CSCE, Geneva

- 1973 - 21 July 1975



CSCE, Helsinki

- 30 July – 1 August 1975



Helsinki final act

- Signed by 35 states
- key commitments

- challenges of the post-Cold War period



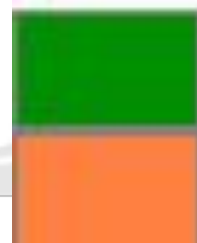
- 1995, January

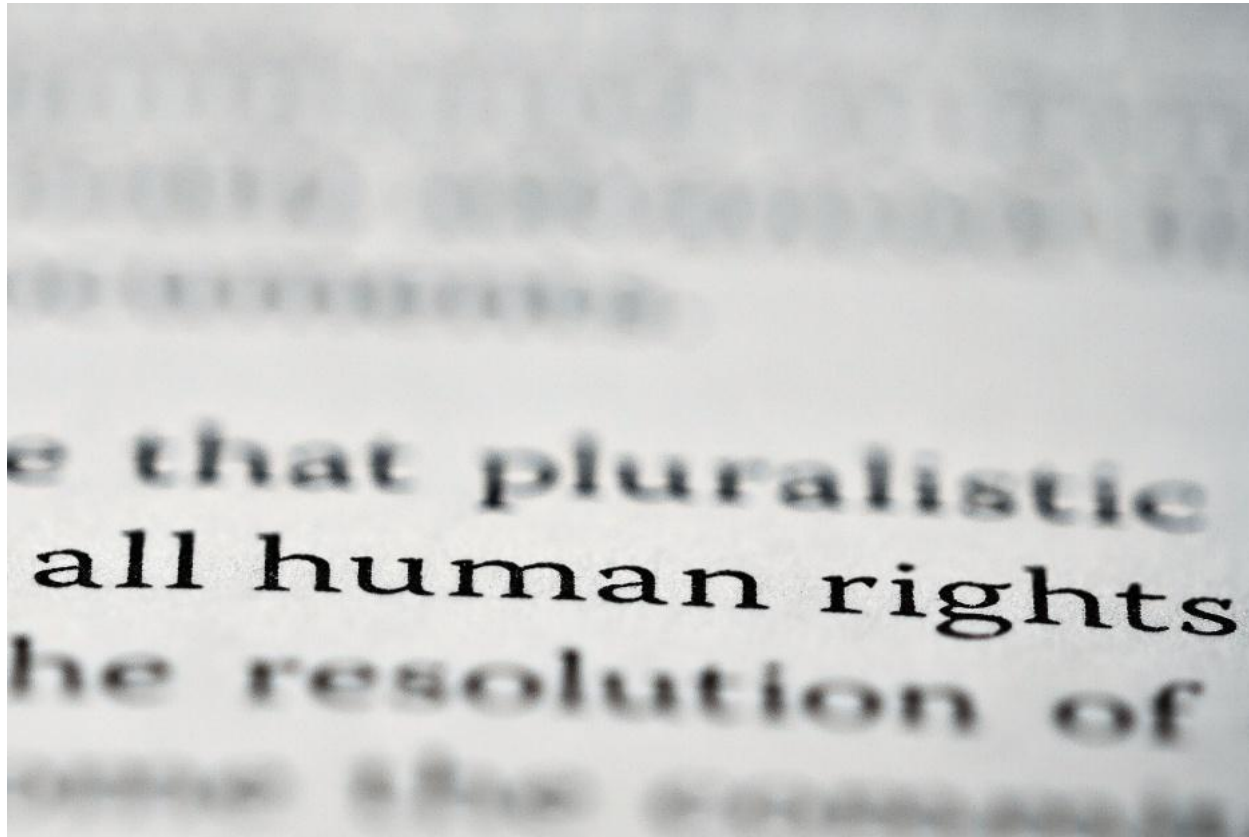

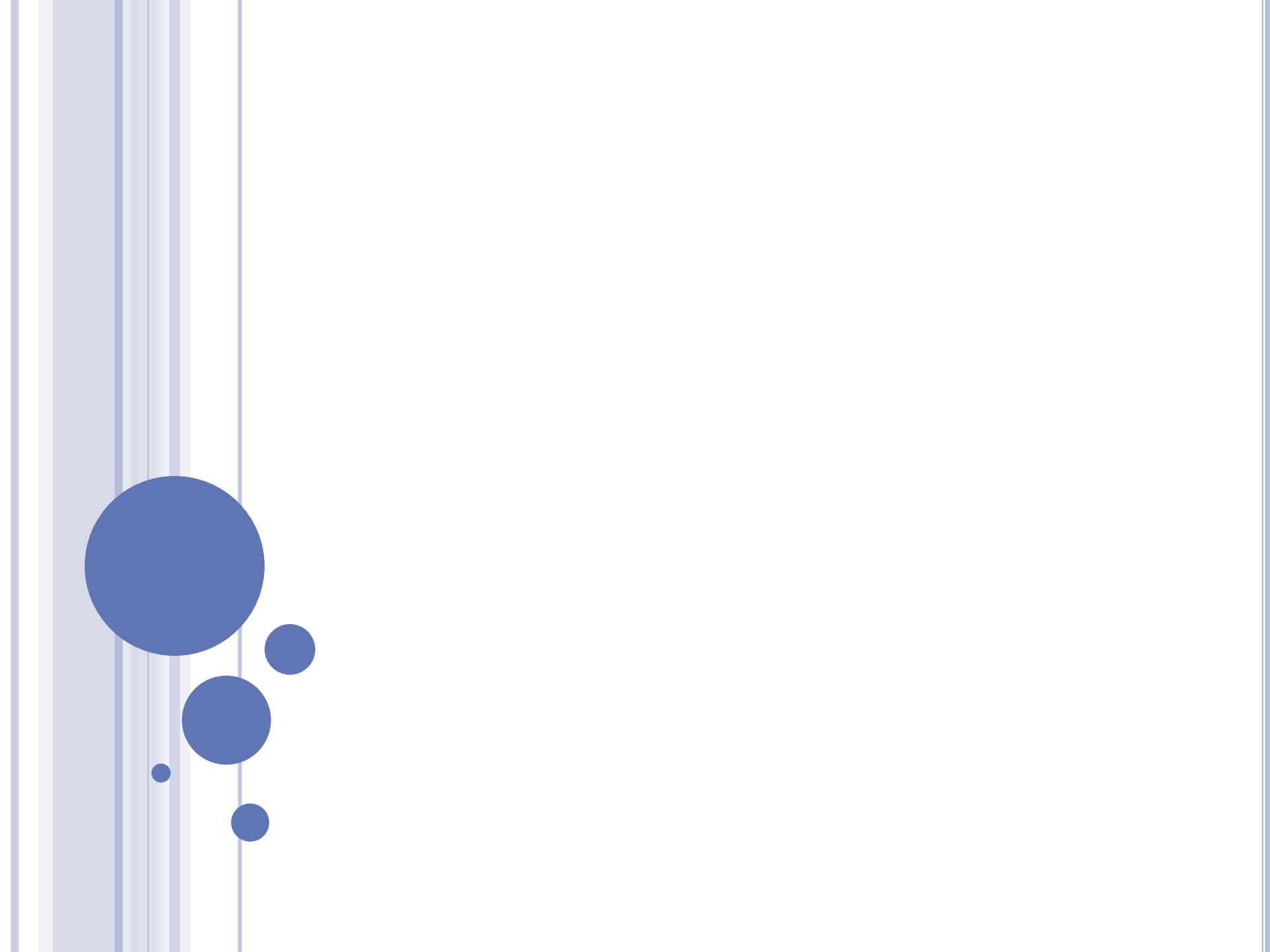


the OSCE's participating States undertook a commitment to respect all human rights, Copenhagen Document of 1990
