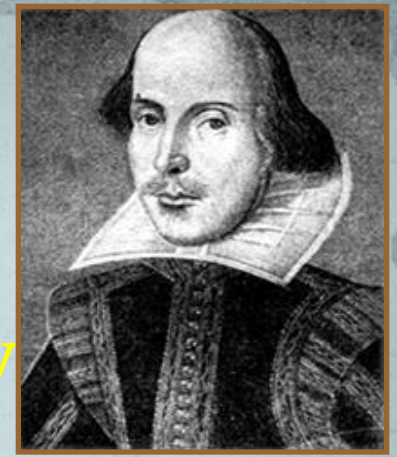

There were 8 children in their family, 4 girls and 4 boys. But two eldest girls died at an early age. William was the third child.



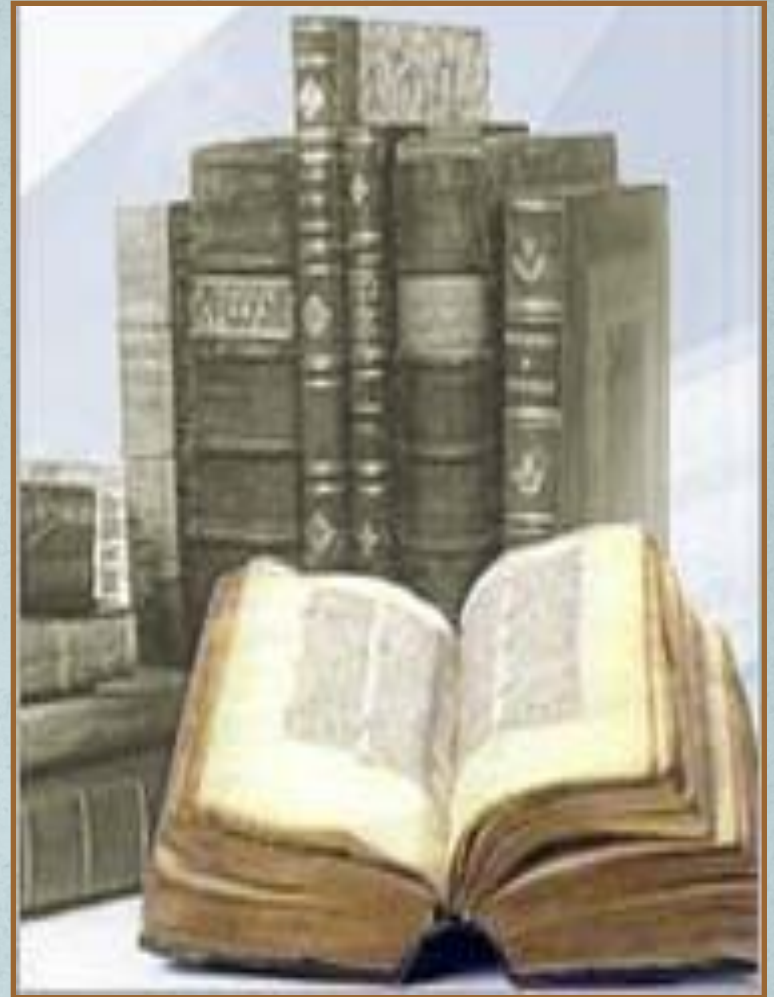


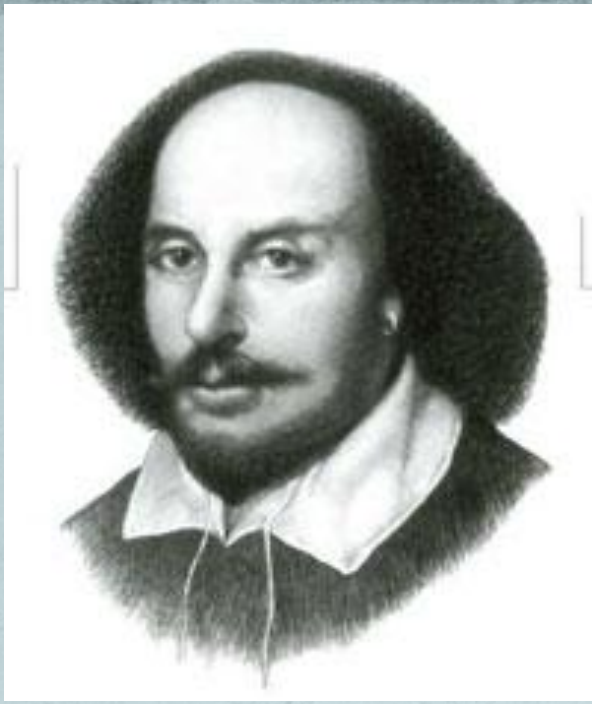
He studied at a grammar school. It began early in the