

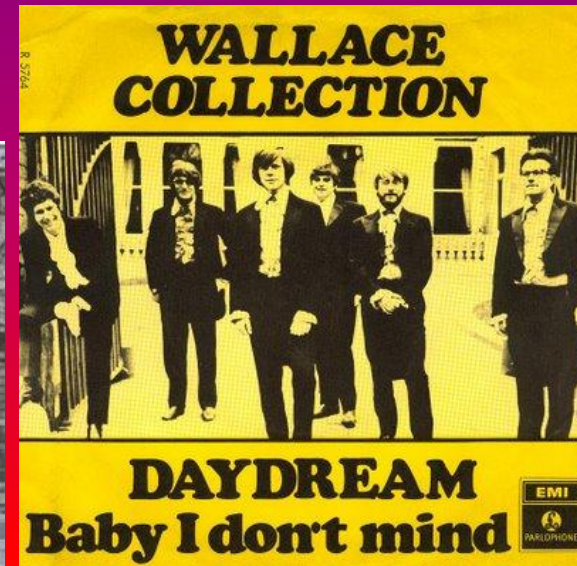

- London's public art galleries include the National gallery, the National portrait Gallery, the Tate Gallery and the Wallace Collection. Art exhibits are held at the Royal Academy of Arts and at the Hayward Gallery.



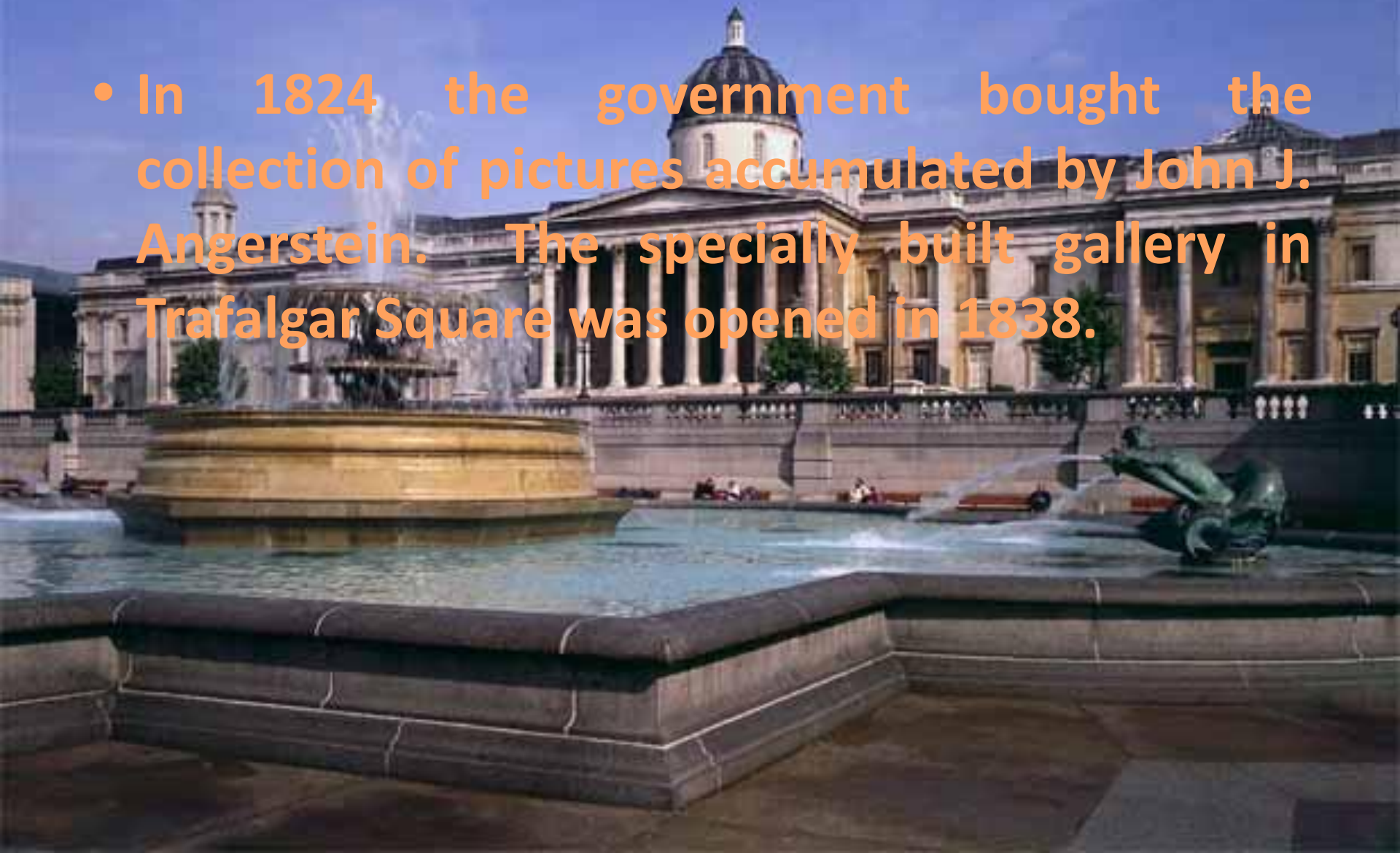
The National Gallery

- The National Gallery houses one of the finest collections of masterpieces in the world.



THE NATIONAL GALLERY

- In 1824 the government bought the collection of pictures accumulated by John J. Angerstein. The specially built gallery in Trafalgar Square was opened in 1838.



The National Gallery

- Italian painting includes works by Botticelli and Leonardo da Vinci.



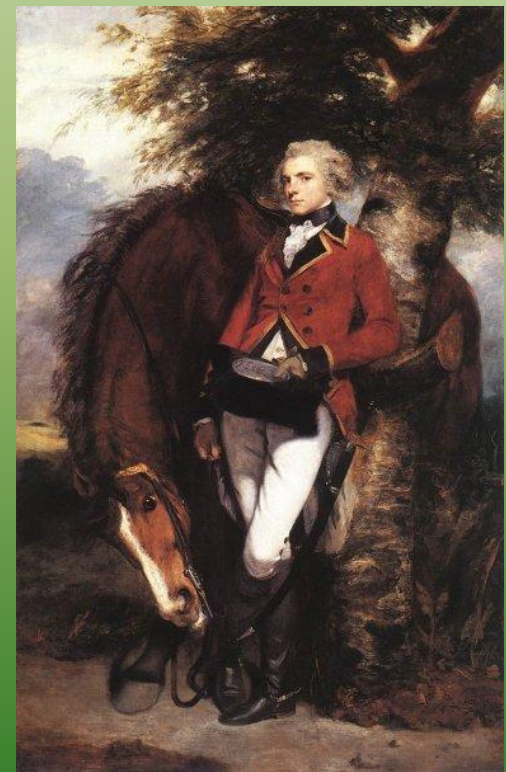
West wing

- Paintings of the Dutch and Flemish school includes the works of Rembrandt, Rubens and Van Dyck.



North wing

- French and Spanish painting include works by Velazquez and Goya, Manet and Renoir.



East wing

- British paintings include selection from Hogart to Turner.
