


Travelling

Sometimes it is necessary to leave your house & just have a rest.







The visitor unfamiliar with its history might be surprised that such a modern and enterprising city preserves its historic Gothic center almost intact, or by the curious contrast between the maze of narrow streets and buildings of the modern urban planning. Barcelona's old city is, without doubt, one of the nicest and most romantic of Europe. Its small streets, shops, the air you breathe, everything invites you to wander around, getting to know every place of this charming area.



The most notable places are Las Ramblas I which s a tree-lined pedestrian boulevard packed with living statues, mimes and architectural monuments. Next door is La Rambla's most colourful market, the Mercat de la Boqueria.. La Rambla terminates at the lofty Monument a Colom (Monument to Columbus) and the harbour. As for the ancient architecture the Barri Gotic contains a concentration of medieval Gothic buildings only a few blocks northeast of La Rambla, and furthermore it is the nucleus of old Barcelona.



La Sagrada Familia is also truly awe-inspiring - even if you don't have much time, don't miss it. The life's work of Antoni Gaudí, the magnificent spires of the unfinished cathedral imprint themselves boldly against the sky with swelling outlines inspired by the holy mountain Montserrat.



Montjuic, the hill overlooking the city centre from the southwest, is home to some fine art galleries, leisure attractions, among them are very beautiful singing fountains. Moreover Barcelona is certainly among Europe's cities of style. It is a natural magnet for the fashion-conscious and there is no shortage of design outlets for even the most tireless consumer.





Two years ago I made the acquaintance of Dresden. This city on the Elbe, once known as the "Florence of the North," cultural treasures, lively restaurants and trendy shops coexist with the residue of a dark history. Today it is very much a sightseer's destination with some fantastic buildings. It has two main sections, the Neustadt ("new town," which is actually older than the "old town") on the right bank of the Elbe and the Altstadt ("old town") on the left bank.





Frauenkirche | Standing again proudly on Neumarkt square, Dresden's Church of Our Lady is an architectural icon. The Zwinger | This courtyard complex was originally built as the forecourt of a castle. Today it is a pleasant place to wander about and enjoy the architecture that surrounds it.

The Zwinger is home to the Semper Art Gallery, the Porcelain Collection, and several other museums.






Dresden and the name "Semper Oper House" are inseparable., Don't miss guided tours which offer a glimpse inside. These places are also worth seeing:

The Brühlsche Terrasse above the Elbe River is somewhat called "Europe's Balcony." Originally designed as a private garden for the Saxon Count Brühl, this promenade is now the best place to enjoy good views of the Neustadt. Der FürsteThe "Procession of Princes" in Dresden which is a remarkable panorama made up of porcelain tiles which distinguished people walking in the procession.
