THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE

The unanimous Declaration of the thirteen united States of America

IN CONGRESS, JULY 4, 1776.


The unanimous Declaration of the thirteen united States of America,

When in the Course of human Events, it becomes necessary for one People to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the Powers of the earth, the separate and equal Station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent Respect to the Opinions of Mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the Separation. We and our forefathers are born with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness. That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just Powers from the Consent of the Governed, — That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its Foundation on such Principles, and organizing its Powers in such Form, as to them shall seem most likely to promote their Safety and Happiness. Prudence, in such a Course, will dictate that Governments long established should not be changed for light and transient Causes; and accordingly we have suffered the longest Sufferance with them, for many Years; but when a long Train of Abuses and Usurptions, which have assumed a Character of Violence and Oppression, shall compel us to alter them, in such Cases, we must obey the urgent Dictates of Reason, and declare that we are free and independent States, that we have the Power and Right to do so, and to be free and independent States.

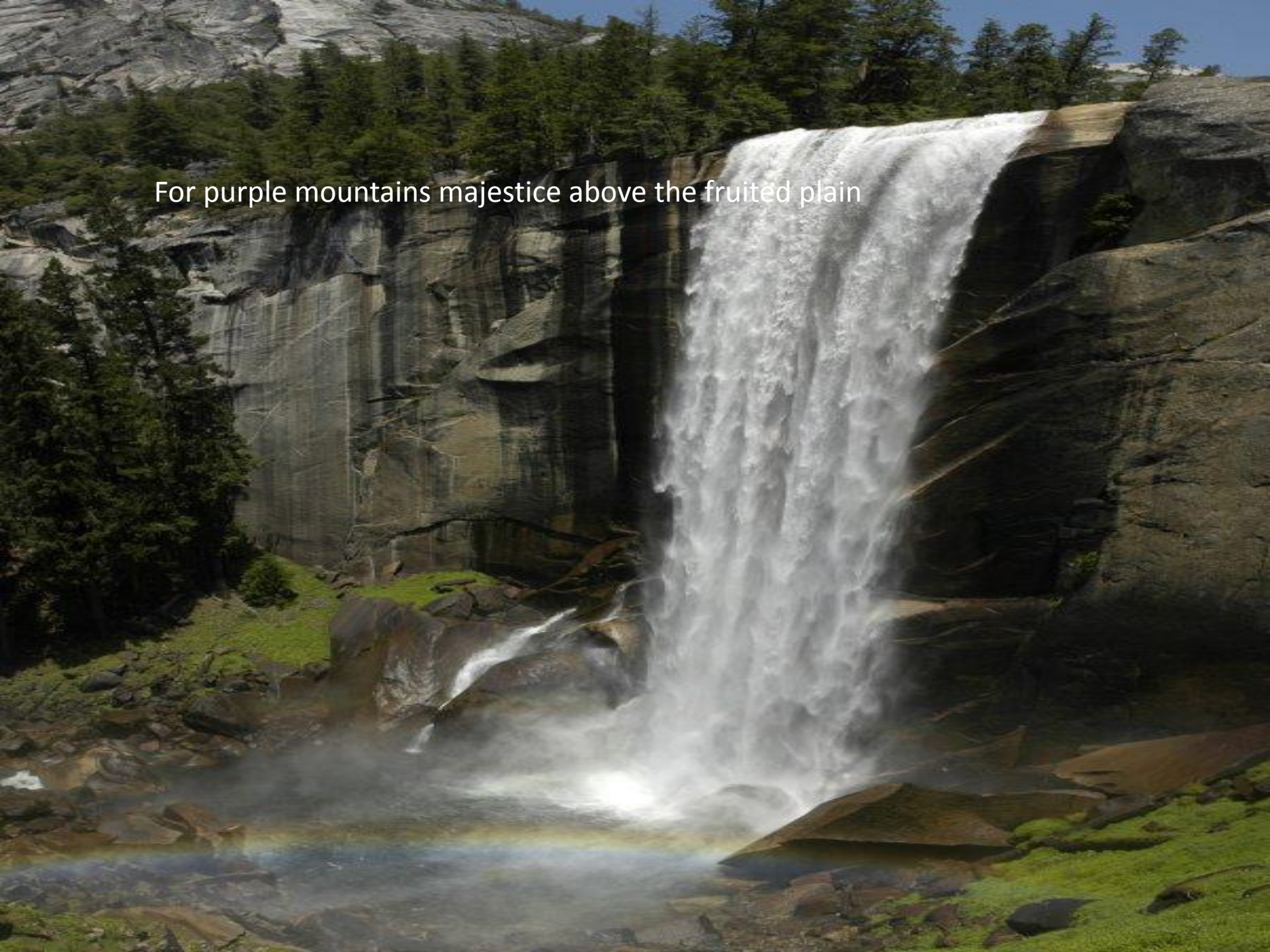

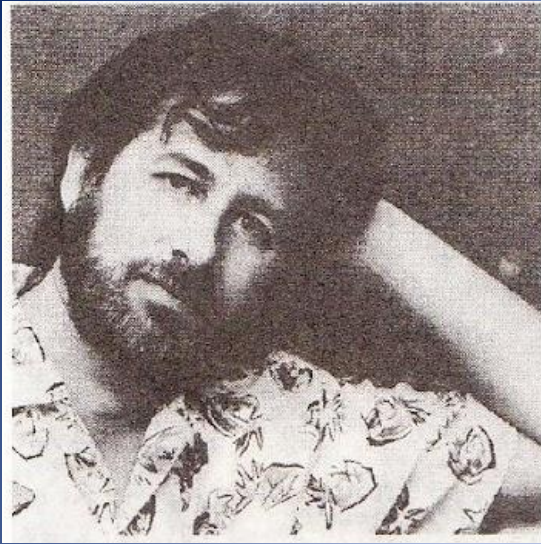


This is Los Angeles, also called L.A. It is the second largest American city.

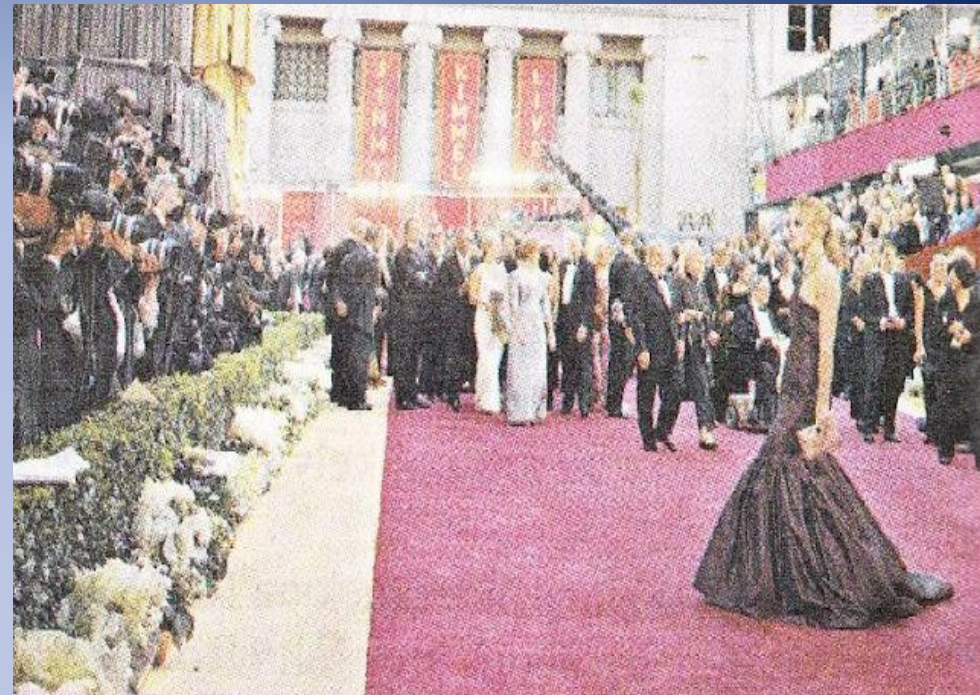
HOLLYWOOD
