Statue of Yeltsin vandalized in Yekaterinburg

Police found a monument to Russian President Boris Yeltsin in Yekateirnburg vandalized on Friday.

Blue paint was used to disfigure an inscription of the leader's name, [RIA Novosti](#) reports.

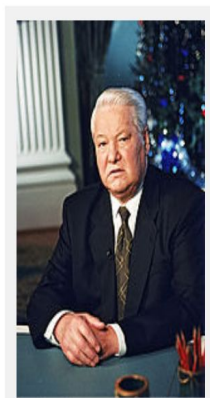
The statue was unveiled in February 2011 to mark the leader's 80th birthday. The 10-meter marble statue is located in Yeltsin's home town of Yekaterinburg, where the damage was discovered on Friday.

Yeltsin played a key role in burying the Soviet Union, leading to his role as Russia's first president. He died of heart failure in 2007.

The Communist Party said it would pay lawyer fees if the offenders were found, [RIA Novosti](#) reports.

"This support is due to the fact that we share the feelings of the political vandals and fear that their right for a fair trial could be violated," top party official Alexander Ivachyov wrote on his blog, [RIA Novosti](#) reports.

If convicted, the vandals face up to three months of detention.

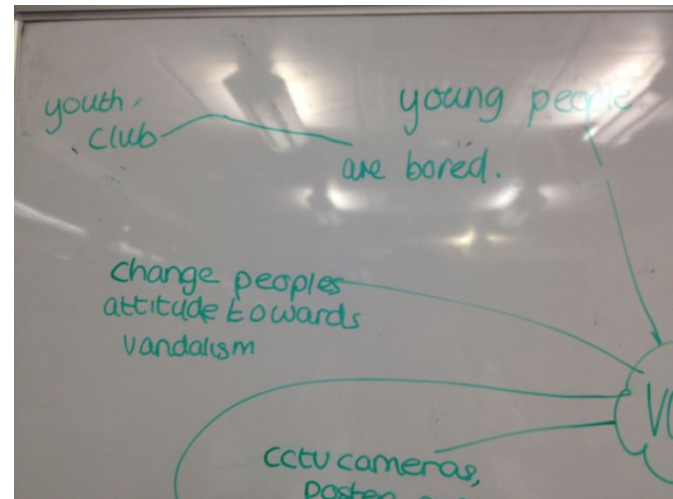
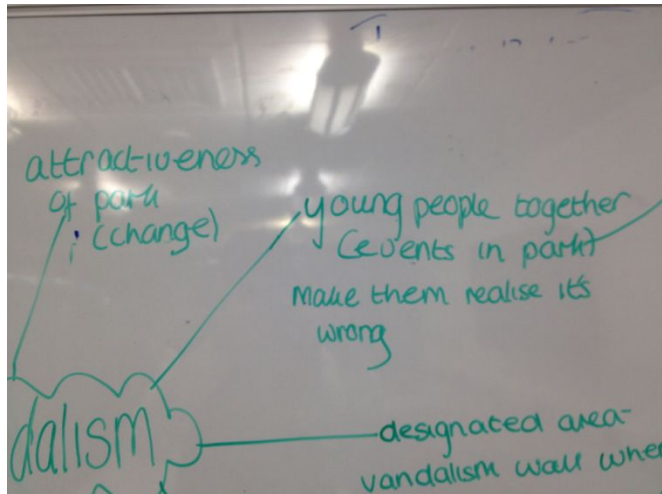
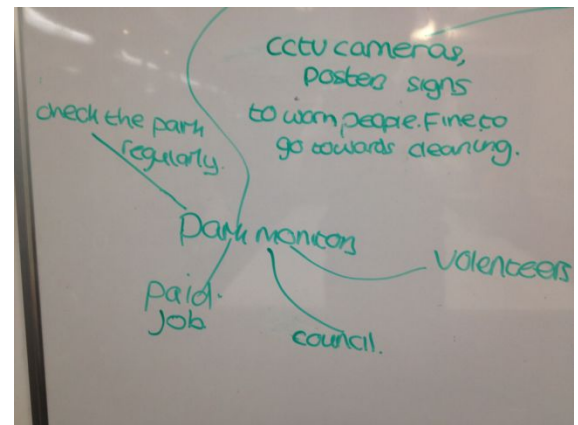
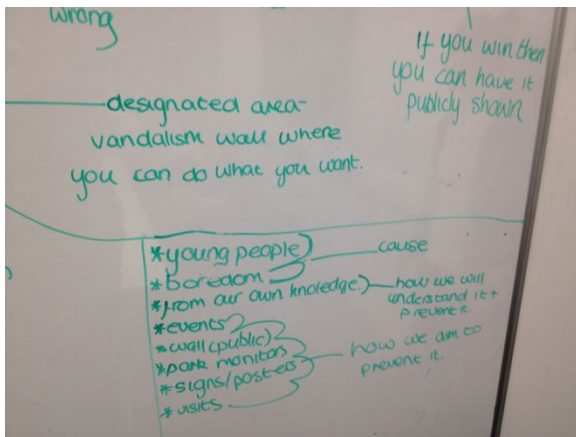
On Friday night, a monument to former Russian president Boris Yeltsin in central Yekaterinburg was doused with paint and lettering on its base was knocked off.

A police patrol discovered that the monument was defaced on Friday morning. The marble figure of Russia's first president was doused with blue paint. An investigative group has been formed to find the vandals.

Professional cleaners had to use chemicals to remove the paint, but replacing the letters will take time, the local police website said.

The perpetrators, if found, could face up to three months in jail on charges of vandalism.
