Consonant Digraphs

- Consonant digraphs are two (or three) letters that come together to make one sound.
 - The difference between blends and digraphs is that blends are two letters that make two sounds and digraphs make one sound.

- ch /ch/
 - tch /ch/
 - sh /sh/
 - wh /wh/
 - th /th/

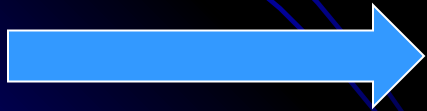
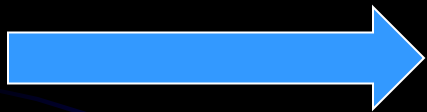
- match has the consonant digraph tch which makes the sound /ch/
