

**The River Thames** runs through the centre of London from west to east. Its name comes from an old word for "river".









London is made up of **two ancient cities** which are now joined together. They are:

- the City of London, know simply as '**the City**' which is the business and financial heart of the United Kingdom. It is also known as the **Square Mile**. It was the original Roman settlement (ancient Londonium), making it the oldest part of London and already 1,000 years old when the Tower of London was built.
- the City of Westminster, where Parliament and most of the government offices are located. Also Buckingham Palace, the official London residence of the Queen and the Royal family are located there too.

Together they all make up a region known as Greater London.





London is the seat of central government in Britain.


Parliament is where politicians (MPs) meet to decide laws and make decisions for the United Kingdom. It is not the same as the Government (which runs the country). One of the jobs Parliament does is to check that the Government is running the country properly.



There are **34 bridges** across the River Thames. London Bridge does not have towers. Tower Bridge does! Tower Bridge is the most recognisable bridge on the River Thames and is often mistakenly referred to as "London Bridge".


