

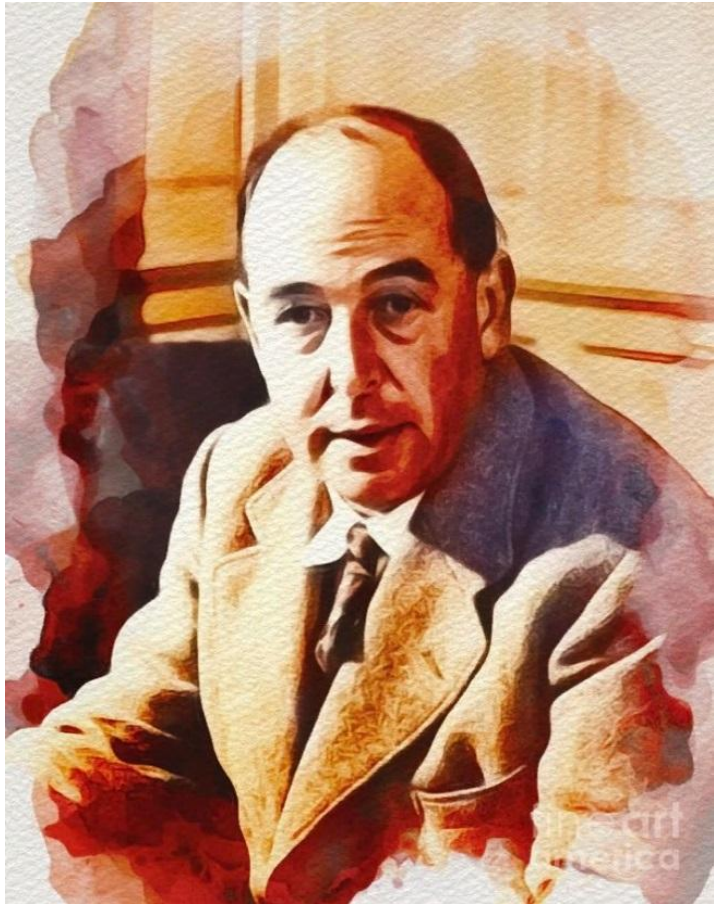

- * 1. Despite his high association with English institutions, he was not English. Lewis had a strong association with Cambridge and Oxford Universities. Because of this profile, many people have come to believe that he was English by birth. However, he was Irish, and this was even evident in his accent when he first went to school,
- * 2. Although he was passionate about Philosophy, he ended up teaching literature. Since his young age, Lewis had plans of building his career as a philosopher. He envisioned a time when he would be teaching philosophy at Oxford University. However, after his graduation, things didn't work out as expected.

- * 3. Lack of a two-jointed thumb impacted Lewis's social growth. A two-jointed thumb is one of the main factors that separates us from other primates.

