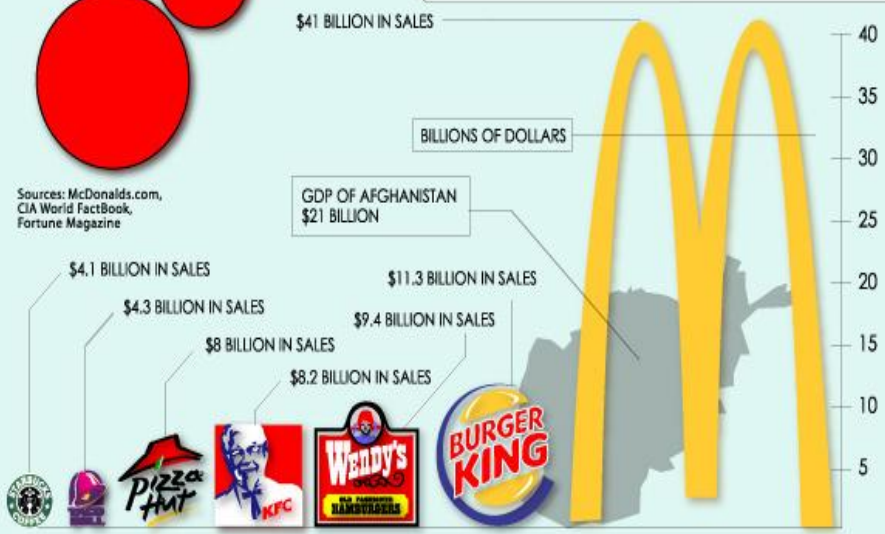
THE MAGIC BEAN SHOP
