

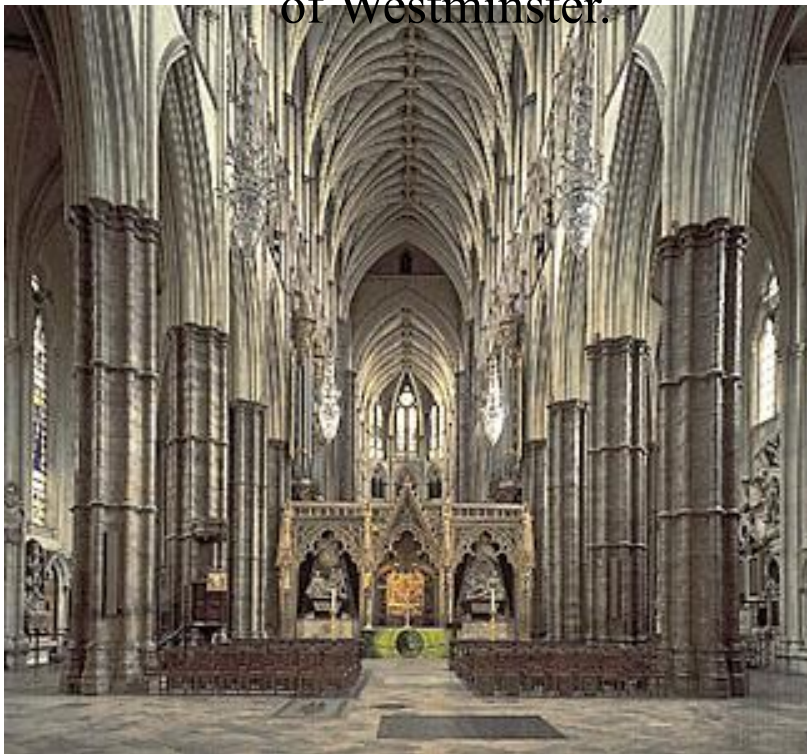

Westminster Abbey The Collegiate Church of St Peter at Westminster, popularly known as Westminster Abbey, is a large, mainly Gothic church, in the City of Westminster, London, located just to the west of the Palace of Westminster.



It is the traditional place of coronation and burial site for English, later British and later still (and currently) monarchs of the Commonwealth realms. The abbey is a Royal Peculiar and briefly held the status of a cathedral from 1540 to 1550.

Big Ben (born Big Ben) - the name of the largest of the six bells of Westminster Palace in London, often the name refers to the clock and clock tower as a whole, which since September 2012 has officially called the "Tower of Elizabeth"

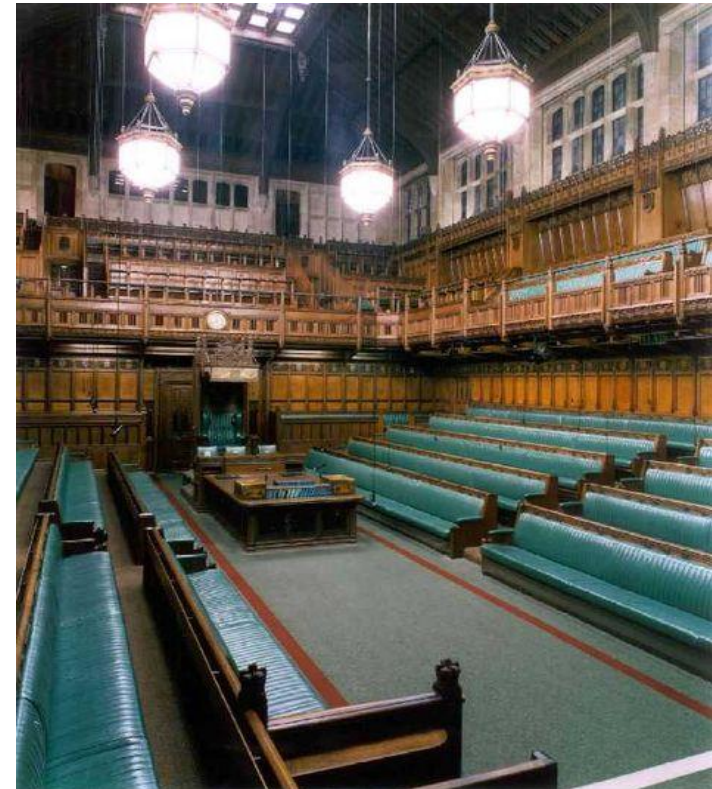


The famous Big Ben is located next to the Parliament.
