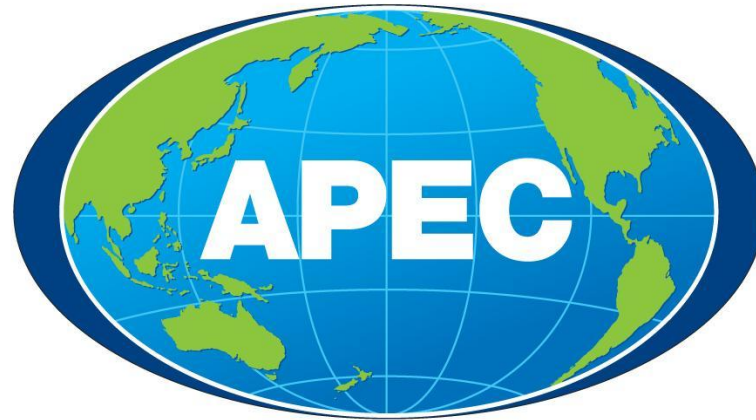

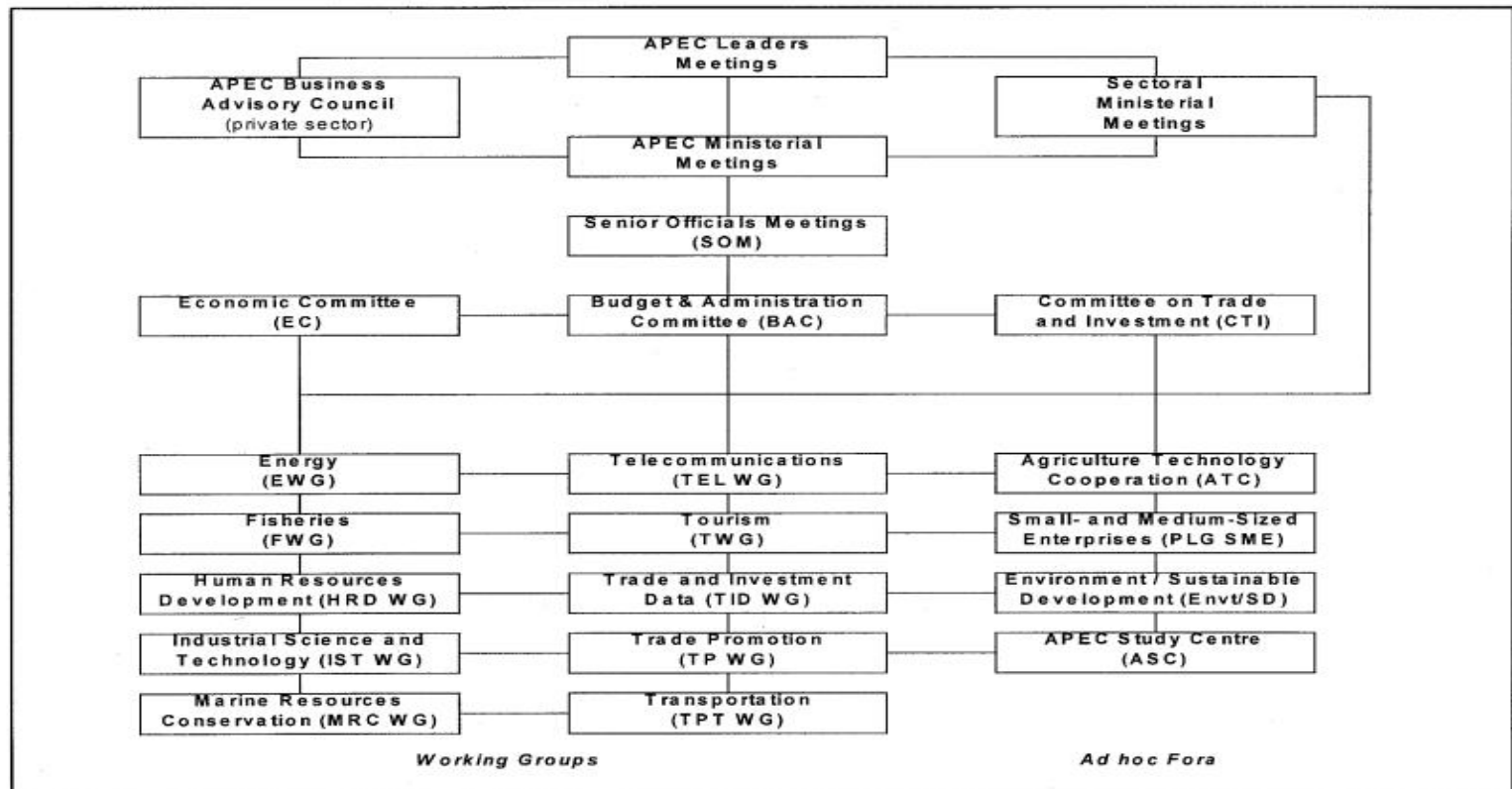

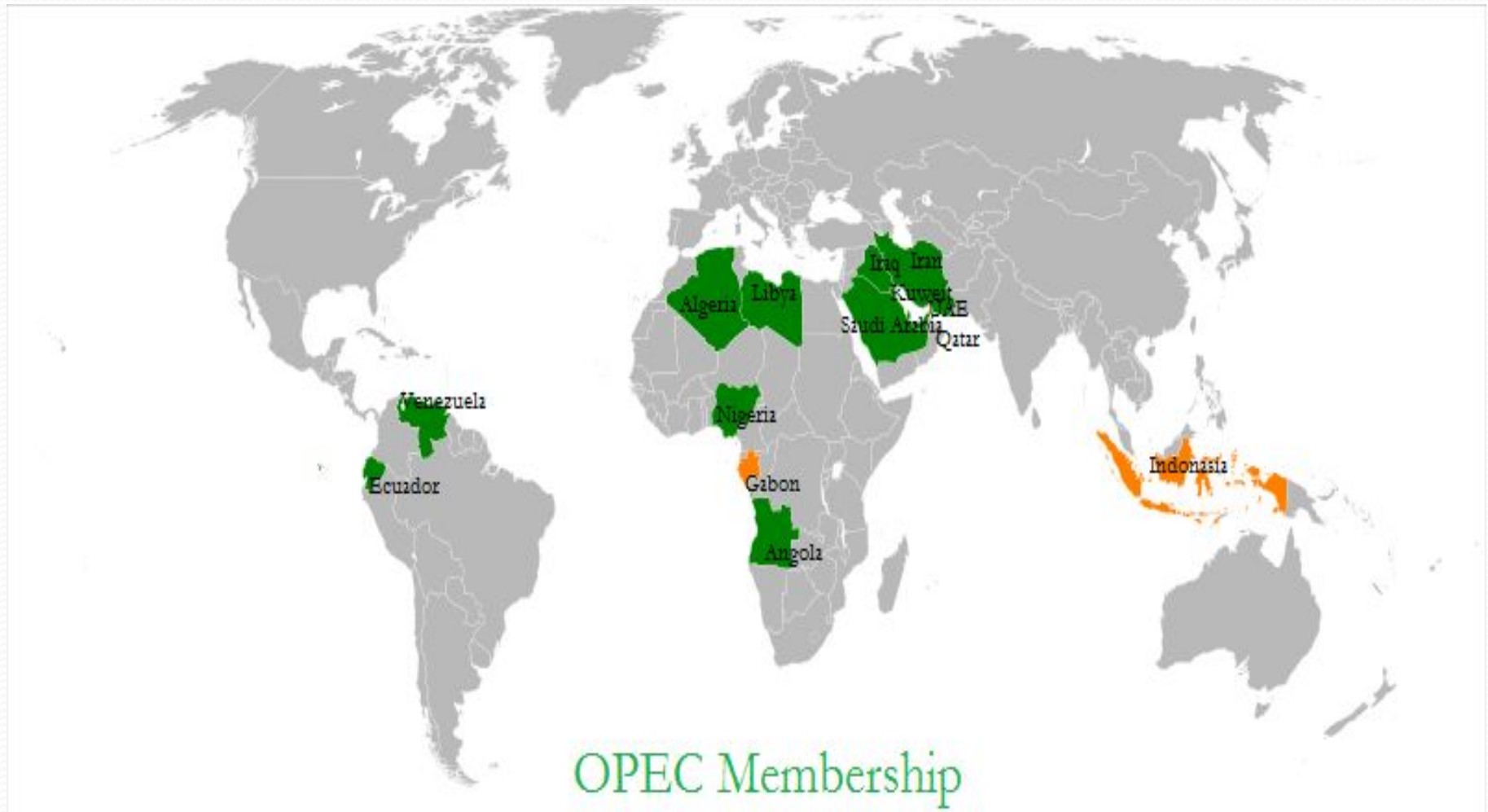
ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE OF APEC

Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries

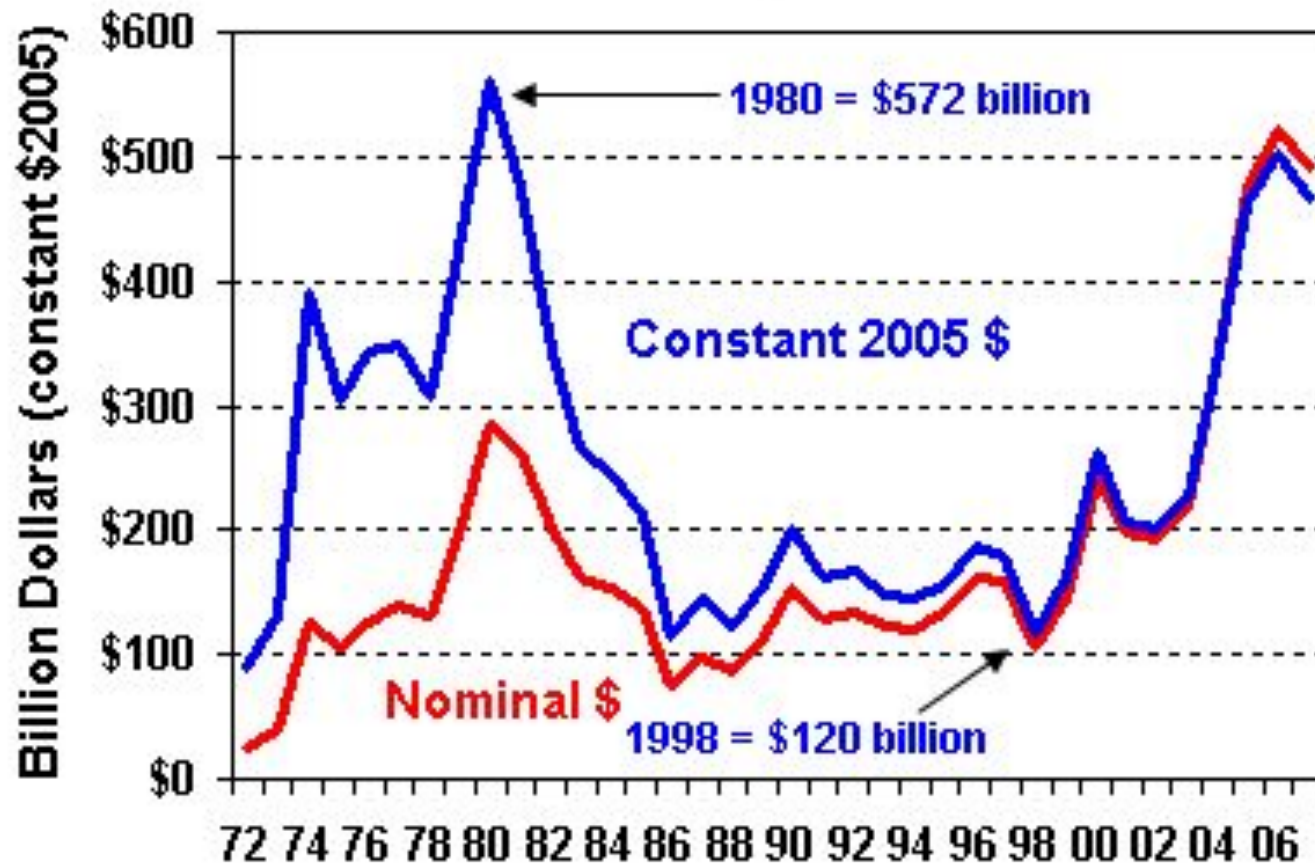


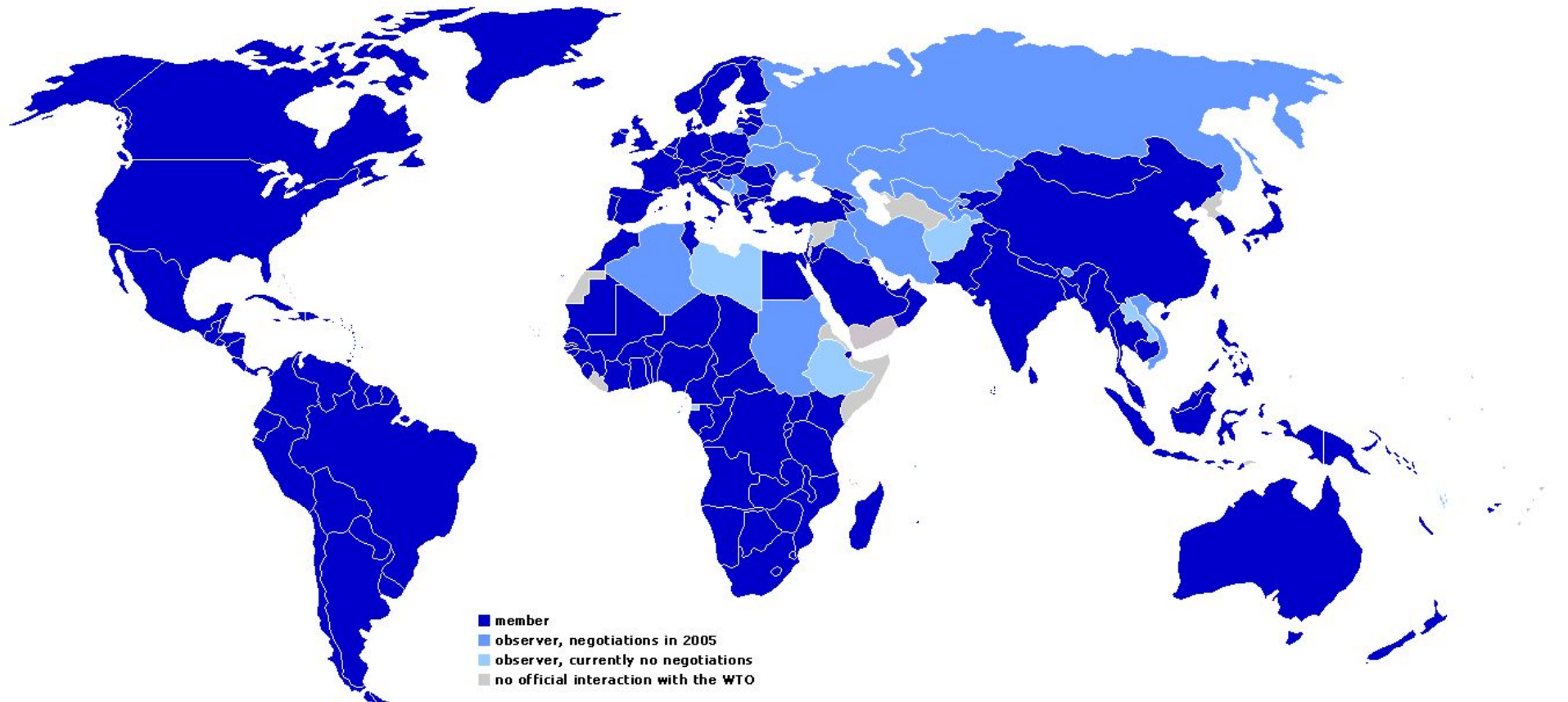