morning and ended late in the evening. He learned Latin, Greek and many other interesting subjects. But it was very hard.

- John Shakespeare, the poet's father, was the town officers and dealer in corn and meat.**



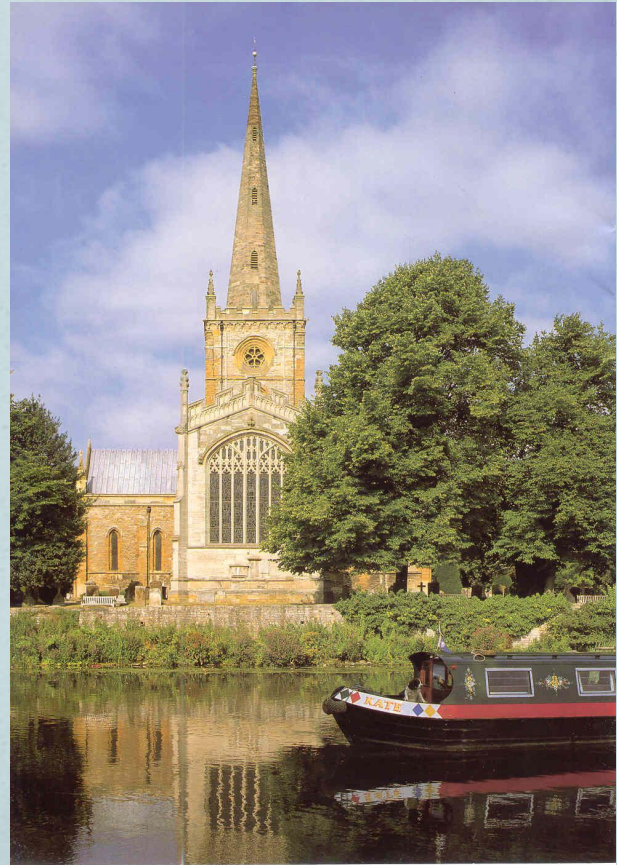
The Birthplace in Henley Street.

where he lies buried.



