What is a gerund?

A gerund is a verb which has become a noun by adding *ing*.

I like pizza.

Phrases, such as like pizza, can take on verbs in the form of gerunds.

eating making selling delivering



Steven finished the book.

Phrases, such as finished the book, can take on verbs in the form of gerunds.

When do we use gerunds?

We use gerunds to follow certain main verbs.

Here are some examples.



We like studying English.

We love studying English.

We dislike studying English.

We hate studying English.

Let's see how these main verbs work together with gerunds.

SUBJECT MAIN VERB GERUND PHRASE

Mary

started started stopped continued finished

studying at university
playing tennis
smoking cigarettes
working at the flower shop

Mary started working at the flower shop.

Mary stopped smoking cigarettes.

Mary continued working at the flower shop.

Mary finished playing tennis.

Mary started smoking cigarettes.

Mary stopped playing tennis.

Mary continued studying at

Mary finished studying at university.

Here are some more examples.

The kids feel like miss prefer

playing with their toyswatching cartoonsdrawing picturessinging songs

The kids enjoy watching cartoons.

The kids feel like playing with their toys.

The kids miss singing songs.

The kids prefer playing with their toys.

The kids enjoy singing songs.

The kids feel like drawing

The kids miss watching cartoons.

The kids prefer drawing pictures.

We have just seen how gerund phrases can be used as direct objects.

Smoking cigarettes makes people sick.