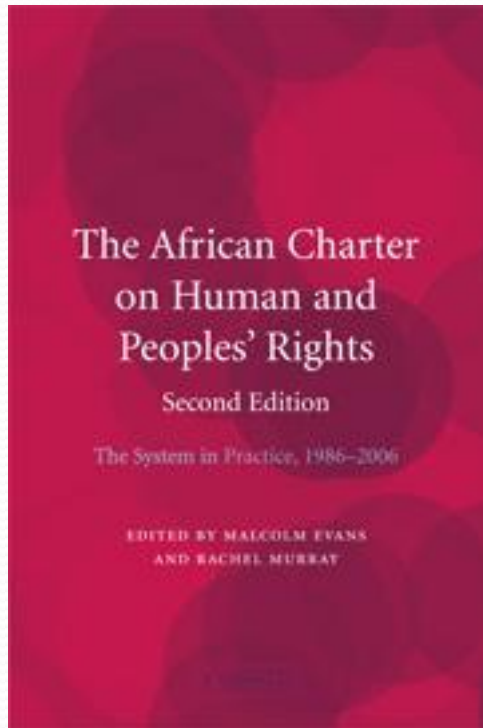


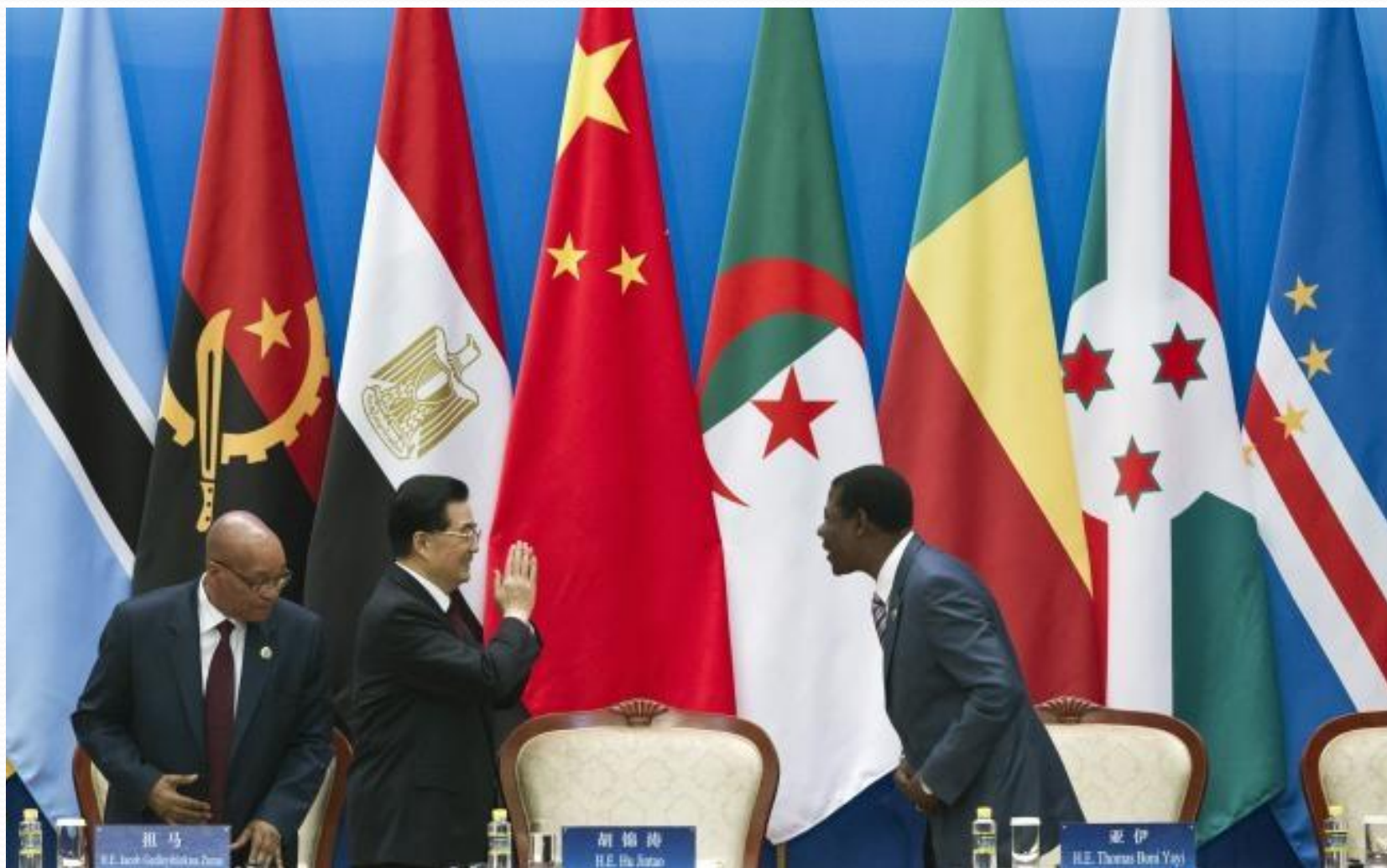
“An integrated, prosperous and peaceful Africa, driven by its own citizens and representing a dynamic force in global arena.”

