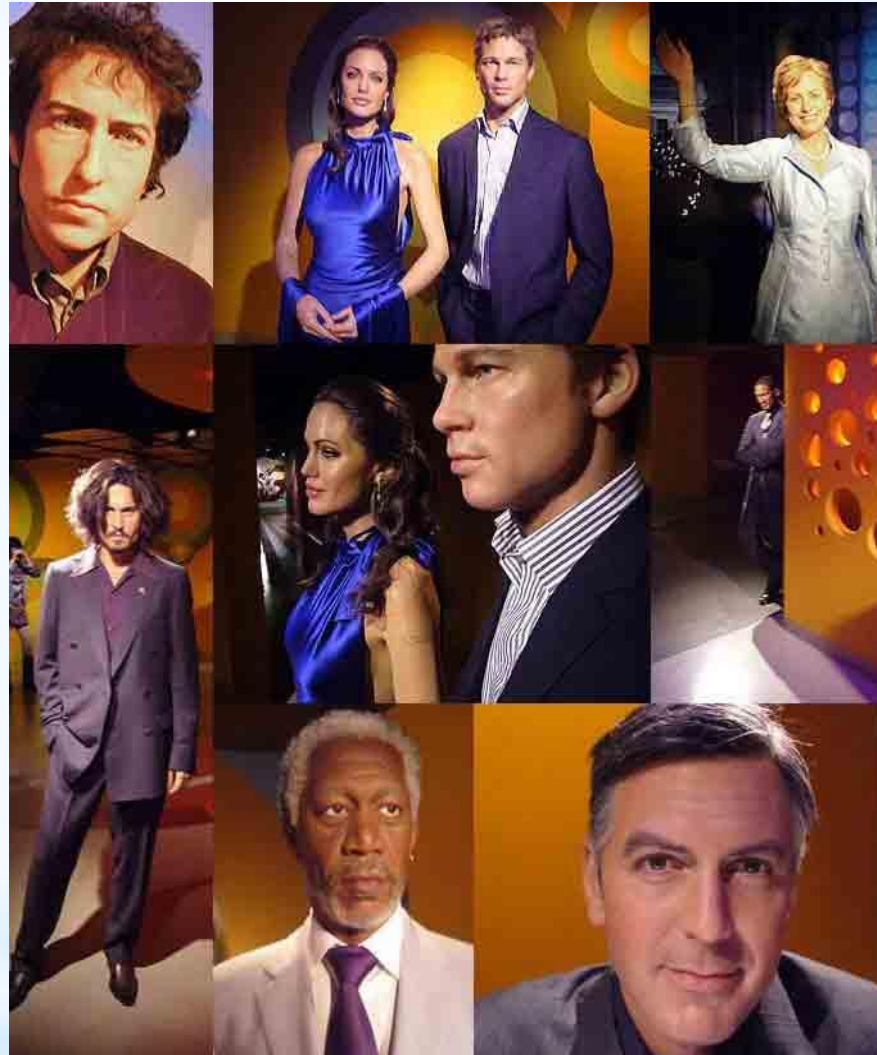
- \* Is a wax museum in London with branches in a number of major cities . It was founded by sculptor Marie Tussaud .



\* Marie Tussaud , was born Anna Marie Grosholtz(1761-1850)in Strasbourg , France.



**Tussaud created her first wax figure, of Voltaire, in 1777. Other famous people she created at that time include Jean-Jacques Rousseau and Benjamin Franklin.**



