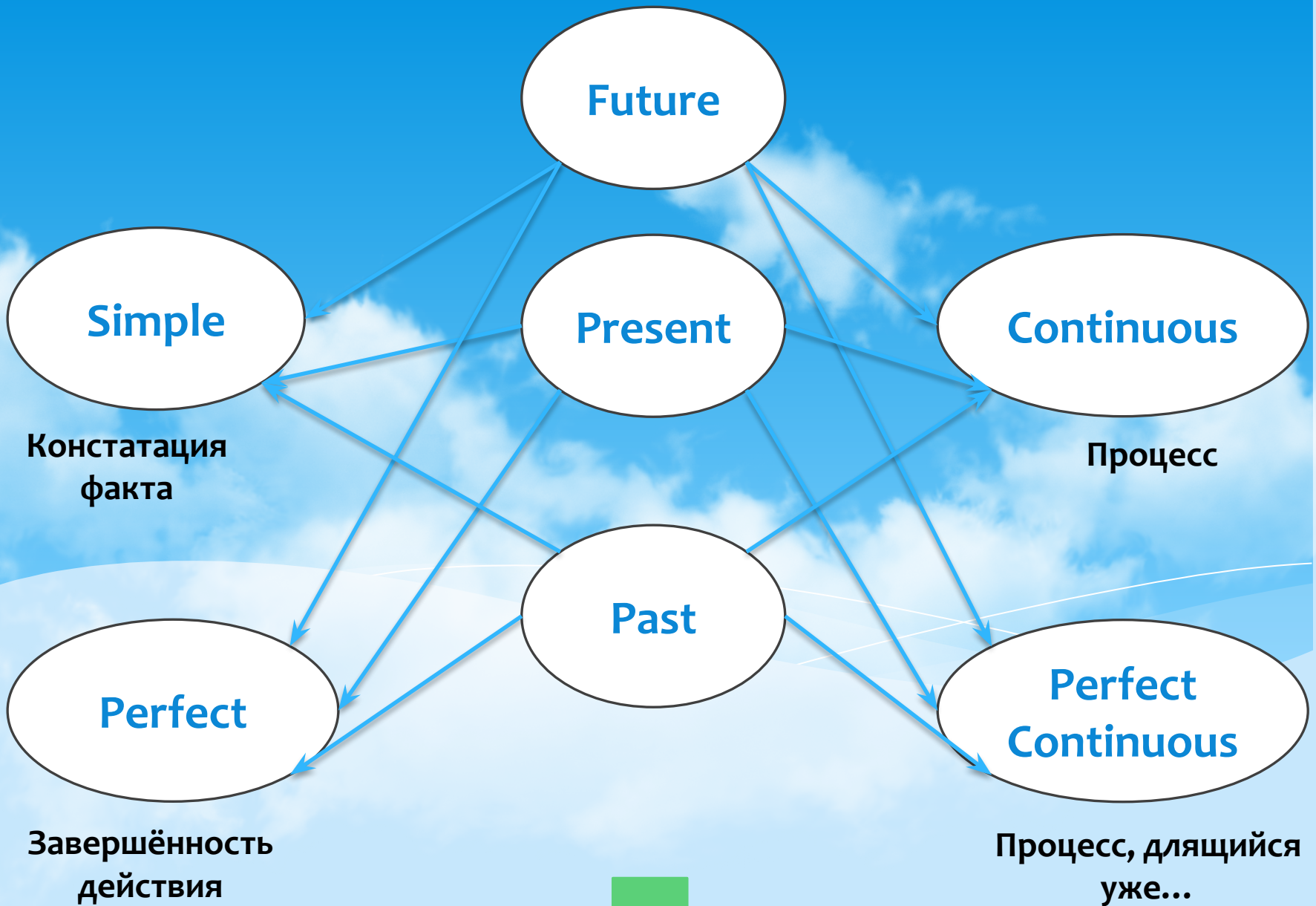

The Present Simple Tense

Every day, usually, sometimes, often, seldom

He **does** morning exercises every day.

Does he do morning exercises every day?

Yes, he **does**. No, he **doesn't**.

He **doesn't** run in the morning.



He often a newspaper.

read

reads

reading



The Past Simple Tense

Yesterday, last year, some days ago, in 1987

He worked in the garden yesterday.

Did he work in the garden yesterday?

Yes, he did. No, he didn't.

He didn't work in the office yesterday.



..... you go to the museum
yesterday?

Was

Were

Did



The Future Simple Tense

Tomorrow, next year, in 2015

He **will** make a statue next year.

Will he make a statue next year?

Yes, he will. No, he won't.

He won't paint a picture next year.



I go to the Spain next year.

won't

shan't

have been



The Future Continuous Tense

At 7 o'clock tomorrow, the whole day, from 5 to 7, when he comes

He **will be** painting at 5 o'clock tomorrow.

Will he be painting at 5 o'clock tomorrow?

Yes, he will. No, he won't.

He **won't be** reading at 7 o'clock tomorrow.



What you doing at 7 o'clock tomorrow?

have ... been

had ... been

will ... been



The Present Perfect Tense

Already, just, recently lately, ever, never, yet, since

He **has** decreased**ed** his weight.

Has he decreased**ed** his weight?

Yes, he has. No, he hasn't.

He hasn't increased his weight.



..... you ever been to London?

was

am

have



The Past Perfect Tense

by 7 o'clock, before, after when he came

He **had done** his work by 6 o'clock.

Had he **done** his work by 6 o'clock?

He **hadn't done** his work by 3 o'clock.



He lived in the country before he came to New York.

had

have

is being



The Future Perfect Tense

by 7 o'clock, before, after when he came

He **will have cut** the tree by the dinner-time.

Will he have cut the tree by the dinner-time?

He **won't have cut** the tree by 10 o'clock.



He written the article by 8
o'clock tomorrow.

hadn't have

won't have

haven't



The Present Perfect Continuous Tense

since 3 o'clock, for hours, how long

He **has been** reading for 2 hours.

Has he **been** reading for 2 hours?

He **hasn't been** reading for 4 hours.



I doing this task for 3 hours.

have been

has been

is been



The Past Perfect Continuous Tense

since 3 o'clock, for hours yesterday, how long

Yesterday he **had been** fishing since 3 o'clock.

How long **had** he **been** fishing?

Yesterday he **hadn't been** fishing since morning.



How long you translating
this text yesterday?

had ... been

have ... been

were ... been



The Future Perfect Continuous Tense

since 3 o'clock, for 2 hours tomorrow, how long

Next year she **will have been** working at school for 25 years.

Will she **have been** working at school for 25 years next year?

Next year she **won't have been** working at school for 30 years.



Next year we living
together for 12 years.

will have

will be

**will have
been**
