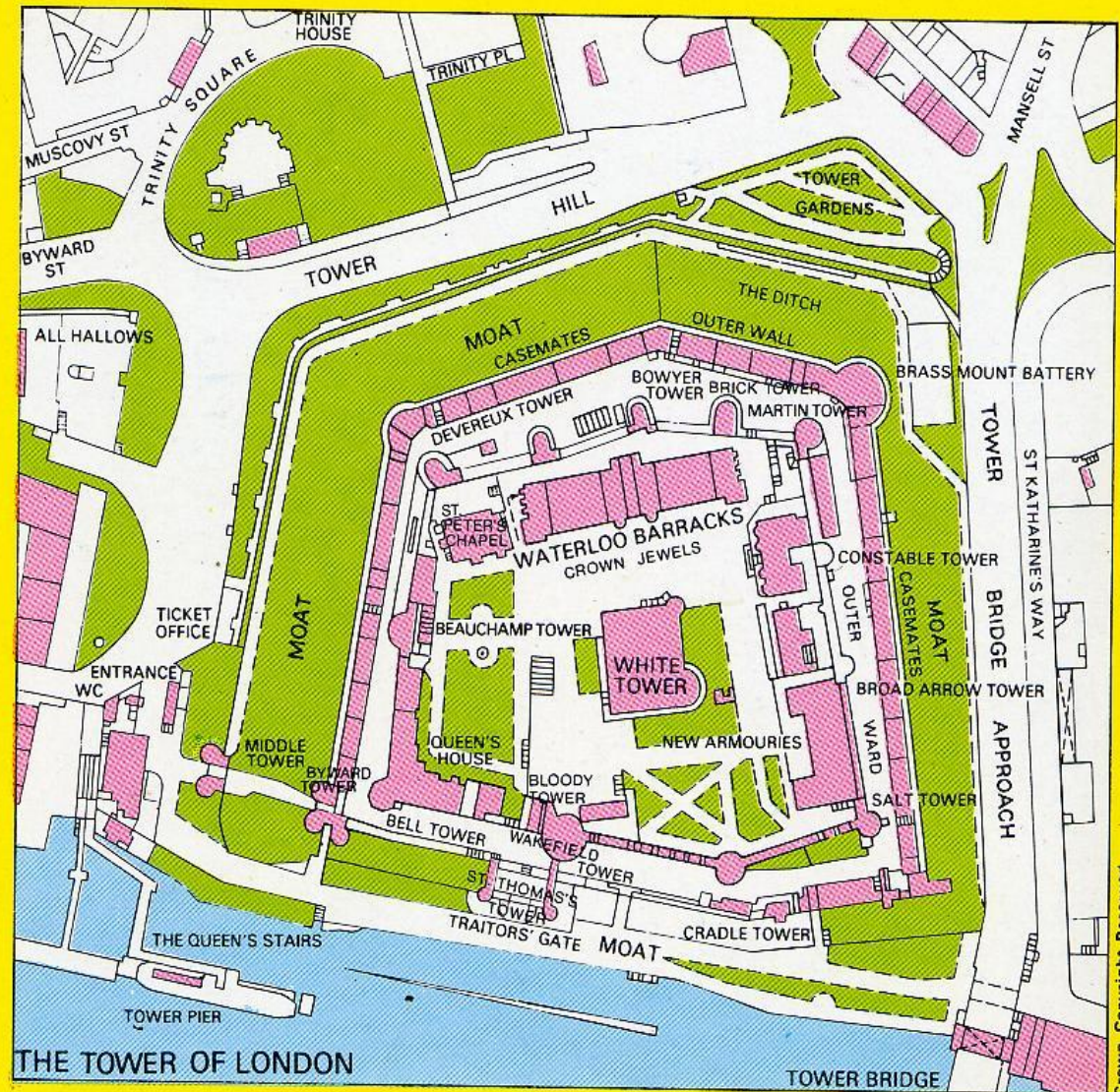


The Tower of London, leading historic visitor attraction

The White Tower

