

Reported Speech



Direct speech

She says, "The lessons begin at 9 o'clock."

Она говорит: «Занятия начинаются в 9 часов».

Reported speech

She says **that** the lessons begin at 9 o'clock.

Она говорит, что занятия начинаются в 9 часов.



Direct to Reported Speech

1. Pronouns

She said, "I will buy a dress." – Она сказала: «Я куплю платье».

She said that <u>she</u> would buy a dress. – Она сказала, что купит платье.

2. Tenses (if the reporting verb belongs to the Past tense)

a) She <u>says</u>, "I *am watching* a movie".

She says that she *is watching* a movie.

b) He <u>said</u>, "I *am playing* football".

He said that he **was playing** football.



Tense Changes

1. Present Simple ☐ Past Simple

Ex. Ann said, "I **watch** a match."

Ann said that she **watched** a match.

2. Present Continuous Past Continuous

Ex. Mother said, "I am cooking the dinner."

Mother said that she was cooking the dinner.

3. Past Simple Past Perfect

Ex. He said, "I **bought** two tickets."

He said that he **had bought** two tickets.

4. Present Perfect Past Perfect

Ex. She said, "I have worked hard."

She said that she had worked hard.

Direct Speech	Reported Speech
today	that day
now	then
tonight	that night
last (week)	the (week) before / the previous (week)
yesterday	the day before

Reporting verbs

to say something/<u>to</u> somebody to tell somebody something to explain

to ask

to wonder

to shout

to want to know

Reported Questions

In **reported questions**, the subject comes before the verb/auxiliary verb. While reporting **questions**, we have to use an appropriate reporting verb like <u>ask</u>.

WH-questions

We introduce reported question-word questions with **ask + question word**:

Direct	Indirect
Where does he live?	He <u>asks</u> where he <u>lives</u> .
Where do you live?	He <u>asked</u> me where I <u>lived</u> .

- Note that the reported question has no auxiliary "do".
- As with reported statements, we may need to change pronouns and tense as well as time in reported questions.

YES/NO questions

We introduce reported YES/NO questions with **ask + if**:

Direct	Indirect
Do you like coffee?	She <u>asks</u> if I <u>like</u> coffee.
Are you cold?	She <u>asked</u> me if I <u>was</u> cold.

- Note that the reported question has no auxiliary "do".
- As with reported statements, we may need to change pronouns and tense as well as time in reported questions.
