Occupied by the Soviet Union 1940, returned to Russia 1991 (see map)

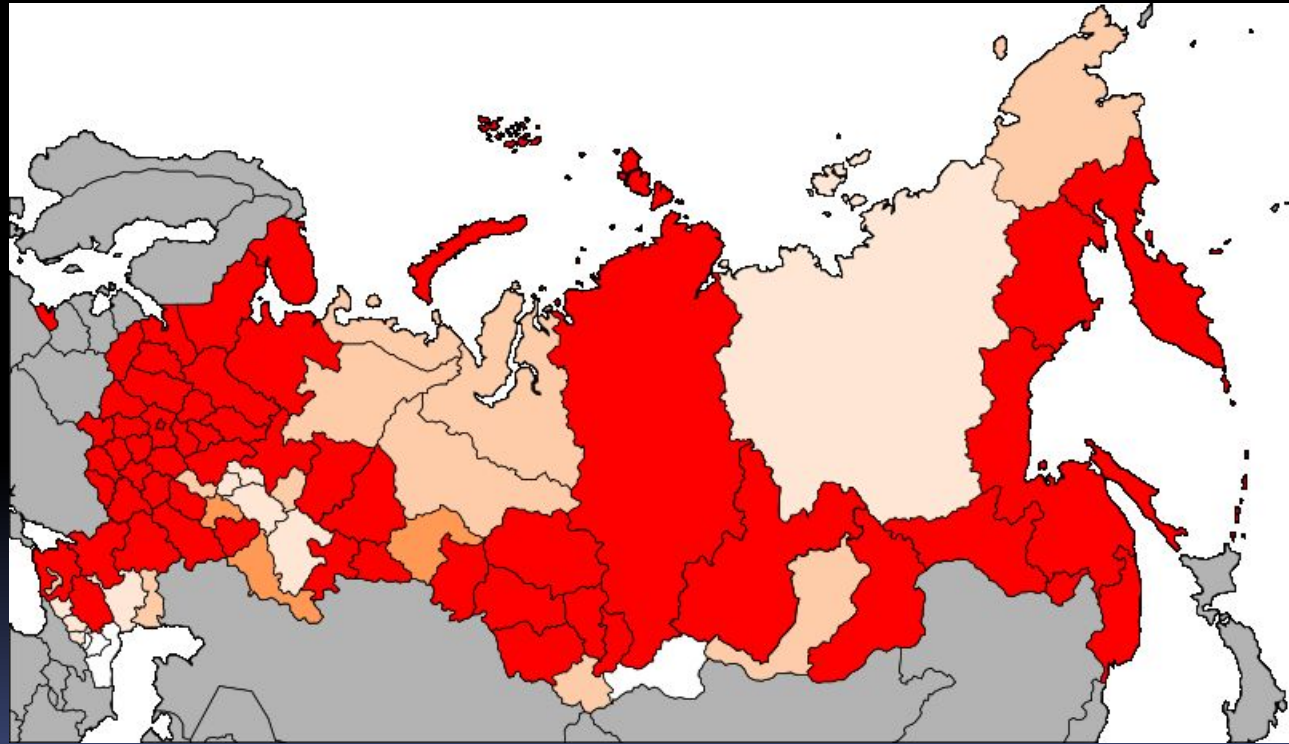

in Russia at the moment



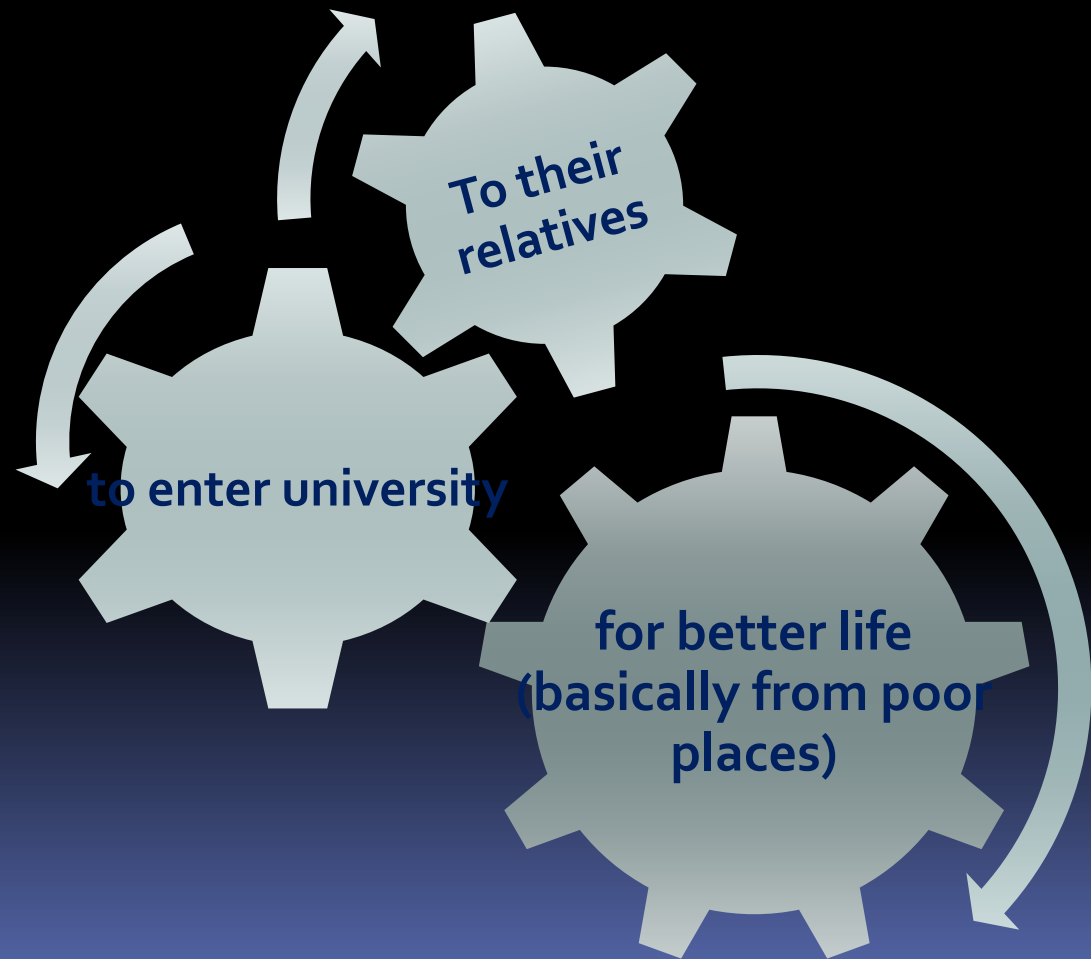


There are **1,473,754** people live in Novosibirsk and this city is the third biggest one.
