There two kinds of images:

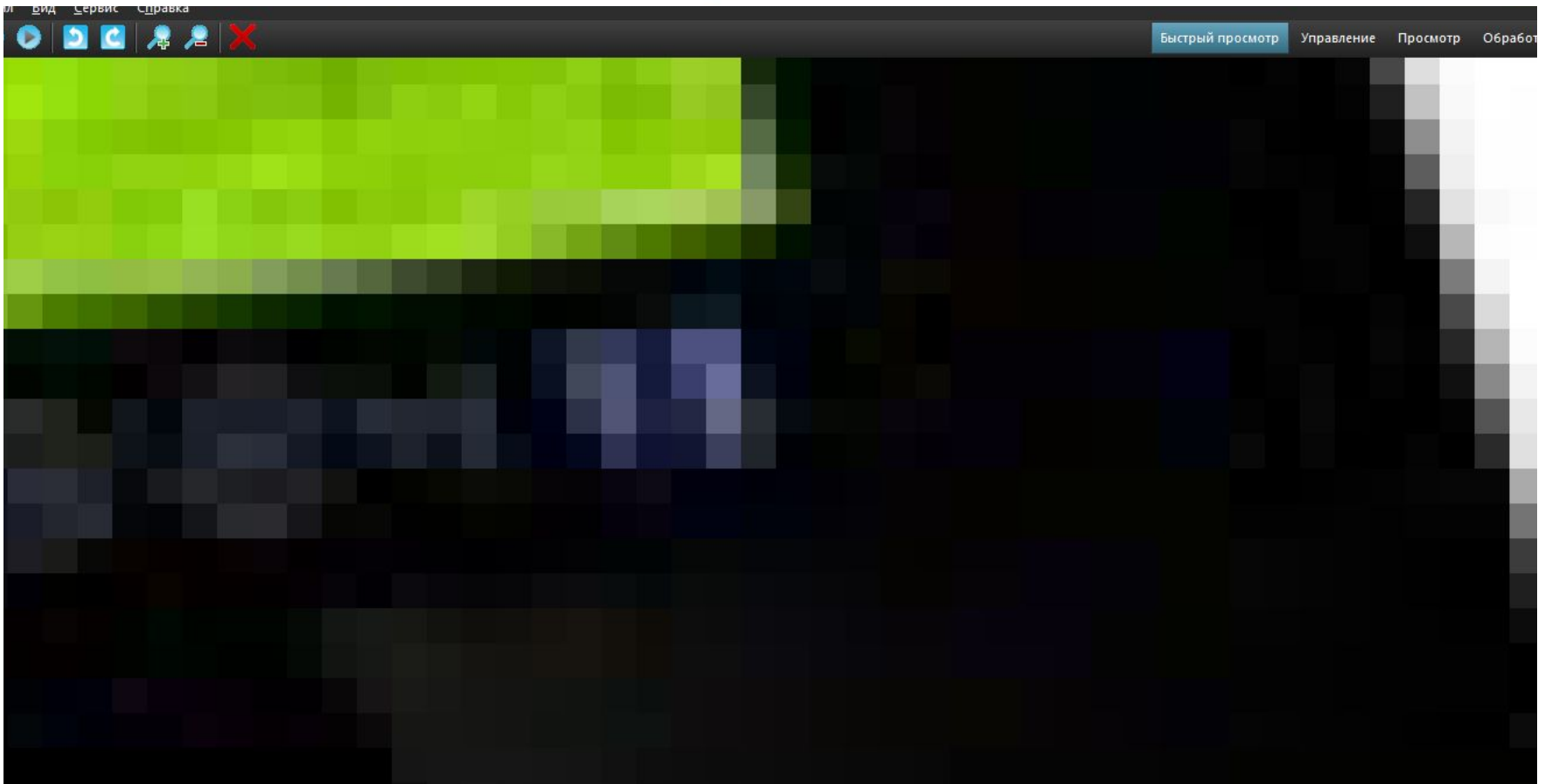
- **Raster** (or Bitmap)

**What the difference
between them?**

Raster image

- Image made up from pixels and dots
- When the image is enlarged, the pixels grow
- Pixelated

Where it's better to use raster format?

- On photos

Vector image

- Think: create dots and join the dots, you'll get a shape
- When image is enlarged – no loss in details

- **svg**
- **ai**

Where it's better to use vector format?

- When you need your photo to be both small and large
- When you are using texts (logo)