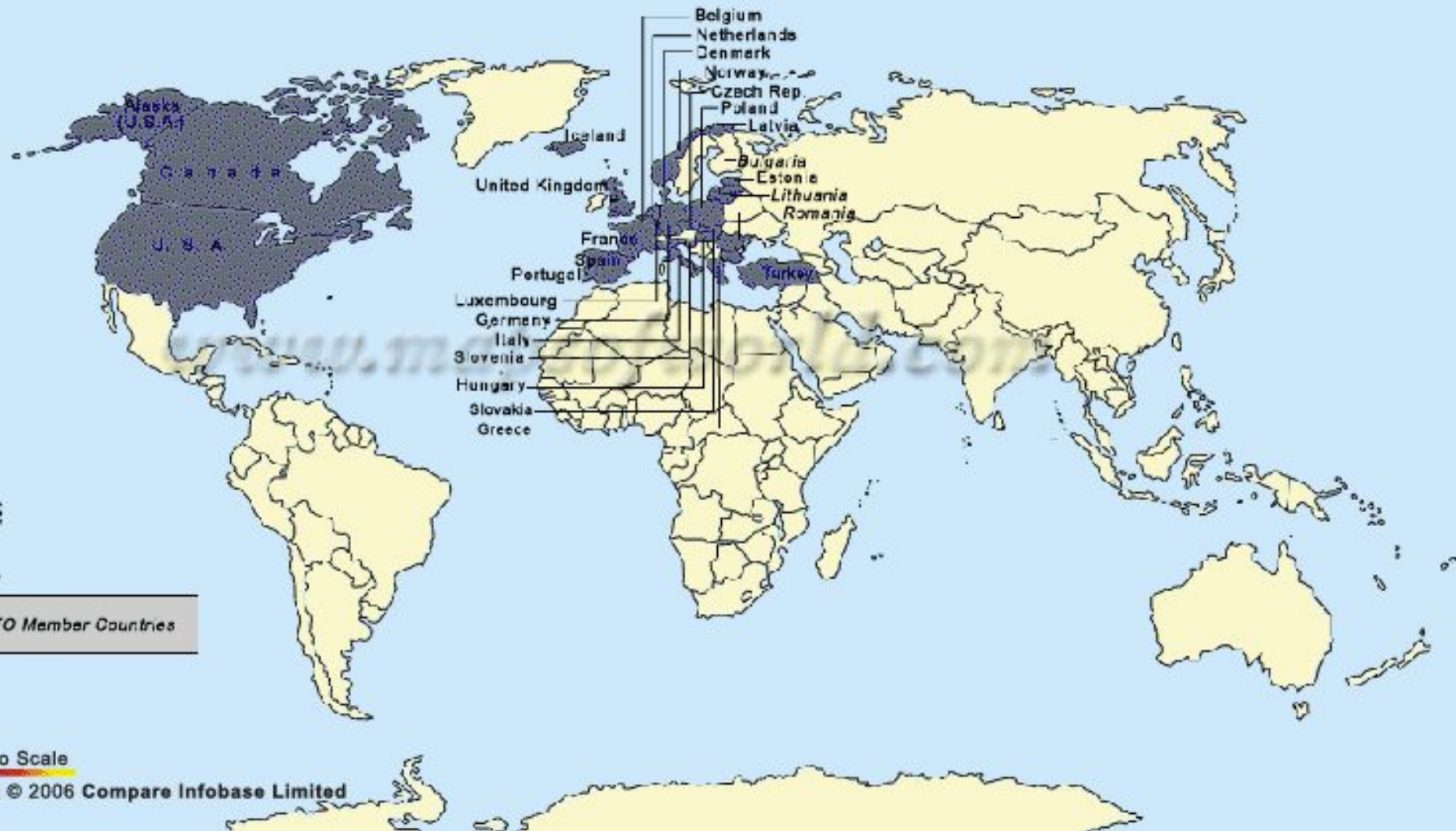
