




Purpose of the 3rd Lecture:

To study the basic features of the Egypt Architecture in the Ancient period.

Tasks of the 3rd Lecture:

- To consider characteristic examples of specifically organized spaces and buildings;

1. Study the change in the nomenclature of buildings and structures during the evolution of the architecture of Ancient Egypt
2. Analyze geometric parameters of main types of structures and buildings.

1. What is the structure of the pyramid's temple complex in the period of the Ancient and Middle Kingdoms?
2. What is the structure of a typical temple complex of the New Kingdom period?