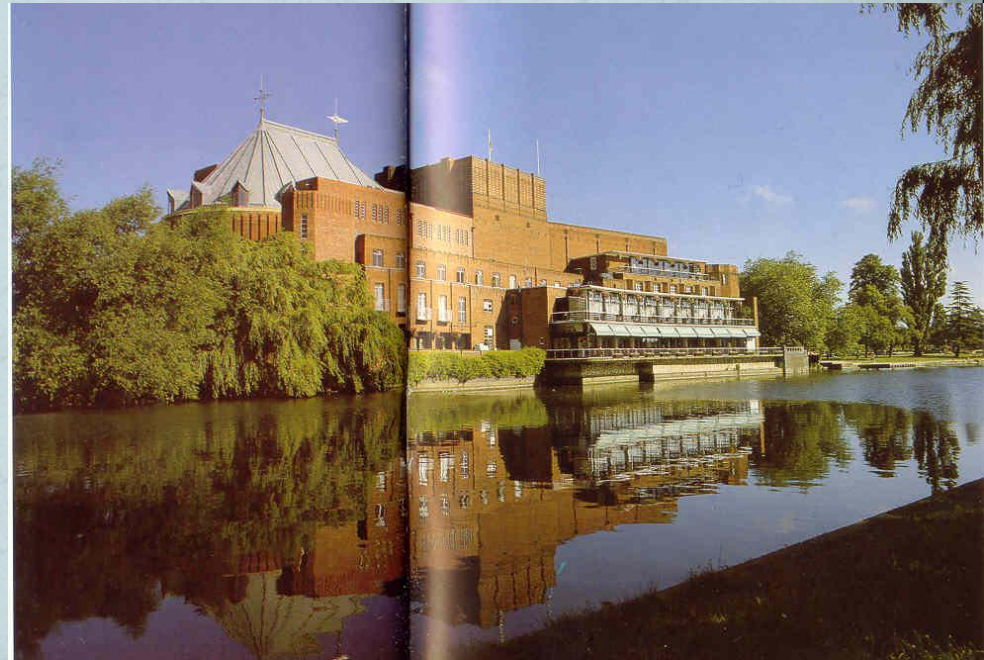
Shakespeare's Centre.

The 1412-seater Royal Shakespeare Theatre is one of the world's leading centres for performances, training and lifelong learning.



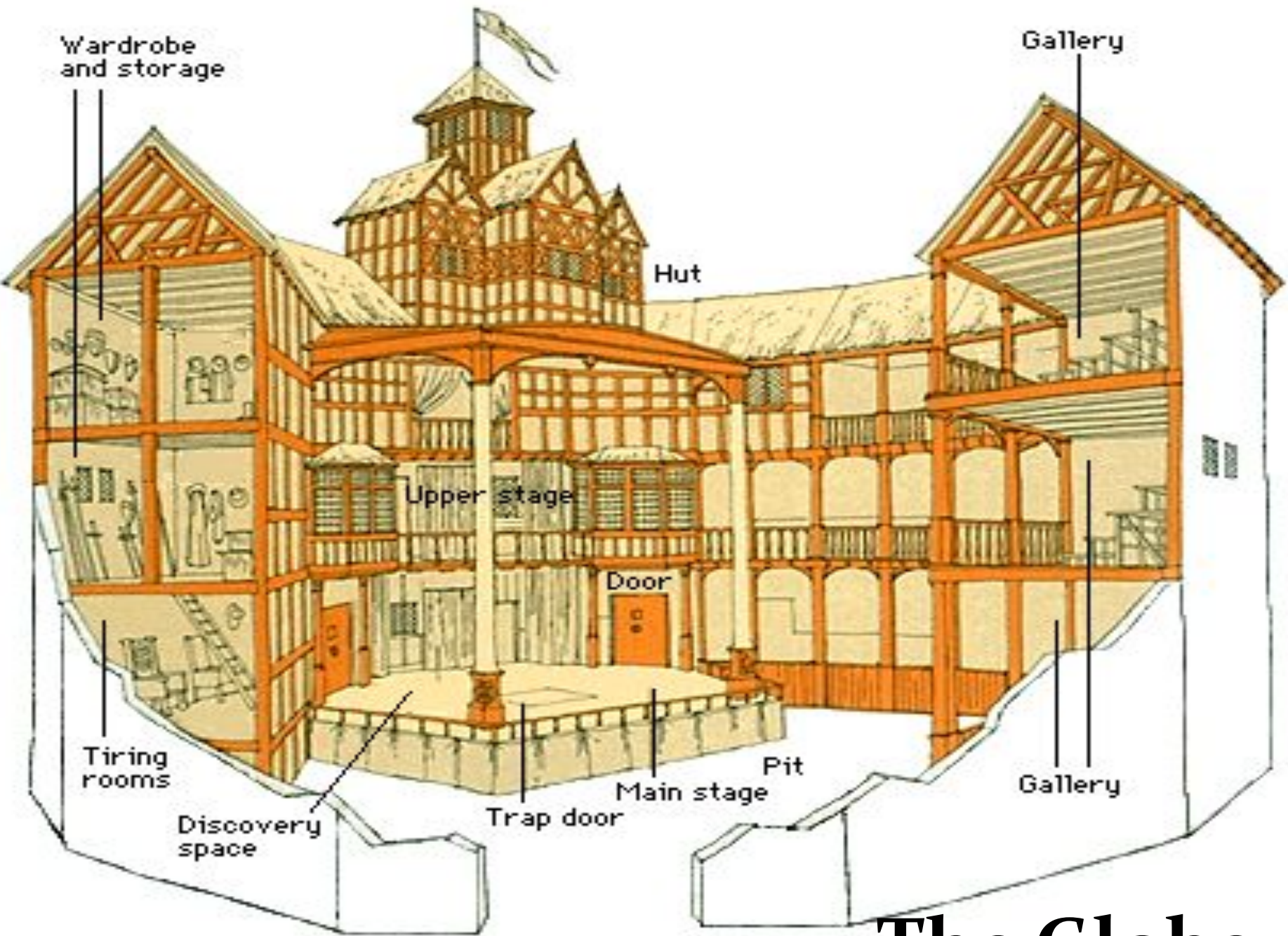
The Shakespeare Hotel.

