

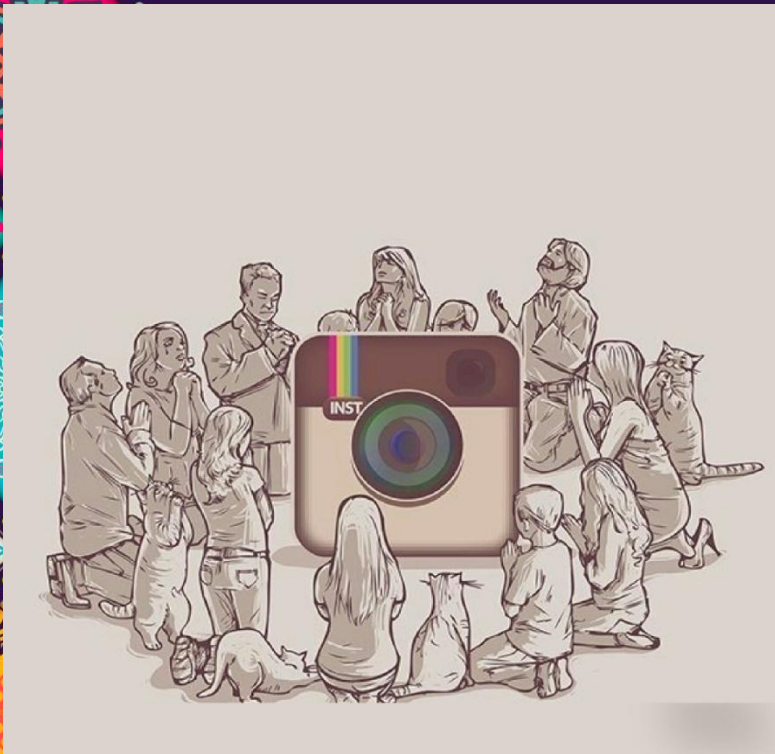


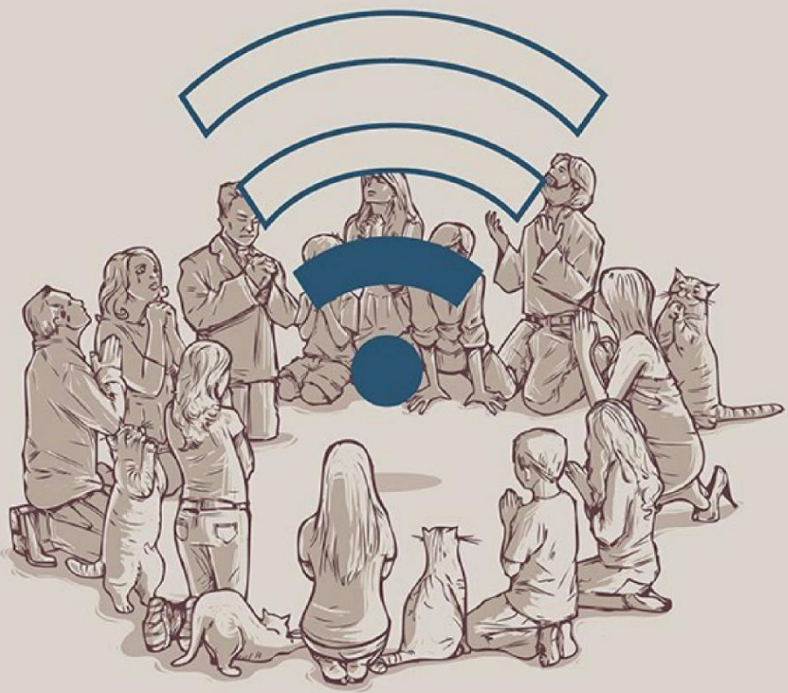
**Profile about


• In my free time, I like to draw and read books. My favorite artist is Sam Larson, of California, creates small illustrations of a coin size