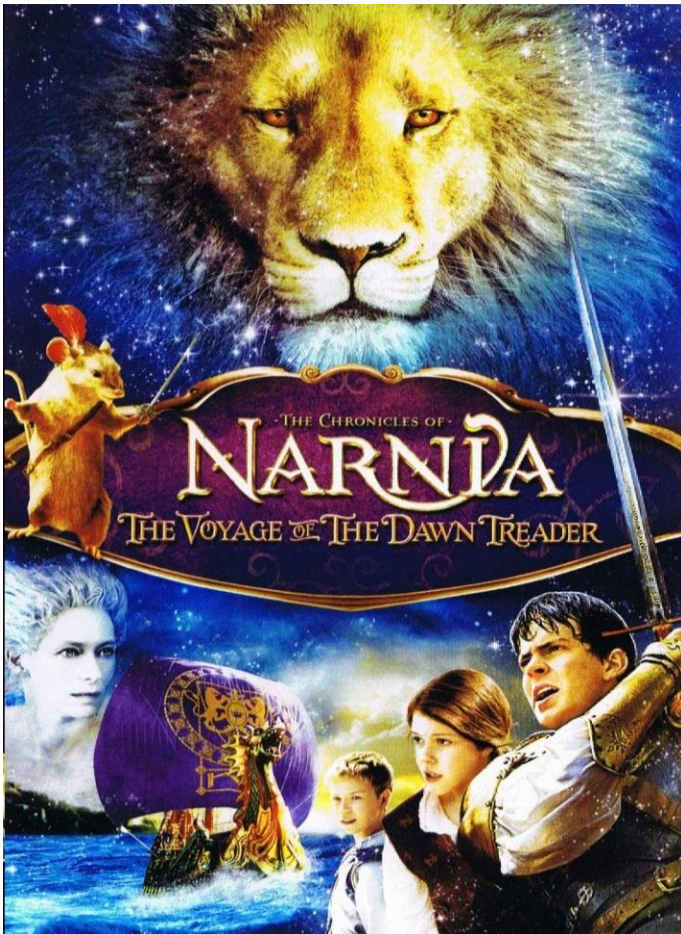

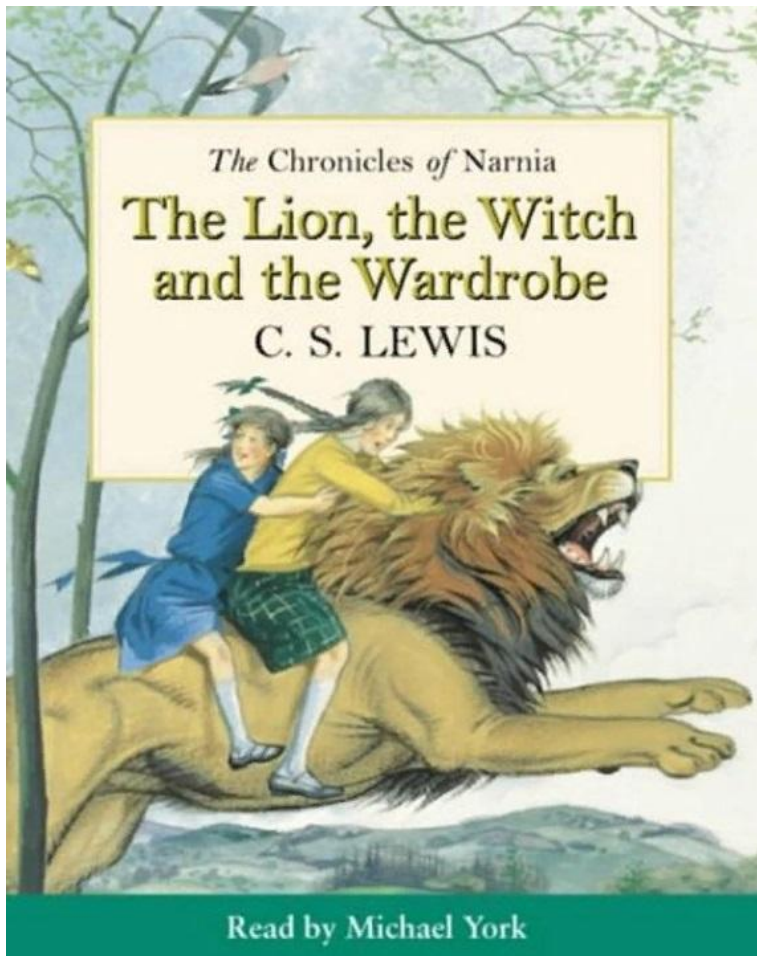

The Chronicles of Narnia



- * The series is set in the fictional realm of Narnia, a fantasy world of magic, mythical beasts, and talking animals. Are all children from the real world who are magically transported to Narnia, where they are sometimes called upon by the lion Aslan to protect Narnia from evil.

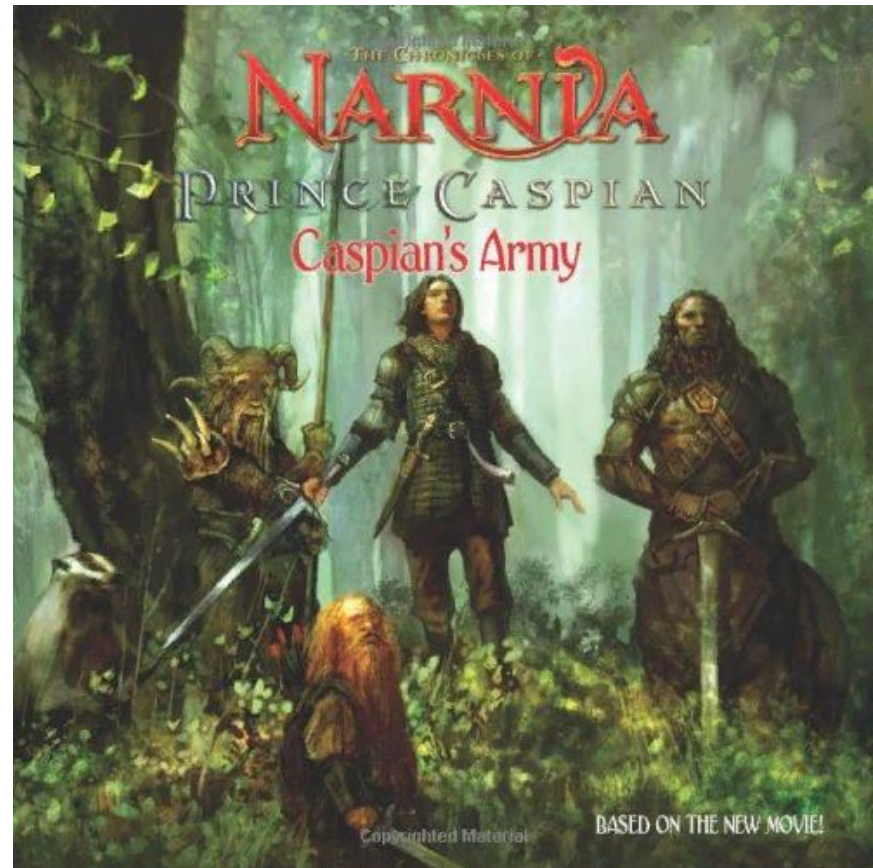
«The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe»



