Purpose of the 14th Lecture:

To study the basic features of the Eastern Europe Middle Ages and New Times Architecture.

Tasks of the 14th Lecture:

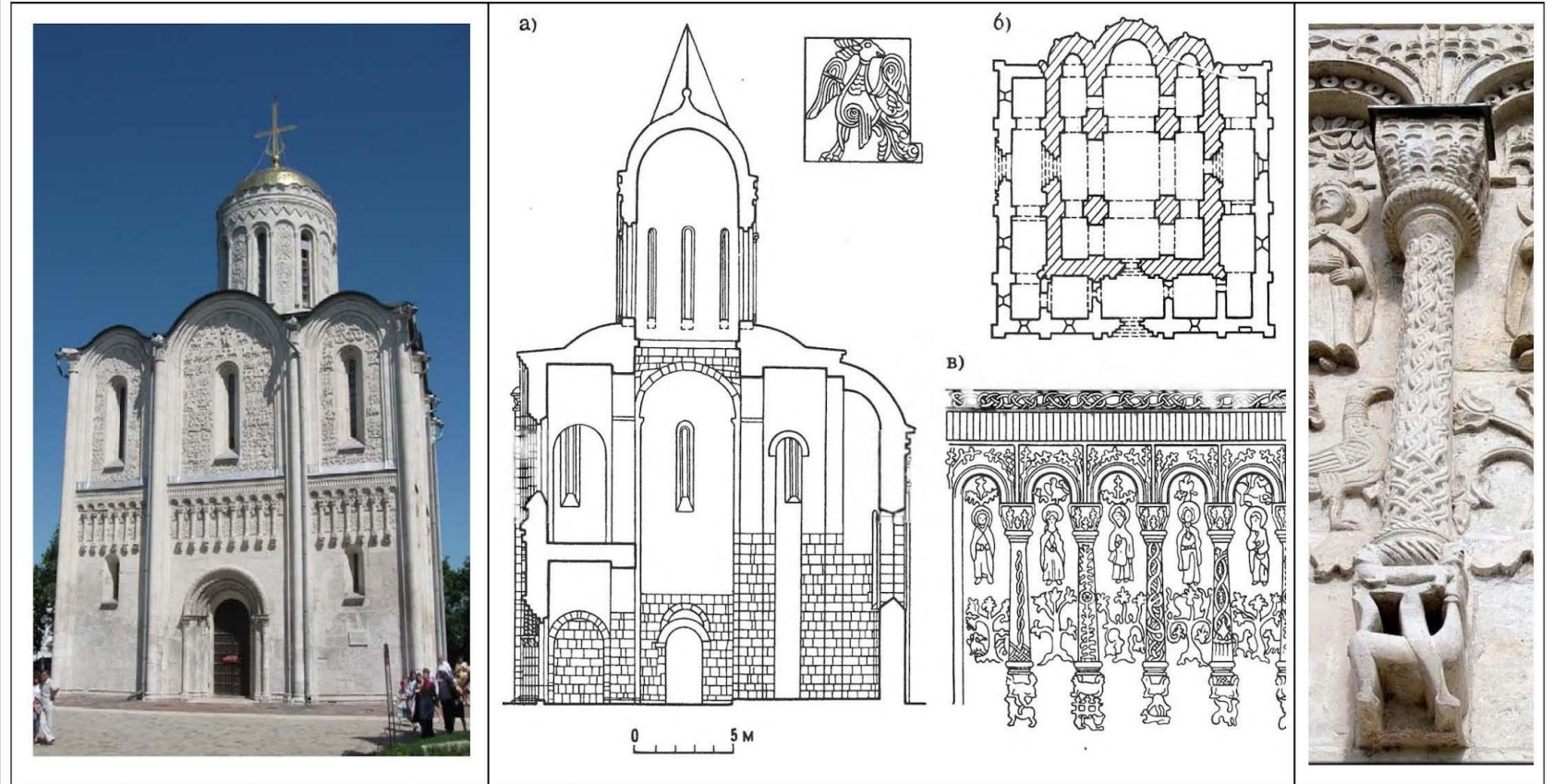

14.2 The Cathedral of Saint Demetrius, Vladimir city, Russia, 1191 or 1197



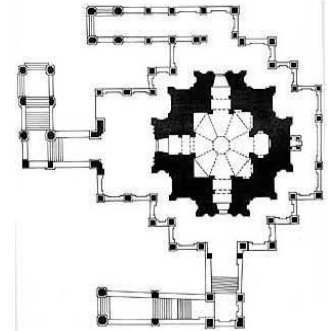
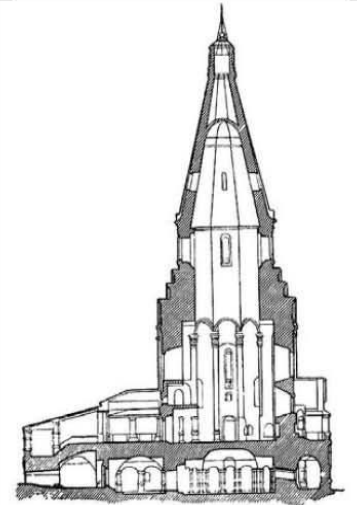
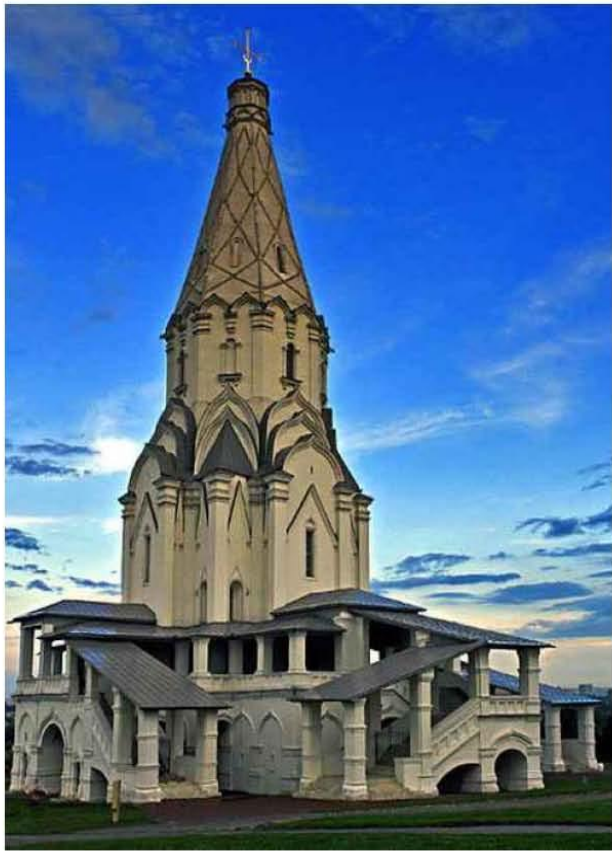

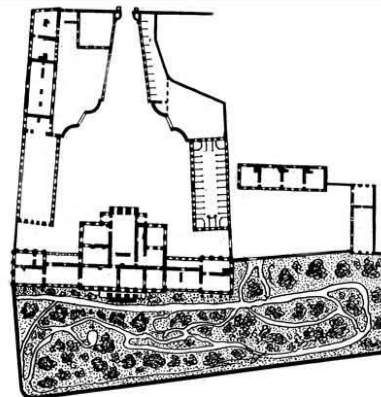
