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- CASE IS A NOUNAL GRAMMATICAL CATEGORY EXPRESSING SYNTACTICAL RELATIONS BETWEEN NOUNS EITHER IN A SENTENCE OR IN A WORD-COMBINATION

The definition to know...

COMMON

- Expresses ANY OTHER RELATIONS (by prepositions)
- Write TO an old friend
- Walk AROUND the city
- Write WITH a pen
- Made BY a man

POSSESSIVE

- Expresses the POSSESSIVE relations between nouns.(four types of relation)

TYPES OF CASES

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RELATION DENOTED

- POSSESSION (father's bag)
- PART AND THE WHOLE (house's roof, fox's tail)
- QUALITATIVE (mile's walk, yesterday's paper, world's map)
- SUBSTITUTION (at the butcher's, at the sister's)

FORMAL PRESENTATION

- DEPENDANT GENITIVE (the main noun needed *relations 1-3*)
- ABSOLUTE GENITIVE (used without main noun *relation 4*)

- **several object belong to one person**

BOY'S BAGS; WOMAN'S GLOVES, EDITOR-IN- CHIEF
DAUGHTER'S CAT.

one object belongs to a group of people

STUDENTS' BAG, CHILDREN'S ROOM,
AMARY AND HELEN'S BOOK

several objects belong to a group of people

STUDENTS' BAGS, MEN'S ROOMS, LADIES' ROOMS, HELEN
AND MARY'S TOYS

PART AND TH WHOLE RELATION

- SUBJECTIVE GENITIVE
- LOCATIVE GENITIVE (DISTANCE, OR LOCATION)

- (Tom's steps, Jane's smile)
He lives at a kilometre's distance from here

Moscow is Russia's greatest cultural centre.

The «Neva's» cargo consisted of wheat

Russia has the world's largest deposits of oil.

TEMPORATIVE GENITIVE (TIME)

It was **five days' walk** (a five day walk)

Look at **Monday's paper**
New Year's Day is always a happy holiday

NOUNS MAKE THE GENITIVE??**

- IF TWO NOUNS FOLLOW EACH OTHER BUT NOT MAKE A UNIT

He is the father of my sister's husband. (*Он отец мужа моей сестры – ОТЕЦ МУЖА , НО НЕ СЕСТРЫ...*)

- IF TWO NOUNS FOLLOW EACH OTHER AND MAKE A UNIT

My elder brother Peter's son is very ill. (*Сын моего старшего брата Петра очень болен*).
