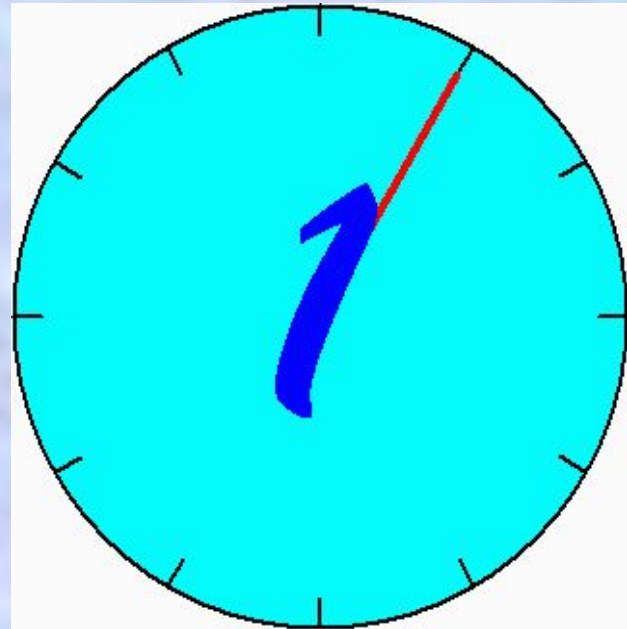

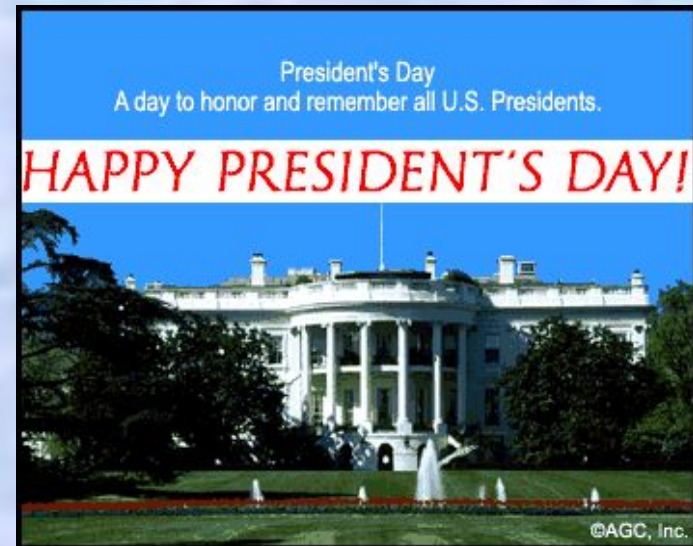
# Start the game
