- Question Word Questions (the answer to the question is "Information")
- ☐ Choice Questions (the answer to the question is "in the question")





Yes/No Questions

auxiliary verb	subject	main verb		Answer Yes or No
Do	you	want	dinner?	Yes, I do.
Can	you	drive?		No, I can't.
Has	she	finished	her work?	Yes, she has.
Did	they	go	home?	No, they didn't.
Exception! verb				
	Is	Anne	French?	Yes, she is.
	Was	Ram	at home?	No, he wasn't.

Question Word	Function	Example
what	asking for information about something	What is your name?
	asking for repetition or confirmation	What? I can't hear you. You did what?
whatfor	asking for a reason, asking why	What did you do that for?
when	asking about time	When did he leave?
where	asking in or at what place or position	Where do they live?
which	asking about choice	Which colour do you want?
who	asking what or which person or people (subject)	Who opened the door?


whose	asking about ownership	Whose are these keys? Whose turn is it?
why	asking for reason, asking whatfor	Why do you say that?
why don't	making a suggestion	Why don't I help you?
how	asking about manner	How does this work?
	asking about condition or quality	How was your exam?
how + adj/adv	asking about extent or degree	see examples below
how far	distance	How far is Pattaya from Bangkok?
how long	length (time or space)	How long will it take?
how many	quantity (countable)	How many cars are there?

- ☐ "I'd rather not say"
- ☐ "I'm afraid that's a bit personal"

Impolitely refusing to answer a question

- ☐ "(That's) none of your business!"
- "Keep your nose out (of other people's business)!"
- "I could tell you, but then I'd have to kill you