These 4 lines are said to have been written by himself.

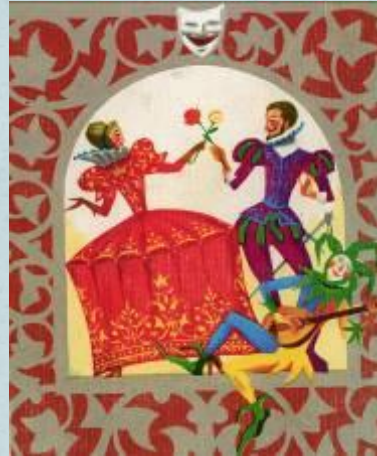
“Good friend, for Jesus' sake,

A memorial statue of Shakespeare is set up in Poet's Corner.

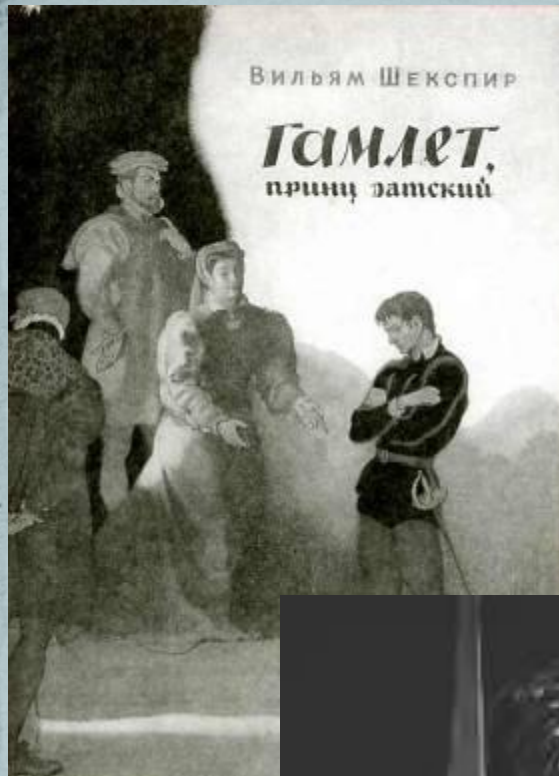
“Romeo and Juliet” - an optimistic tragedy.

John Gielgud was the best in the role of Hamlet in England.

