## A Few Facts About Scotland

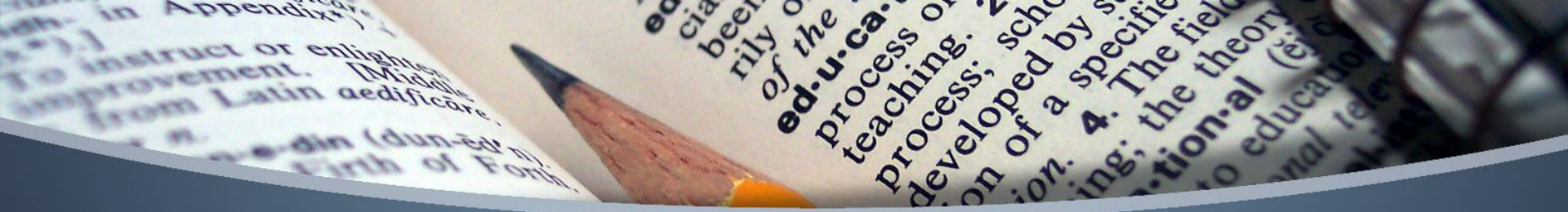
- The capital of Scotland is Edinburgh.
