7. The top of the tree: What is there on the top of the Christmas tree?



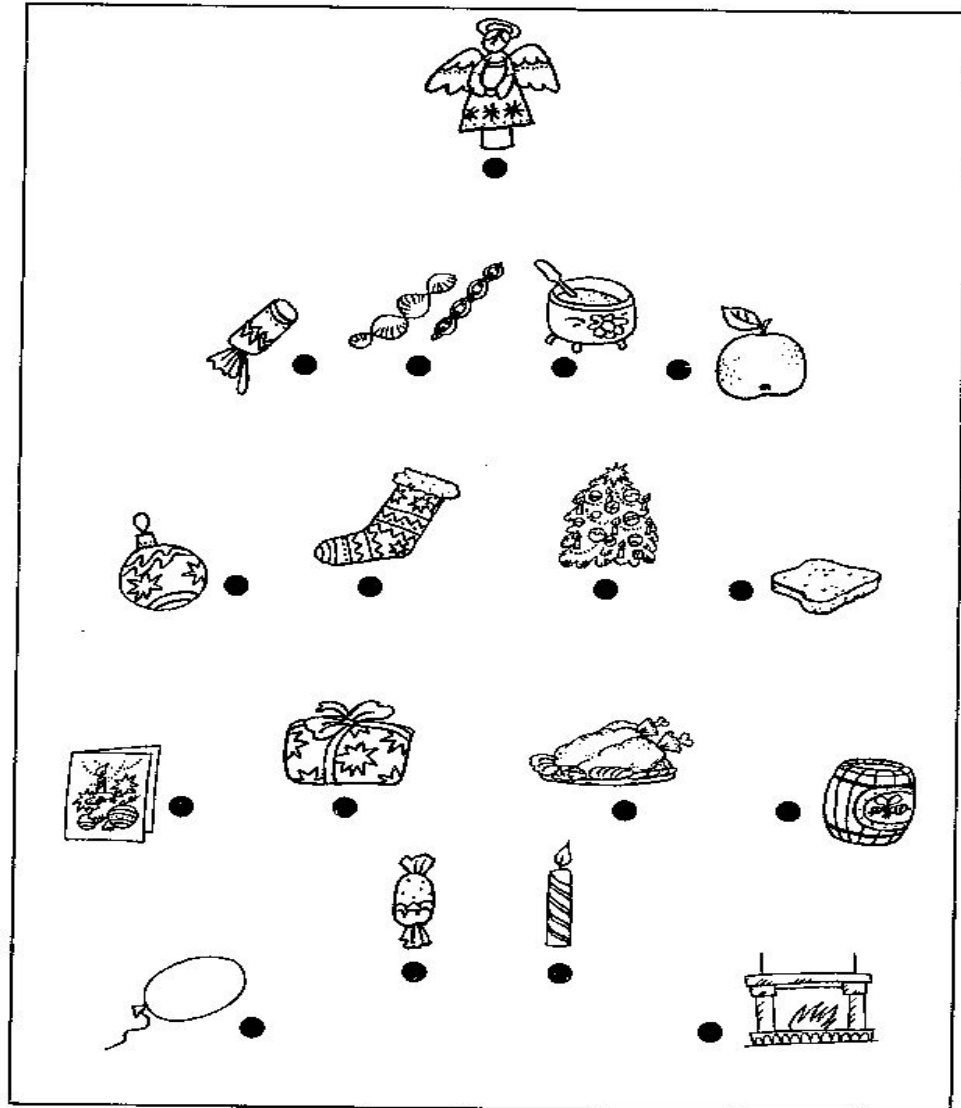