- * Four English children are relocated to a large, old country house following a wartime evacuation. In Narnia, the siblings seem fit to fulfill an old prophecy and find themselves adventuring to save Narnia and their own lives.

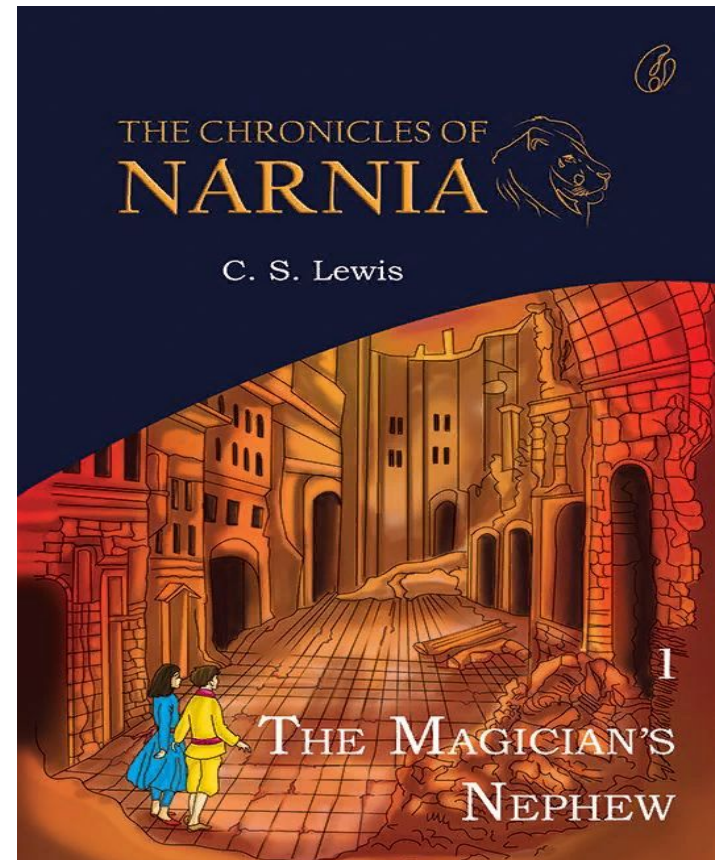
«Prince Caspian: Return to the army»

- * Prince Caspian features a "return to Narnia" by the four Pevensie children of the first novel, about a year later in England but 1300 years later in Narnia. The English siblings, legendary Kings and Queens of Narnia, are magically recalled, once again children, by the refugee Prince Caspian.

