



#### CREATING JOHN DILLINGER

#### Who was John Dillinger?



During a crime spree lasting from September 1933 to July 1934, John Dillinger's gang killed fen men, wounded seven more, robbed seventeen banks, and staged three jail breaks.

The Dillinger gang was mobile, disciplined, and highly organized. Local police could not fouch them. They were among a number of criminal gangs that rose to national prominence at the same time, prompting the Justice Department. Bureau of Investigation (later renamed the Federal Bureau of Investigation) to Jaunch an all our war on crime.


The public viewed John Diffinger as a romantic and exciting public figure. He charmed his cohorts, the press and even his victims. Diffinger collected his press dippings, carrying copies in his packets. He actively honed his media image, creating a signature style that included leaping over bank counters and dressing. In fashionable clothing

The Justice Department named Dillinger America's first Public Enemy Number One on June 22, 1934—his 31st birthday—and laid a \$10,000 reward on his head. Exactly one month later, they got their man.
