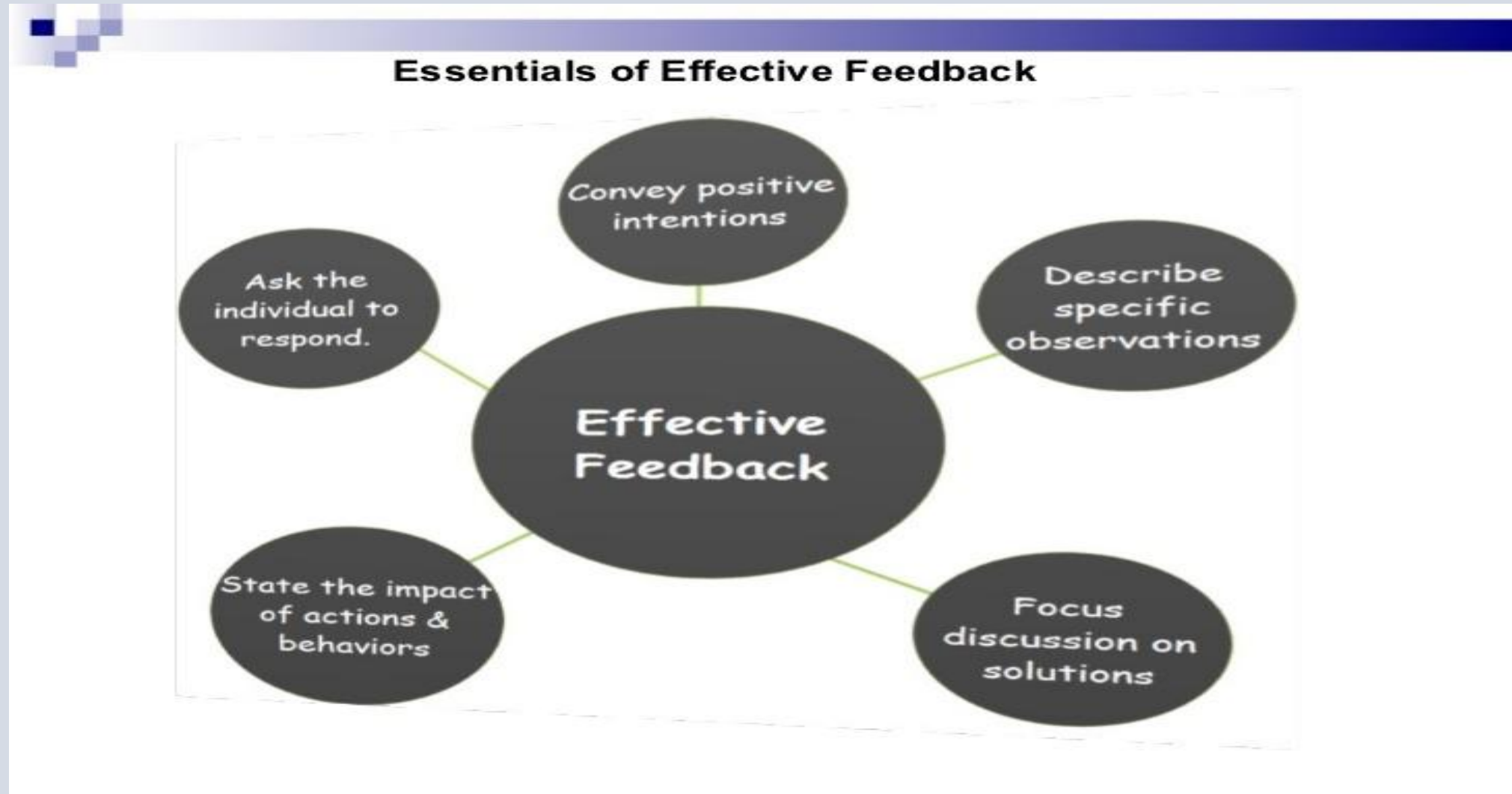

Feedback	
<p>That's not feedback that's just descriptive data.</p> 	<p>You have not used many adjectives. Your graph doesn't have a title.</p> 
<p>That's not feedback that's just comparing to the desired outcome.</p> 	<p>You have not used many adjectives. You should have used more powerful adjectives. Your graph doesn't have a title. Your graph needs a title.</p> 
<p>That's feedback! That helps the student improve against the desired outcome.</p> 	<p>You have not used many adjectives. You should have used more powerful adjectives. You could improve your writing by using the list of adjectives from last week. Your graph doesn't have a title. Your graph needs a title. What is your graph about? What could your title be? Can you add that?</p>