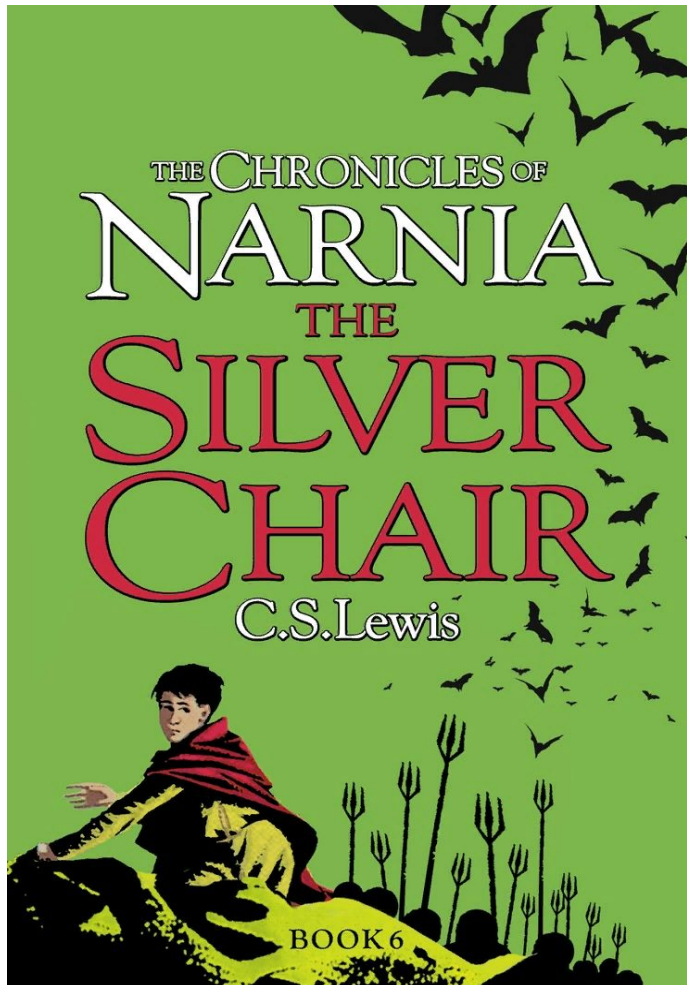


«The wizard's nephew»

- * The book is the backstory of the others; in it, Lewis explains how Narnia came to be, how the White Witch got into it, and why the children were able to get into Narnia through The wardrobe.



«The silver chair»



- * No one from the Pevensy family is going back to Narnia this time-Peter, Susan, Edmund, and Lucy are too old for that. The main characters of "the Silver chair" are Eustace Harm, who first appeared in "Conqueror of the dawn", and his classmate Jill Pole.

«The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe»



This film adaptation, released in 1979 in the United States, was the first and so far the last animated film based on the Chronicles of Narnia. Director Bill Melendez, known for a series of cartoons about the dog Snoopy, did not redraw the plot of Lewis in his own way and made the picture close to the text.

"Chronicles of Narnia: the lion, the witch, and the magic Cabinet" (2005)



