Where is the UK?



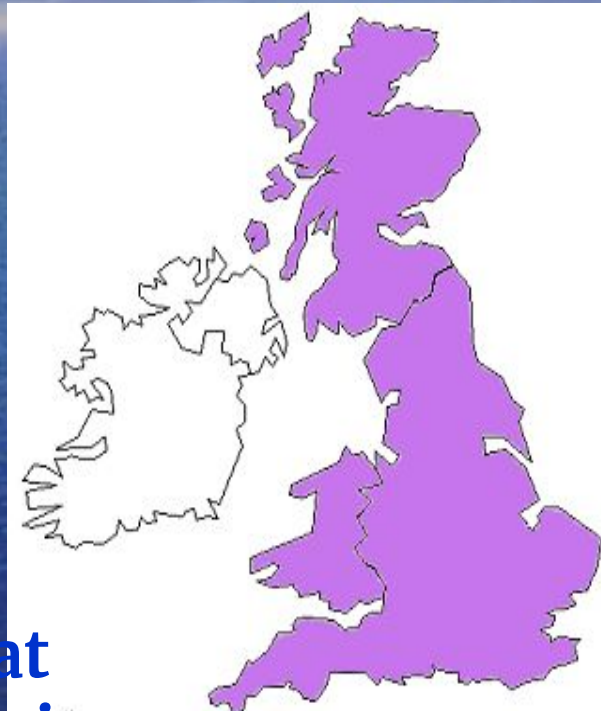
The UK is situated on the **British Isles**, north-west of the European continent between the Atlantic Ocean and the North Sea. It has a total land area of 244,100 square kilometres, of which nearly 99% is land and the remainder inland water. From north to south it is about 1,000 kilometres long.

The official name of the UK is the "United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland".

Why doesn't the Welsh dragon appear on the Union Flag?

The Welsh dragon does not appear on the flag because when the first Union Flag was created in 1606, Wales was already united with England from the 13th century.



The Union Jack is the only *official* flag of Northern Ireland. The well known red hand flag of Northern Ireland. The well known red hand flag has not been used officially since 1973.