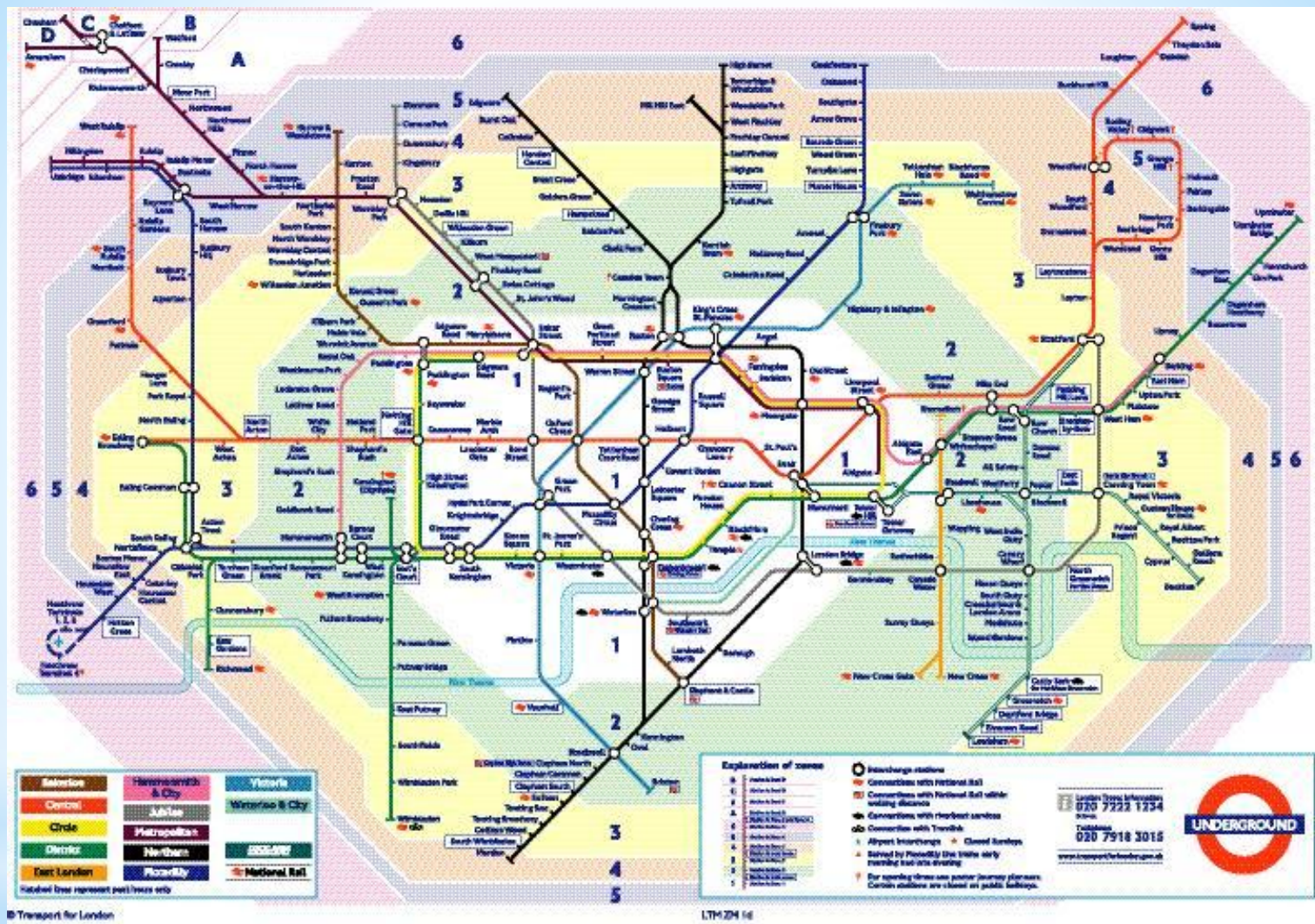
\* By 1835 Marie had settled down in Baker Street ,London and opened a museum . One of the main attractions of her museum was the Chamber of Horrors.



\* The London Underground , Underground or Tube is a rapid transit system serving a large part of Greater London and neighbouring areas of Essex ,Hertfordshire and Buckinghamshire in the UK.

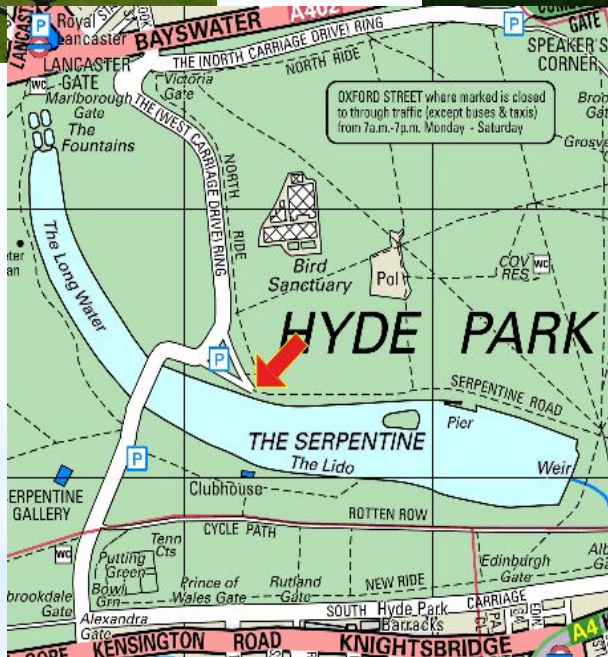


- \* The first section opened in 1863, and was the first underground railway system in the world, and, starting in 1890, it was also the first to operate electric trains. The Underground has 270 stations and about 400km of track, making it the longest metro system in the world by route length. It also has one of the highest number of stations.



\* In 2007, more than one billion passenger journeys were recorded, making it the third busiest metro system in Europe after Paris and Moscow.

- \* **London Zoo is the oldest scientific zoo in the world. It was opened in London on 27 April 1828, and was originally intended to be used as a collection for scientific study . It was eventually opened to the public in 1847.**



\* Today it houses a collection of 755 species of animals , with 16,802 individuals , making it one of the largest collections in the United Kingdom.
