HISTORY

The colonists had a thanksgiving dinner (feast) for all the people. It lasted 3 days. Since that time people have been celebrating Thanksgiving Day.

...and certain kinds of food are served.



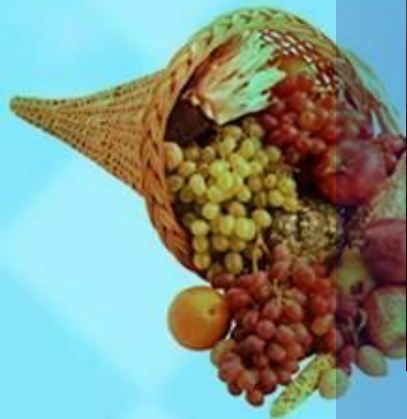
Turkey is served in most Thanksgiving feasts.



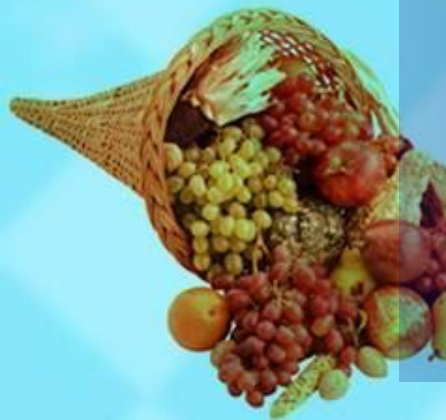
