The history of London begins about 43 AD when the Romans invaded the territory inhabited by the Celts in the southern part of Britain and called it **Londinium**.

On the second of September, 1666, a fire started in the house of the King's baker, who lived near The London Bridge. A strong wind quickly spread the fire and it was burning for 3 days.



THE HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT

The Houses of Parliament are located in Parliament Square on the Bank of the Thames. It is a majestic

building with two towers: Victoria Tower and Saint Stephan's Tower and a very big clock which is

called Big Ban. In the Houses of Parliament are more than 1000 rooms and

over 3 kilometres of corridors.