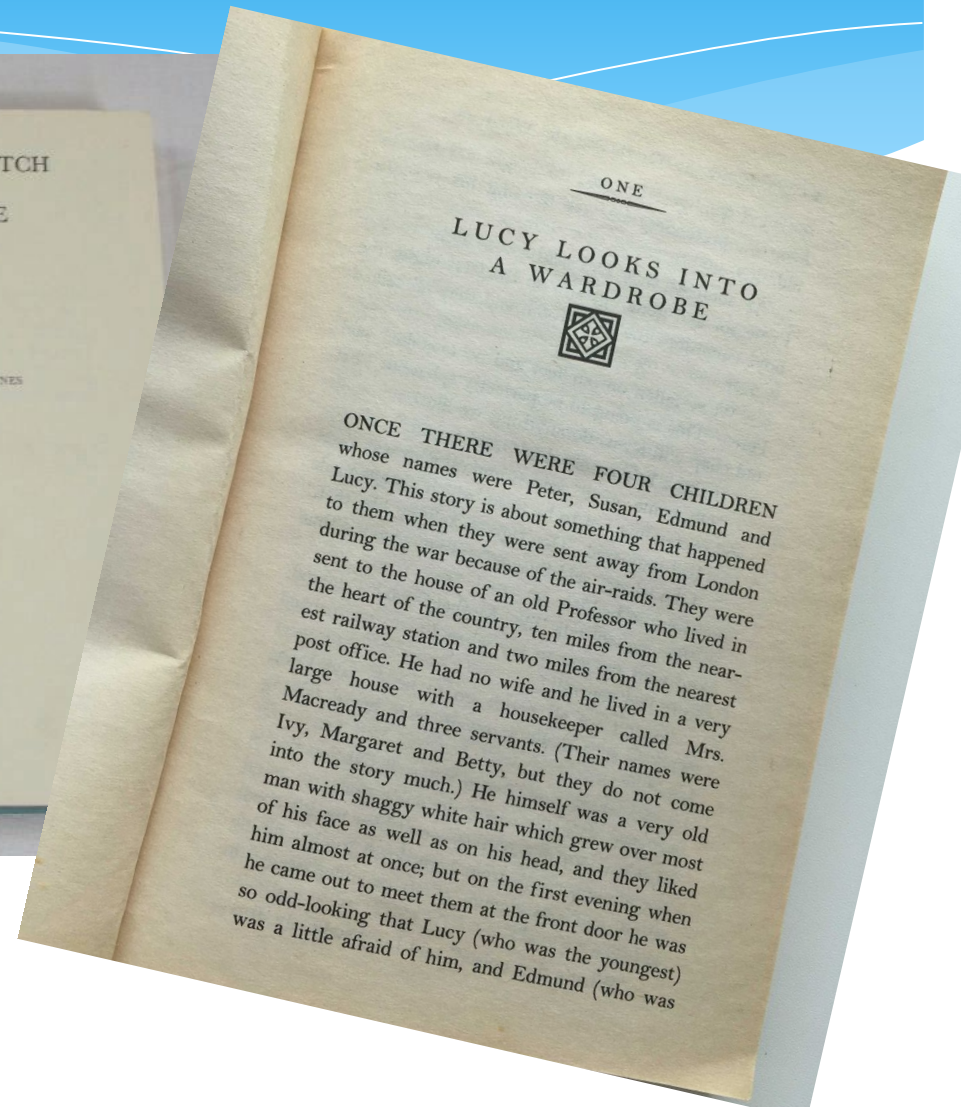
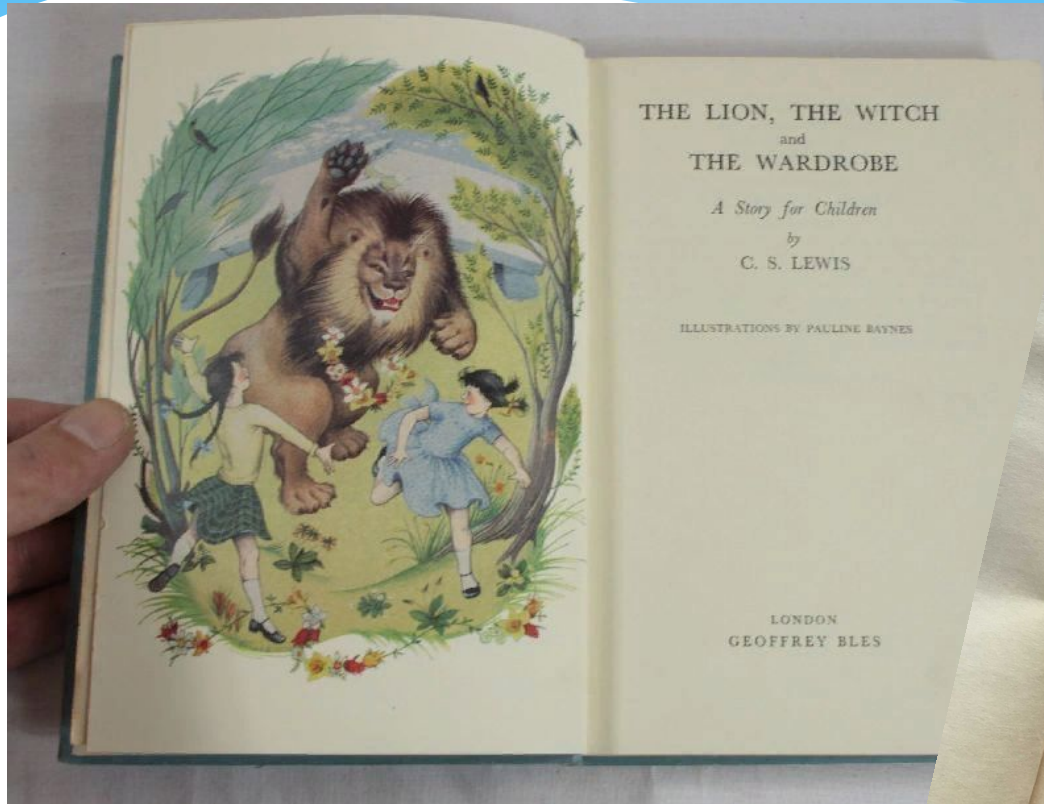
Director Andrew Adamson, famous for the fairy tale about the good Ogre Shrek, decided to take a risk and started shooting the Chronicles of Narnia. Adamson chose not to deviate from the original source in the script and also tried to make the film as close as possible to the book by Clive Lewis. The creators made Narnia as lively and realistic as possible. Fairy-tale landscapes, chambers of the White witch, magical animals and creatures delight the eye.

Chronicles Of Narnia:Prince Caspian (2008)

Andrew Adamson did not strictly adhere to the text of the original source. "Prince Caspian" is more compact than the book, and the script is clear and understandable. The film captivates with a strong visual component. Much attention is paid to the makeup, costumes, and weapons of the heroes. Computer special effects, which are used to create mythical creatures, an army of animated trees and other wonders, deserve a positive assessment.
