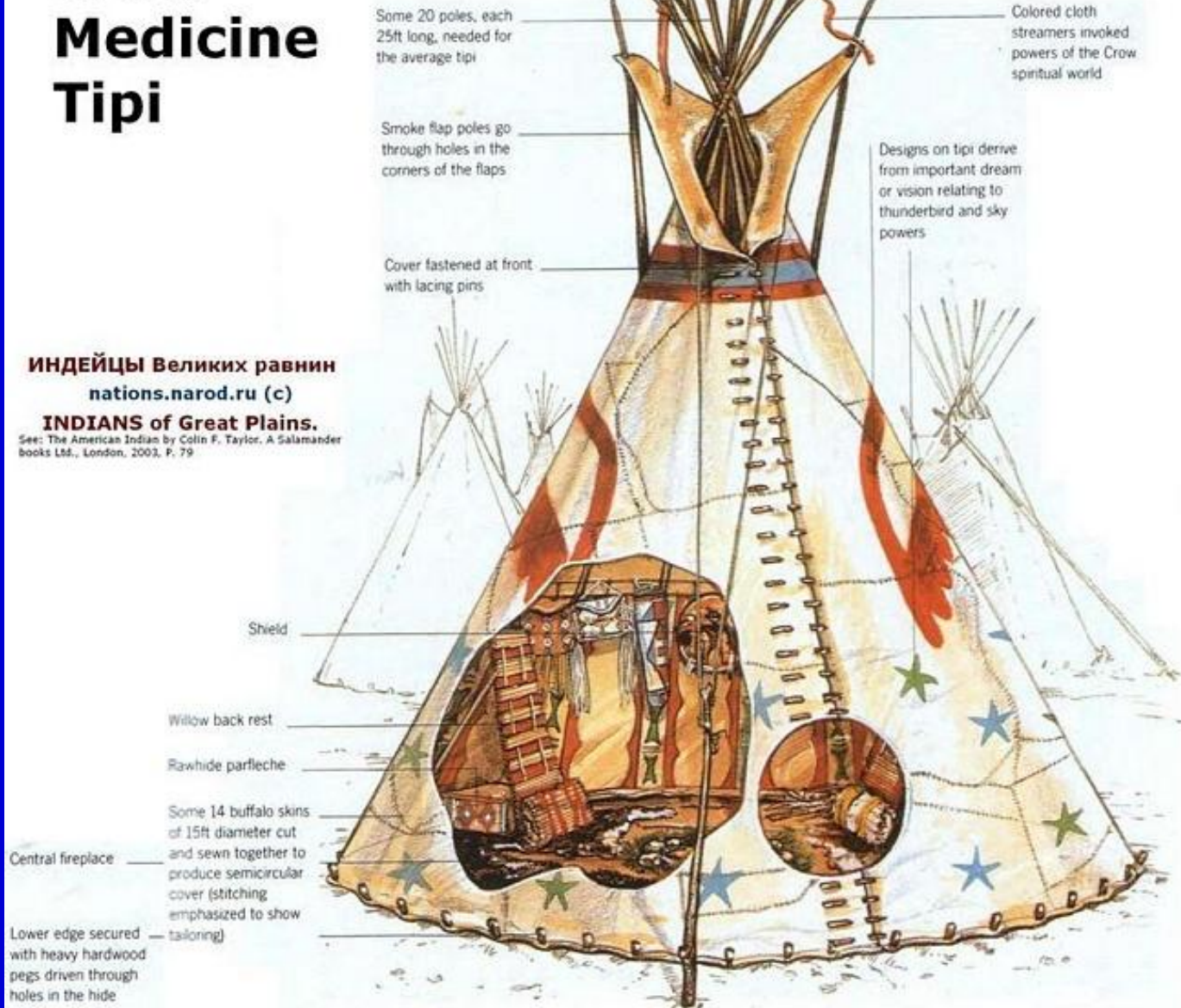

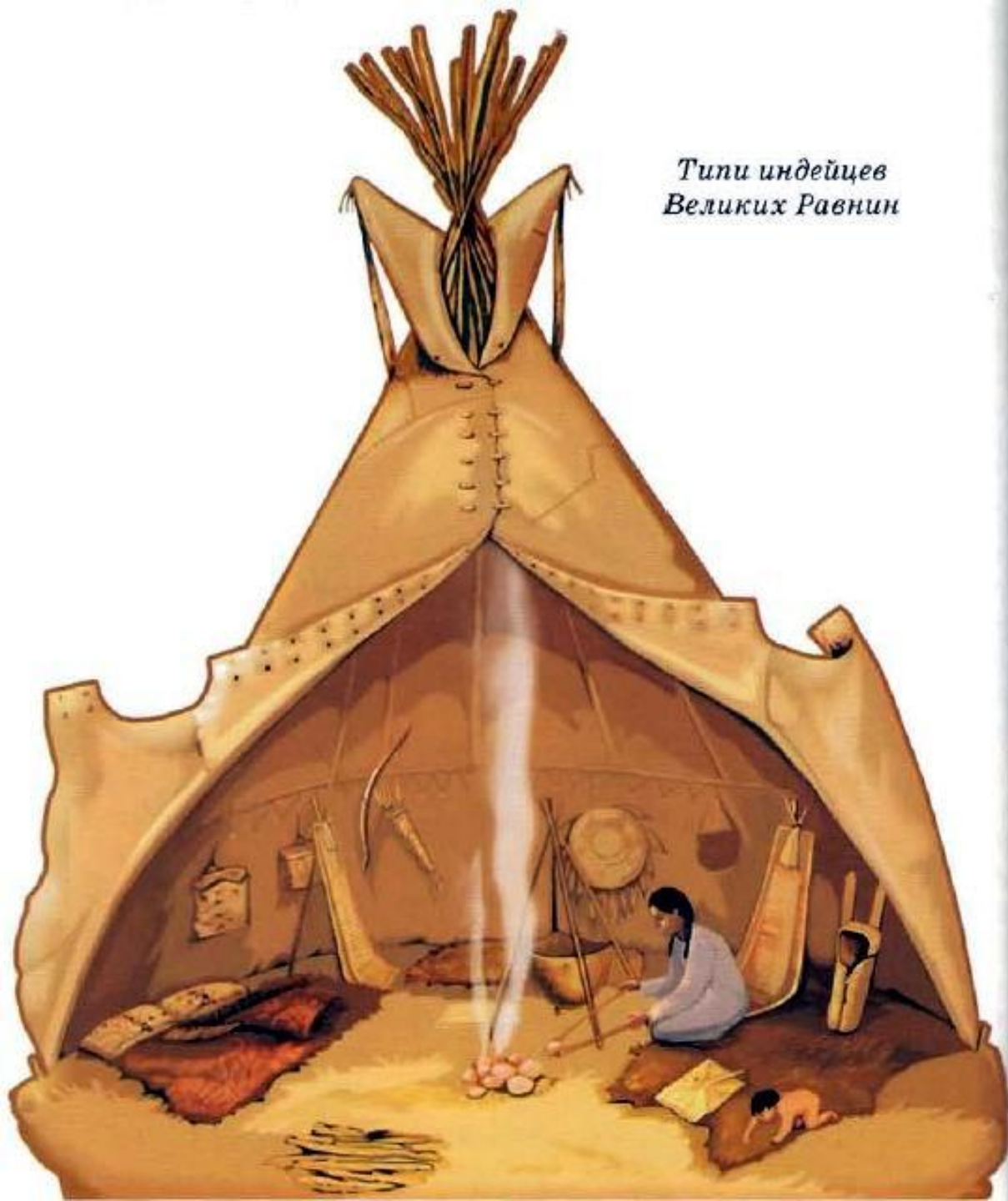

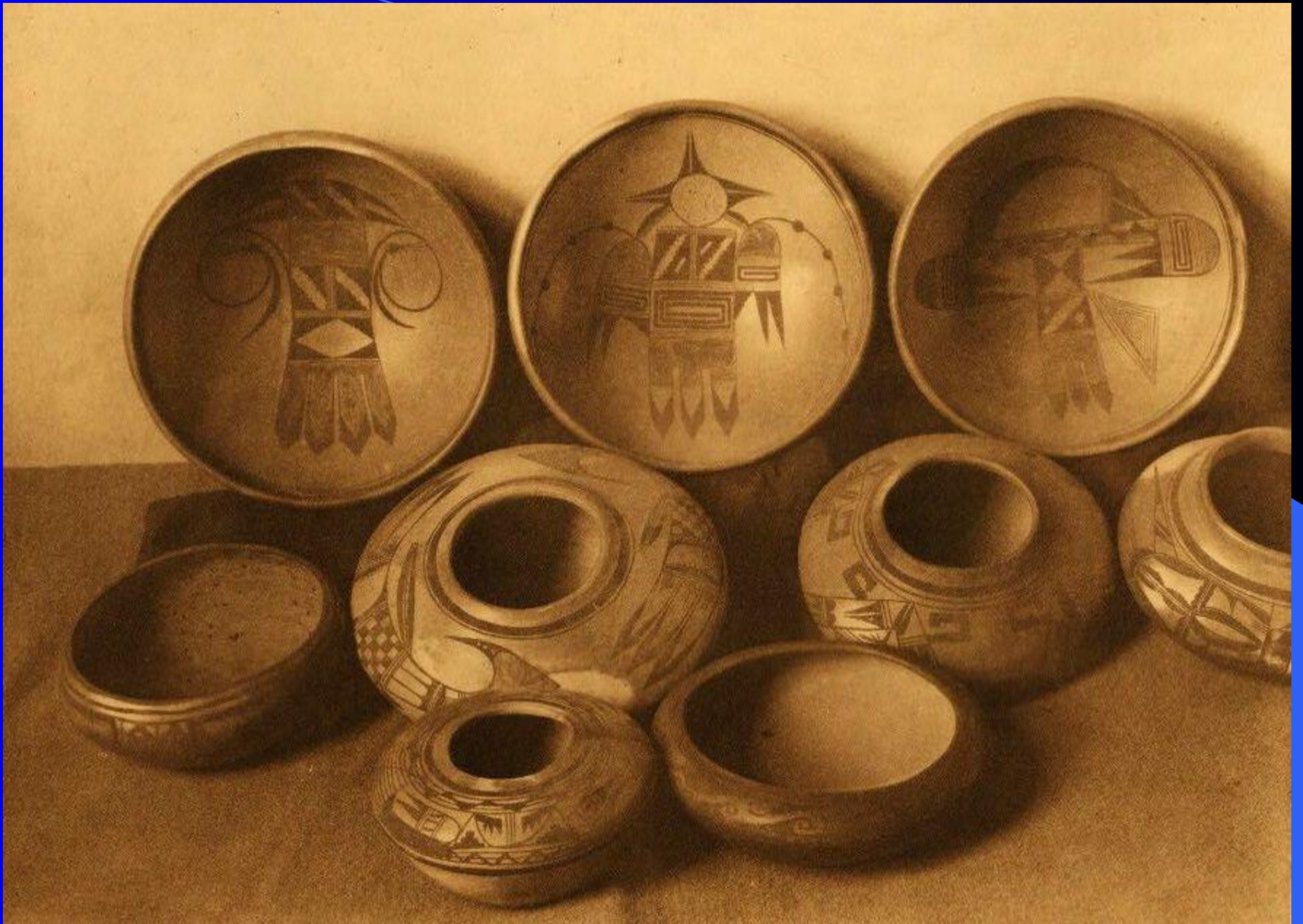

The skill and creativity shown by the weavers come from years of practice. Most weavers work on their rigs at home, while also tending to the daily chores of cooking, child care, going to the store, and herding sheep. The weavers have each worked about forty hours a week and are paid on hourly wages to demonstrate their craft. The rigs they make are well known for their excellent weaving skills and have won awards in international and rug shows.

Although many Navajo speak both Navajo and English, these women speak Navajo and very little English.