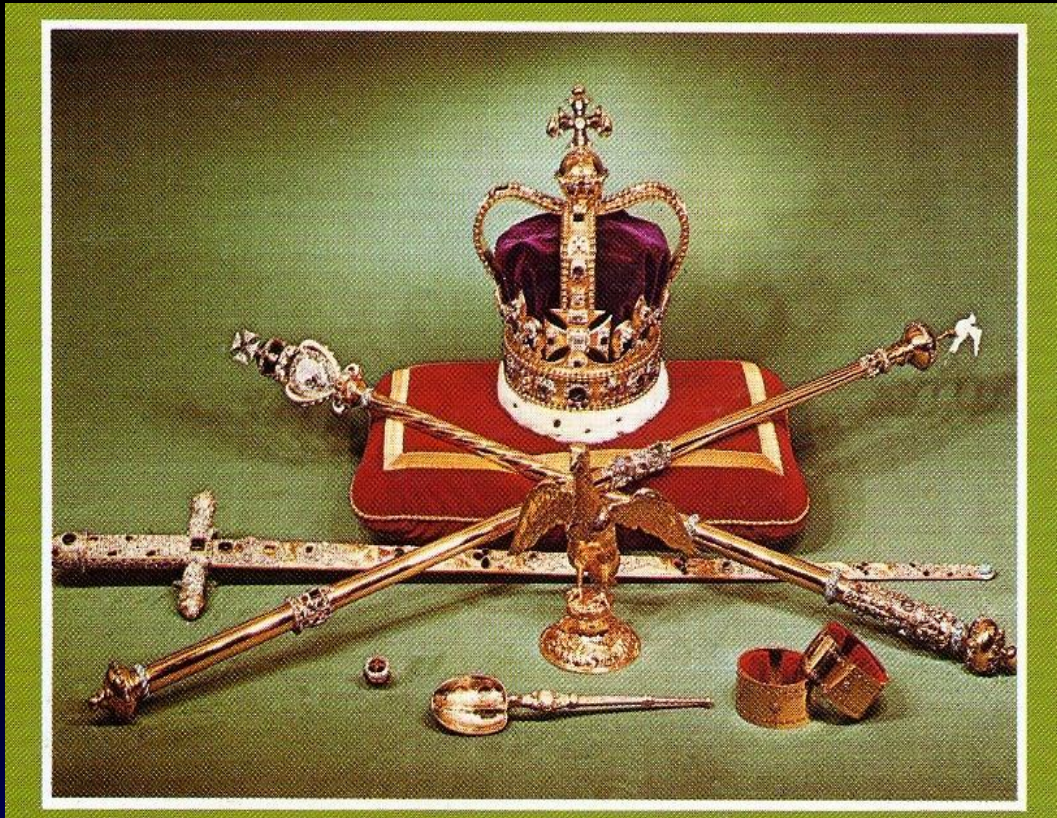
It marks the start of the Tower of London's history.

century.

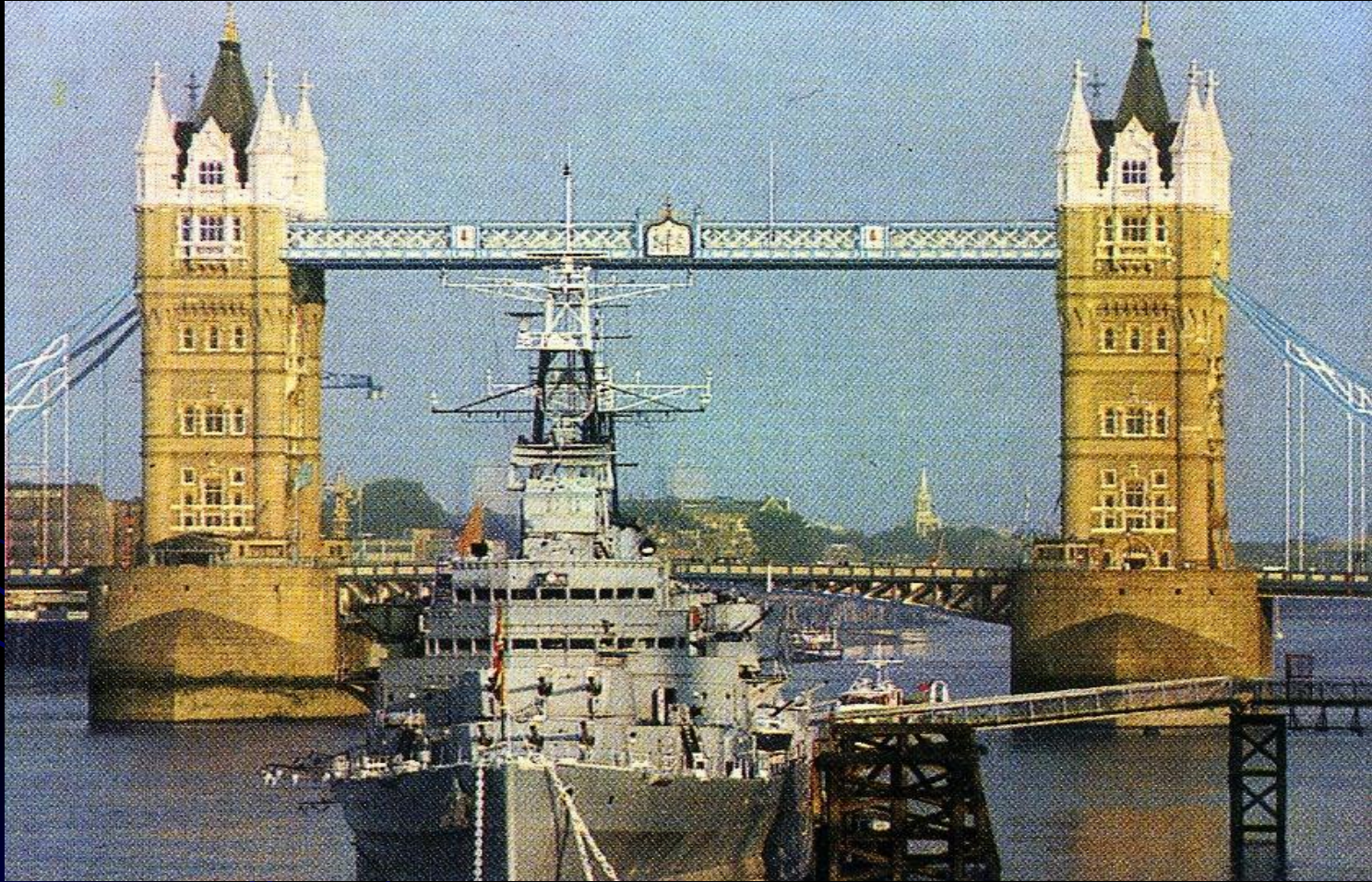


The Ravens
