

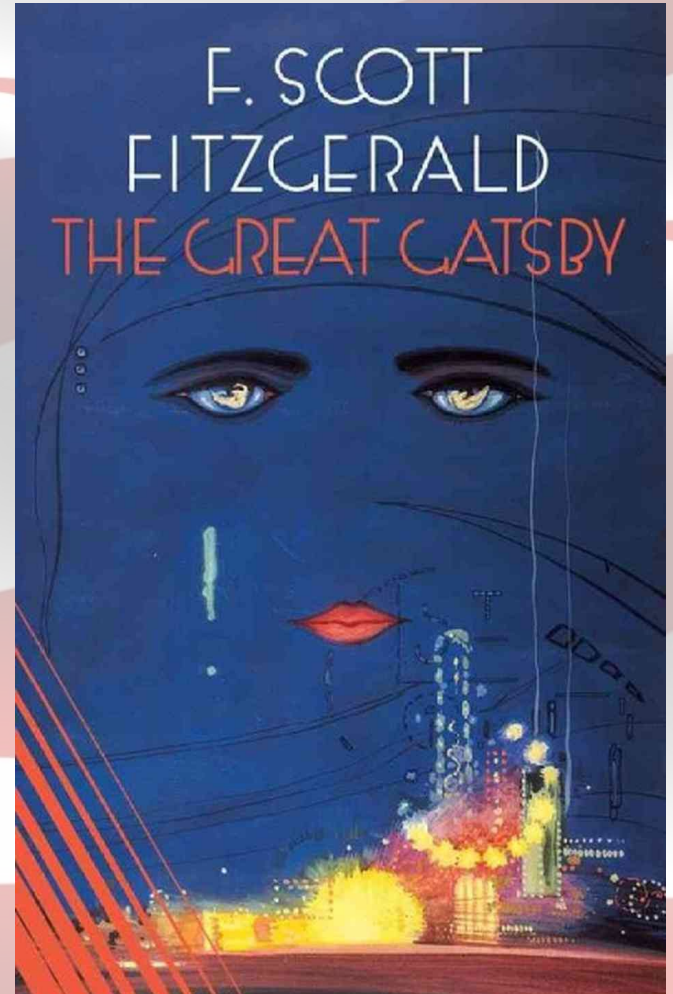

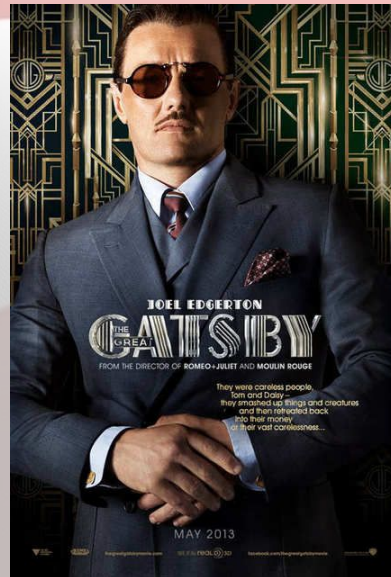
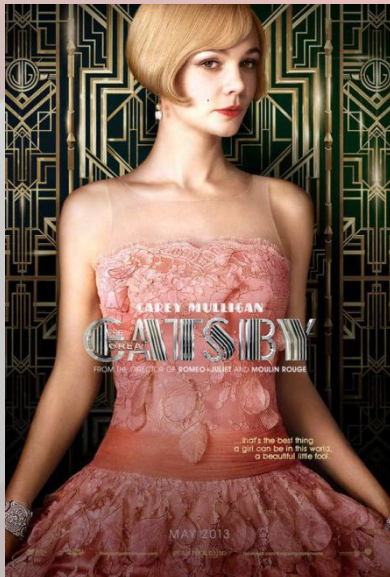
# First world problems

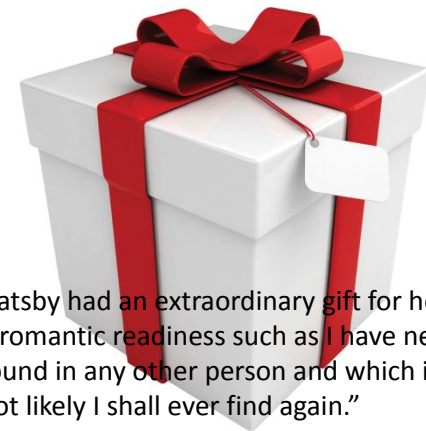


# Is Gatsby great?

Gatsby had an extraordinary gift for hope, a romantic readiness such as I have never found in any other person and which it is not likely I shall ever find again.”

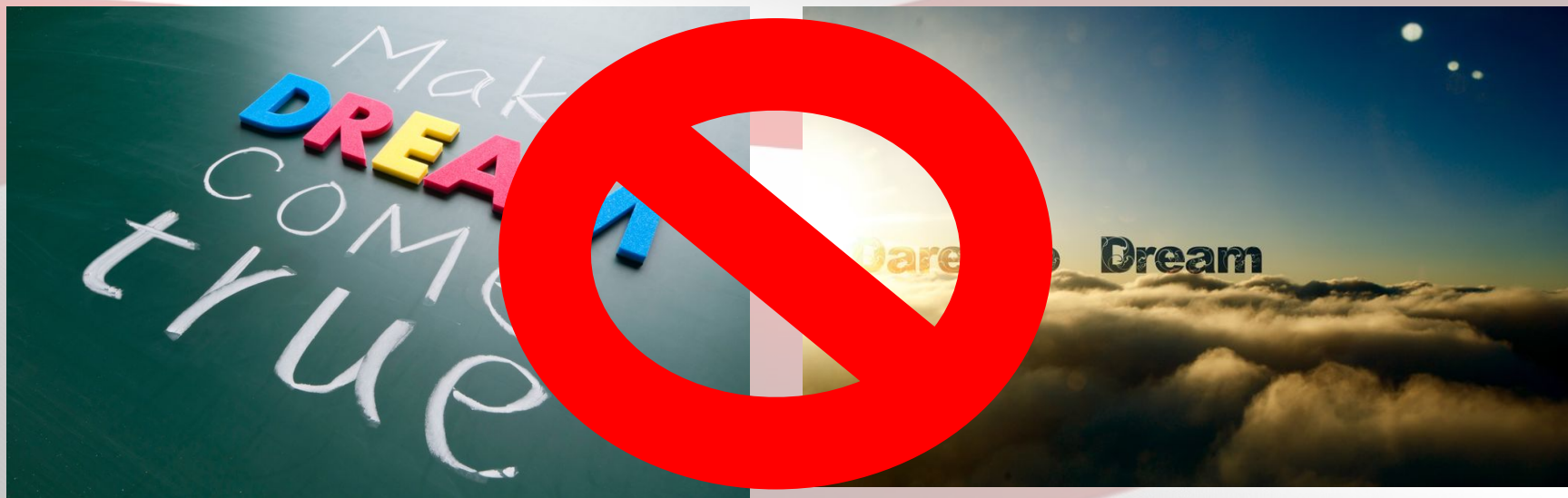
As for me, I didn't like Daisy...
