2. Accentuate the features of the European 1960's architecture

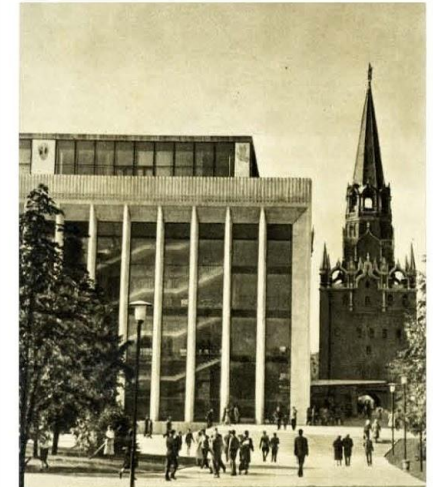

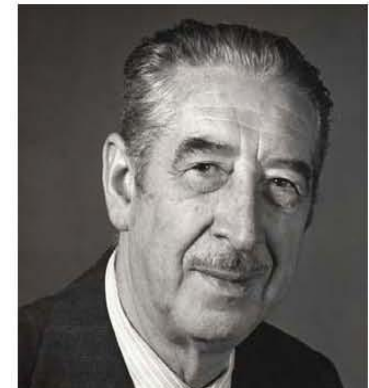

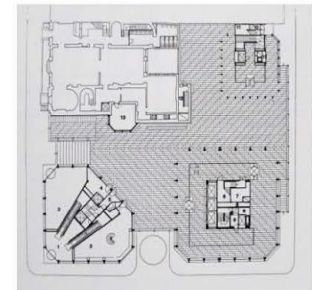

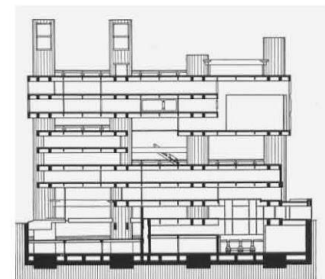

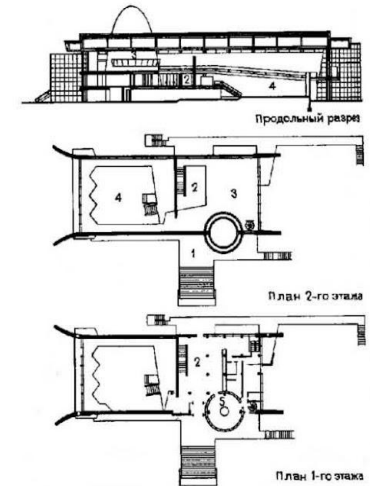

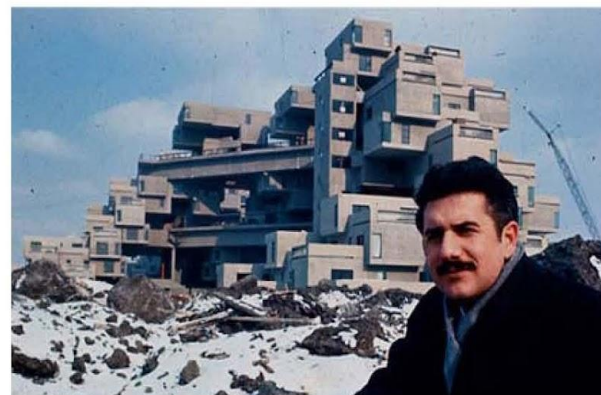
