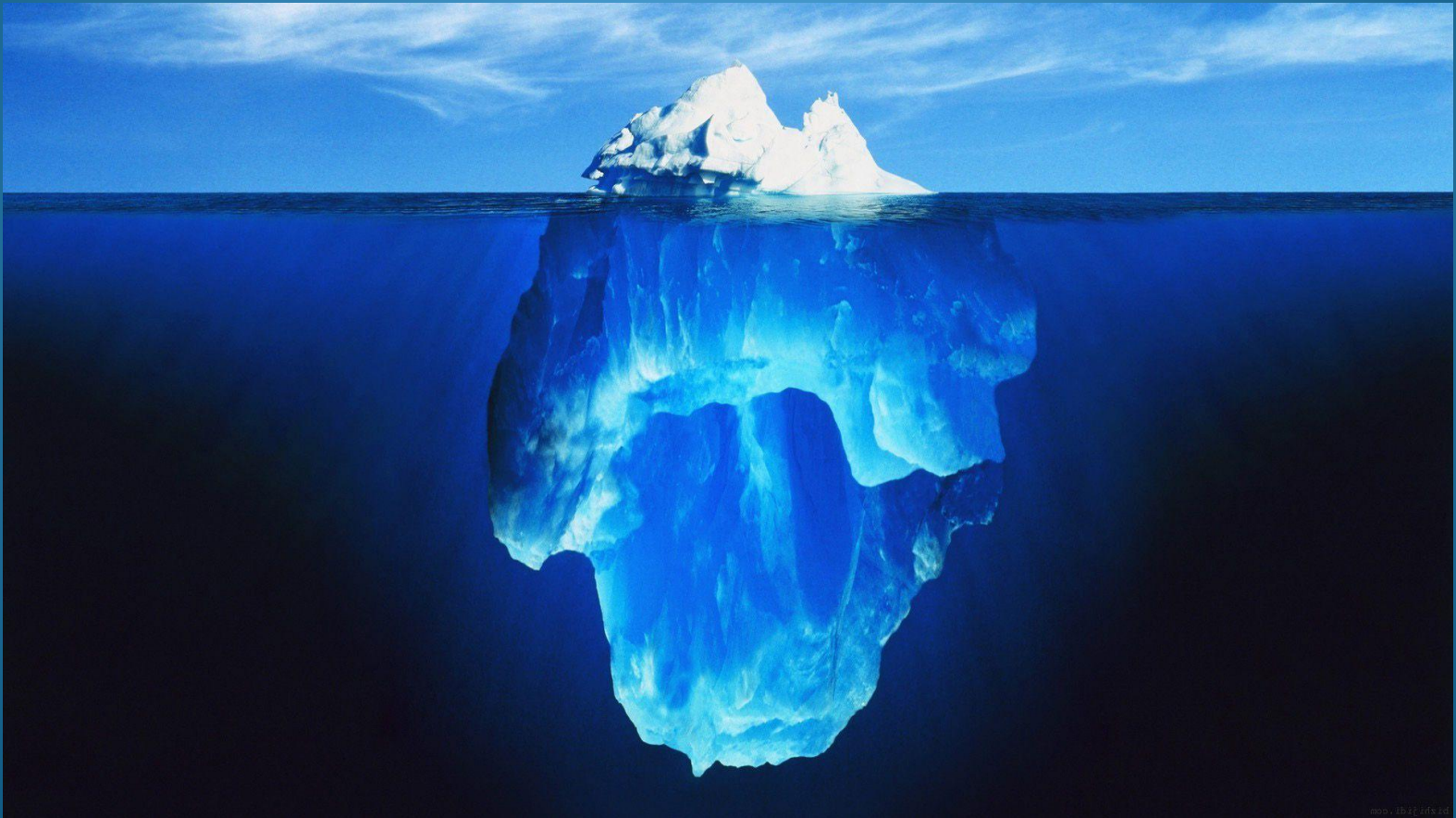

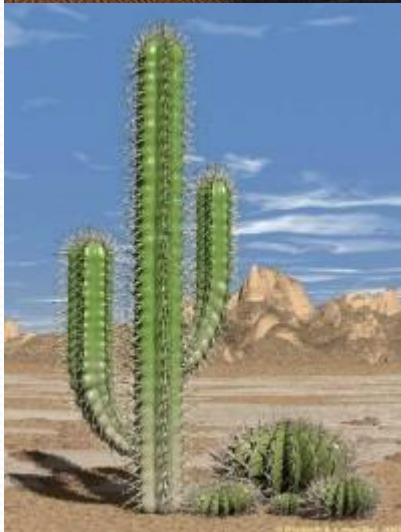

West Ireland Whale Watch

Humpback Whales

Length 15m

Weight 30 tone's

These whales are famous for their long songs and big jumps. We sometimes see them, about three times a week, but they're never around for long so be ready to take a photo



Fin Whales

Length 20m

Weight 80 tones

Fin whales live for up 100 years. They are common in the North Atlantic and we often see them near Ireland



Killer whales

Length 8m

Weight 8 tones

These animals eat 400 kilograms every day and they often eat other whales we occasionally see them, about twice a month:

Minke whales

Length 10m

Weight 10 tones

These creatures usually swim alone, but they sometimes feed in pairs. We usually see them because they like cold water



Bottlenose dolphins

Length 3m

Weight 500 kg

These dolphins are very active and jump very high. We always see them. We guarantee great photos every day!