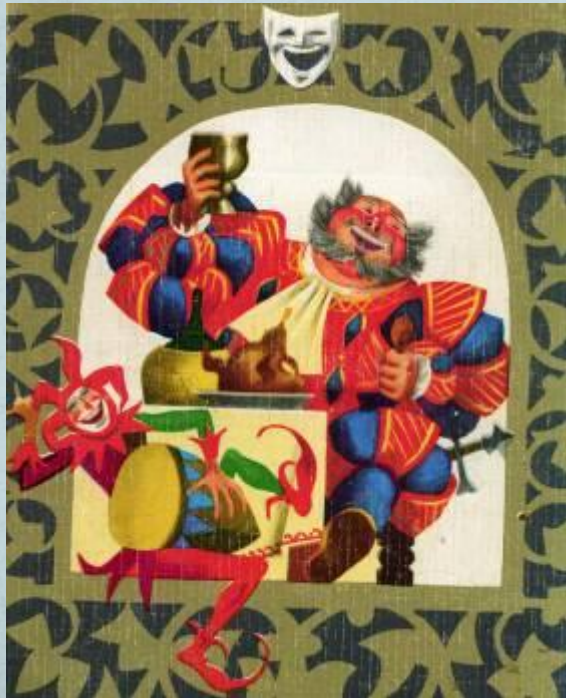
Russian poet and actor Vladimir Vysotsky was brilliant in our country.

“King Lear” is the story of a man who was so proud so egoistic that he could not understand a world around him. He heard only what he wanted to hear; he saw only what he wanted to see.

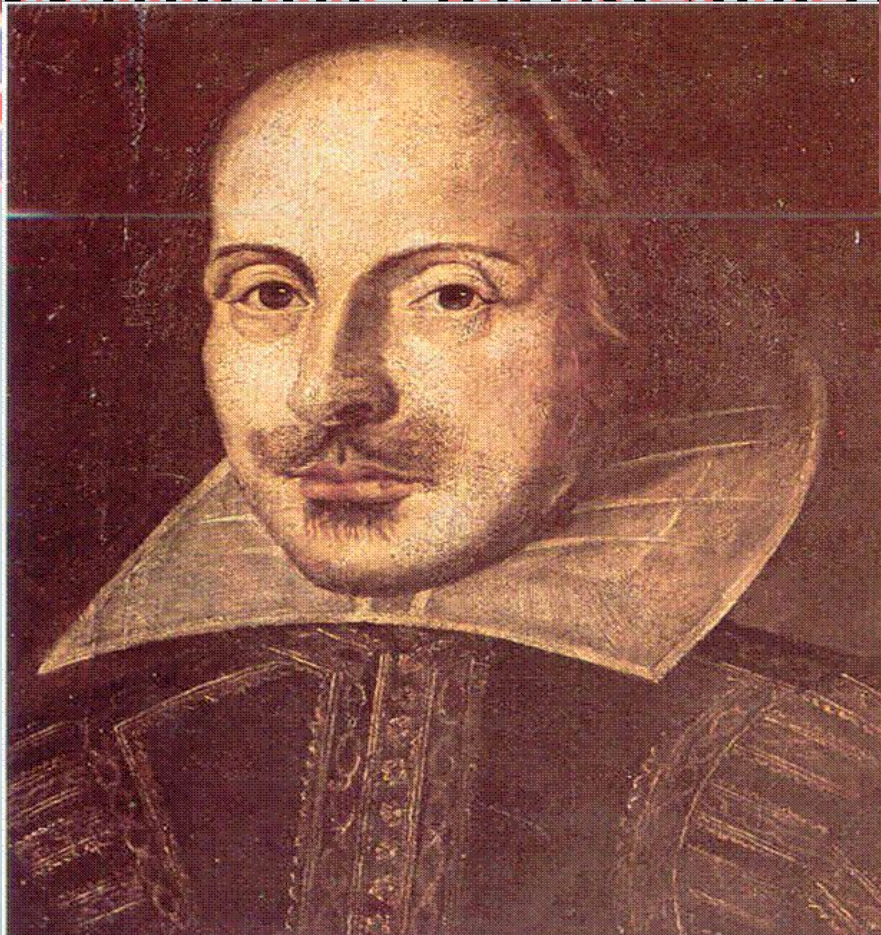


- *Shakespeare as a poet*
